A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of "The Railways Authorisation and Management Act, 1891," the Administrator of the Government has determined the limit of the extension of the Whangarei-Kamo Railway from the present terminus of the said railway, at Kamo, to a point in the Parish of Hikurangi, which said point is also mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Railways Authorisation and Management Act, 1891," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the extension of the said Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

A LINE commencing at a point in Section No. 51, Parish of Whangarei, distant about 3 chains in an easterly direction from the junction of the new Ruatangata Road and the Bay of Islands Road, which point is also the point of commencement described in a Proclamation defining the middle line of a portion of the Whangarei-Kamo Railway, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 46, of 1879; proceeding thence generally in a northerly direction for a distance of about 9 miles, passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, viz.: The said Section No. 51, Kamo Block, Onoke Block, Puriritahi Block, Parakiore No. 2 (Native reserve) Block, Parakiore Block, Te Tupua Block, Maungarei Block; Sections Nos. 22, 113, 34, 36, and 35, Parish of Whangarei; Section No. 60 (Education reserve), Parish of Hikurangi; Sections Nos. 31 and 30, Parish of Whangarei; Sections Nos. 57, 57A, 1, 2, 4; Crown lands Sections Nos. 43, 45, 44, south portion 42, north-west portion 42, south-east portion 41, north middle portion 41, northeast portion 40, south-west portion 40, south-east portion 40, south-east portion 40, south-west portion of 38, Parish of Hikurangi; and terminating at a point in the said north-west portion Section No. 38 distant about 1400 links in a south-westerly direction from the north-east corner thereof; including all adjoining and intervening places, roads, tracks, rivers, streams, and watercourses: all in Blocks VIII.

and V., Purua Survey District, and Block XVI., Hukerenui Survey District, in the Provincial District of Auckland; in the manner delineated on a plan marked P.W.D. 16887, and lodged in the office of the Minister for Public Works, at Wellington, a copy of which is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Timaru, Temuka, Waimate, Mount Cook, and Duntroon Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into six marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

TIMARU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north generally by the Tengawai River from Mackenzie Pass to the road which forms the southern boundary of Section No. 31984, Block IV., Opawa Survey District; thence by the north side of that road and its continuation through the said Block IV. to Three-mile Bush Road; thence by the north side of the last-mentioned road to the Opihi River at the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 20125, Block XIII., Opihi Survey District; thence towards the north-east by the right bank of the said Opihi River to the sea; towards the south-east by the sea; towards the south generally by the Makikihi River and the middle branch thereof to its source; thence by a right line to Mount Studholme; thence towards the south-west by the summit of the Hunter's Hills and the summit of the eastern watershed of the Hakateramea River to Dalgety Range; and thence by the summit of that range to Mackenzie Pass aforesaid, the place of commencement. place of commencement.

TEMUKA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north by a line due east from the left bank of the Opuha River to the upper fork of the Kakahu River, in Section No. 20717, Block VI., Opihi Survey District; thence towards the east and again towards the north generally by the left bank of the said Kakahu River to the road forming the southern boundary of Section No. 8032, in Block XIII., Geraldine Survey District; thence by that road and its continuation past Section No. 15372, Block IX., Geraldine Survey District, to Boundary Road; thence by the said Boundary Road to Geraldine Road; thence towards the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 15082, Block X., Geraldine Survey District; thence by the last-mentioned road to the Waili River; thence across that river to the north-western corner of Section No. 11526, Block XIV., Geraldine Survey District; thence by the road which forms the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 11526 aforesaid and its continuation to the Great South Road; thence towards the north-west by the north-western side of the Great South Road to the Rangitata River; thence towards the north-east by the sea; towards the south-east by the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 20125, Block XIII., Opihi Survey District; thence towards the west by the right bank of the Said Opiha River to the confluence of that river with the Opuha River; and thence by the left bank of the said Opiha River to a point due west of the upper fork of the Kakahu River aforesaid, the place of commencement.

WAIMATE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by the summit of the Hunter's Hills from Mount Nimrod to Mount Studholme; thence by a right line to the source of the middle branch of the Makikihi River, and by the left bank of that river to the sea; towards the east by the sea; towards the south-west by the right bank of the Waitaki River from the sea to the mouth of the Otiake River; thence towards the west generally by the leading spur to Mount Meyer, and by the summit of the eastern watershed of the Hakateramea River to Mount Nimrod.

MOUNT COOK DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-west by the summit of the Southern Alps; towards the north-east generally by a straight line bearing S. 45° E. to the source of Forbes River; thence by the summit of the watershed over Mount Chevalier, Mount Sinclair, the Two-thumb Range, and Fox Peak to the source of the north branch of the Opuha River; thence by that branch and by the left bank of the Opuha River to the confluence of the latter river with the Opihi River; thence by the said Opihi River to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 20125, Block XIII., Opihi Survey District, known as the Three-mile Bush Road; thence towards the south-east by that road to and through Block IV., Opawa Survey District, to the Tengawai River at Section No. 31984 of the said Block IV.; thence towards the south generally by the right bank of the said Tengawai River and the Mackenzie Stream to Mackenzie Pass; thence towards the south-east by the summit of Dalgety Range over Trig. Station B, Burke Survey District, and Trig. Station Z to Mount Dalgety; thence by the leading spur to the Hakateramea Pass; thence towards the south-west by the southwestern side of the Hakateramea Pass Road to Burke's Pass Road; thence again towards the south-east by the southeastern side of Burke's Pass Road to Stony Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Waitaki River; thence towards the south by the Land District of Otago to the summit of the western watershed of the Ahuriri River; thence towards the west by the summit of that watershed over Mount Huxley to Mount Ward; and thence by the summit of the range leading to the Hunter Saddle.

KUROW DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury and Otago Land Districts bounded towards the north generally by the Land District of Canterbury from the summit of the western watershed of the Ahurir River to a point opposite the confluence of Stony Creek with the Waitaki River; thence by a right line to the said confluence; thence by the said Stony Creek and by Burke's Pass Road to its junction with Hakateramea Pass Road; thence towards the east generally by the Hakateramea Pass Road to the Hakateramea Pass; thence by the summit of the eastern watershed of the Hakateramea River over Mount Dalgety and Mount Nimrod to Mount Meyer; thence by the leading spur to a point on the left bank of the Waitaki River opposite the confluence of the Otiake River with the said Waitaki River; thence towards the south-east generally by a right line to the mouth of the Otiake River;

thence by that river to its source; and thence by the summit of the range over Mount Domett and Kyeburn Hill to Mount Ida; and towards the south-west generally by the summit of the Hawkdun Range, the summit of the Wether Range, and the summit of the range leading to Lindis Pass, and over Longslip Peak, Pavilion Peak, and Birch Hill to the boundary of the Land District of Canterbury.

DUNTROON DISTRICT.

All that area in the Otago Land District bounded towards the north-east by the Waitaki River; towards the east by a line running due south from the confluence of the Maruwhenua River with the Waitaki River to the Kakanui River; towards the south-east generally by the Kakanui River and its northern branch to its source; thence by a right line to Kakanui Peak; towards the west generally by the summit of the Kakanui Mountains and the summit of the range over Maruwhenua Pass and Grayson Peak to Mount Domett; and thence towards the north-west by a right line to the source of the Otiake River, and by the left bank of the said Otiake River to its confluence with the Waitaki River.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the twentieth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Timaru, Temuka, Waimate, Mount Cook, and Duntroon Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into six registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Timaru, Temuka, Waimate, Mount Cook, Kurow, and Duntroon Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

Land available for Selection by the Midland Railway Company set apart for Mining Purposes.

HEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for bona fide mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and

Powers delegated to the Little River Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto, situate in the Land District of Canterbury, near Little River, and containing two hundred acres, more or less, is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by Axecutive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the undermentioned persons, who shall be known as the Little River Domain Board, namely,—

(hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the fourth Saturday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the Library, Little River, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first

meeting shall be held on Saturday, the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting

no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the fourth Saturday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of

such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Amended Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of Colonial Local Military Forces and by Students from the Colonial Universities Universities.

THE following amended regulations re commissions in the British army are republished for general information.

W. P. REEVES, For the Minister of Defence.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES AND BY STUDENTS FROM THE COLONIAL UNIVERSITIES.

1. COMMISSIONS in the cavalry and infantry of the line will be granted to officers (who are bond fide colonists) of the local military forces of certain colonies, and to students from colonial universities, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

2. Until further notice two army commissions will be allotted to each of the under-mentioned colonies annually: New South Wales, South Australia, Victoria, Queensland,

New Zealand, Cape of Good Hope.
Six will be allotted annually to Canada, one biennially to Tasmania, and two every three years to the Royal Malta

Militia

In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examina-

3. An officer of the colonial military forces, who is a candidate for a commission in the British army, will be re-

(a.) To be between the ages of eighteen and twenty-two on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination in military subjects:

(b.) To have served at least fifteen months as an officer in the local military force of the colony from which he is nominated, and to have attended two annual trainings, or have seen active service in the field.

Literary Examination.

4. Subject to the exceptions stated in paragraph 5, a candidate will be required, before being permitted to present himself for examination in military subjects, to undergo a

himself for examination in military subjects, to undergo a qualifying literary examination by the Civil Service Commissioners in the following subjects:—

(1.) Mathematics—viz., (a) arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, and simple interest; (b) Euclid, Book I.; (c) algebra, up to and including simple equations.
(2.) French or German; the examination being limited to translation from the language, and grammatical questions.

questions.
(3.) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation.

English composition, tested by the power of writing an

essay, letter, or precis.

(4.) The elements of geometrical drawing, including the construction of scales, and the use of simple mathematical instruments.*

(5.) Geography. Any candidate who has previously passed a preliminary examination before the Civil Service Commissioners in three or more of the above subjects will be exempt from further examination in such subjects. But candidates who have to be examined in two or more subjects will be required to

qualify in all at the same examination.

In addition to the foregoing, the candidate will be required to select and qualify in two, and not more than two, of the

following subjects:—

(a.) Mathematics—viz., algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles; and mensuration.

mensuration.

(b.) Classics (Latin or Greek).

(c.) English history—general.

(d.) Freehand drawing.

The subjects selected should in all cases be stated in the application for papers. No examination passed under the age of seventeen will be allowed to count.

5. The candidate will be exempted from the above examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certificate from the proper university authority that he has taken his degree in arts, or has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A., at one of the following universities: Oxford, Cambridge, Durham, London, Dublin, Edinburgh, St. Andrews, Glasgow, Aberdeen; the Royal University, Ireland; or that he has passed one of the university examinations specified below:—

Oxford, "the first public examination," or "the preliminary examination in law and natural sciences."

Oxford, "the first public examination," or "the preniminary examination in law and natural sciences."

Cambridge, "the previous examination."

Dublin, "the final examination of the senior freshman year," or "the final examination of the School of Engineering."

Durham, "the first year's examination."

The Royal University, Ireland, "the second university examination in arts," or "the second professional examination in engineering."

Scotch universities, "the examination of candidates for the own."

the army."

London University, the "first examination" for the degrees of B.A., LL.B., B.Sc., or M.B.

Or if he has passed some other test which is accepted by the university as exempting from the above examination.

nations.

An equivalent examination at the University of Malta or one of the chartered colonial universities will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

The literary examination will take place on the second Tuesday in April and the second Tuesday in October in each

year.

7. A candidate who is desirous of attending one of these examinations must apply to his Commanding Officer, at such date as will allow of the Governor forwarding the application so as to reach the War Office not later than the 1st of February or 1st August, for the April and October examinations respectively. The Governor in forwarding the application will certify that the candidate is, having regard to the maximum limit laid down in paragraph 3 (a), eligible in point of age, and that he will be prepared, when necessary, to recommend him in the manner prescribed in paragraph 8. Not more than three trials at these examinations will be allowed.

8. The Governor of the colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, each year, the names of any duly-qualified candidates he is desirous of nominating for examination in military subjects.

This notification must reach the War Office by the 1st July, and should be accompanied by—

(a.) A certificate of birth, or, in default, a declaration made by one of the candidate's parents or guardians before a Magistrate, giving his exact age (a certificate of baptism cannot be accepted unless the date of birth is inserted therein): is inserted therein);

(b.) A certificate of having served the required number of

(c.) A certificate of having served the required number of annual trainings (each training in a distinct year), and of having completed a service of fifteen months in the corps to which the candidate belongs;
(c.) A certificate from the Governor that he is satisfied that the candidate is actually a colonist, that he is of good moral character, and in all other respects a fit and proper person to hold a commission in Her Majesty's army; Majesty's army

(d.) A certificate that the candidate has passed the examination described in paragraph 4, or a university certificate as prescribed in paragraph 5.

STUDENTS OF COLONIAL UNIVERSITIES.

9. A commission will be granted under these regulations to one student annually of the University of Malta, and of each of the chartered universities in colonies not having a military college through which commissions in the army may be obtained.

10. The candidate must be within the ages of eighteen and twenty-two on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination in military

subjects.

^{*}Greater importance will be attached to neatness and exactness of drawing than to ability to solve geometrical problems.

11. The literary examination of students of the chartered colonial universities will be conducted entirely by those universities. Geometrical drawing will be an obligatory subject of such examination.

12. The name of the candidate selected for nomination must be forwarded to the Military Secretary so as to reach him on the 1st July, and should be accompanied by—

(a.) A certificate that the candidate is a British-born or

(a.) A certificate that the candidate is a British-born or naturalised British subject;
(b.) An extract from the register of his birth, or, in default, a declaration made by one of his parents or guardians before a Magistrate, giving his exact age (a certificate of baptism cannot be accepted unless the date of birth is shown therein);
(c.) A certificate of good moral character, signed by the tutors or heads of the schools or colleges at which he has received his education for the four years immediately preceding the date of application; or some other satisfactory proof of good moral character; character;

(d.) A certificate from the head of the college that the candidate has passed the required university examination, including geometrical drawing.

Examination in Military Subjects.

13. An examination in military subjects of candidates nominated under paragraphs 8 and 12, who have previously passed the literary examination, will be held in September in each year. The subjects and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject will be as follows:—

1. The elements of field fortification	 600
2. Military topography	 600
3. The elements of tactics	 600
4. Military law	 600

The scope in these subjects will be that embraced by the Synopsis of the Course of Instruction at the Royal Military College.* There will, however, be no practical out-of-door examination in any subject. The text-books will be those in use at the time at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst.

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain 0.25 of the marks in each subject, and 0.5 of the aggregate. Not more than three trials will be allowed at these examinations.

14. A candidate will be required to undergo an inspection by a Medical Board, to be convened by the Governor of the colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed with his examination unless certified by such Board to be physically qualified, in all respects, for a commission in the armv.
