Defining the Middle Line of a further Portion of the Waikato-Thames Railway (Paeroa-Te Aroha Section).

(L.S.) JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Waikato-Thames Railway (hereinafter termed "the said railway") is a railway the con-struction of which is authorised by "The Public Works Act,

struction of which is authorised by "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the said railway has been partly con-structed, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the same: Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1879," and "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and autho-rity in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby pro-claim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.
