*Licensing J. A. Rhodes to use and occupy a Part of the
Foreshore of Wairoa River, Kaipara Harbour.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth
day of June, 1892.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," John Alexander Rhodes, of Aratapu (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore of Wairoa River, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1718), showing the place where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Administrator of the Government in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Administrator of the Government in Council, subject to the modification noted thereon: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated in red on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined

by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such wharf which is shown in red on the plan marked M.D. 1718, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

4. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister, or any person authorised by him to receive the same, the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of two pounds, payable on the first day of June in each year during the continuance of the license hereby granted, the first of such annual payments to be made on the license being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

5. This Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege granted thereunder, shall lapse and have no effect if the wharf is not completed to the satisfaction of the Minister within eighteen months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. All Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf and foreshore, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

7. The Governor in Council may from time to time fix such payments as he shall deem reasonable to be paid to the licensee by any private persons for the use of such wharf, and of all lines of railway, cranes, or other appliances that may be on such wharf or foreshore.

8. The Governor, his staff and servants, and all officers in the Government service or employ, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

9. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

10. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a

notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

11. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law or regulation relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

12. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

15. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause through any default or neglect on his part.

16. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee, or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges hereby granted to the licensee, have been revoked and determined.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of June, 1892.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Factories Act, 1891" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time divide New Zealand, or any portion thereof, into such districts as he shall think fit, and notice of the constitution of every such district shall be given in the *Gazette* as occasion requires:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby divide the portions of the said colony enumerated in the Schedule hereto into districts for the purposes of the said Act, the descriptions and boundaries whereof shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto; and I do hereby declare that for the purposes of the said Act each of such districts shall be known by the name set over the description of each such district respectively.

SCHEDULE.

AKAROA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded generally towards the north, east, and south by Port Lyttelton and the ocean; and towards the north-west generally by Lake Ellesmere, by Kaituna River, by a road passing through Section No. 35590, by the road to Akaroa and Little River, and by a road passing Trig. Stations VV and UU to Purau Bay, in Lyttelton Harbour.

RANGIORA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the west by the Makerikeri River; towards the north-west generally by a road-line north-west of

Sections Nos. 7812, 3999, 3020, 3019, and continuing on past Sections Nos. 2870, 2859, and 8106, by Marshman's Road and Rangiora and Leithfield Road, and by Sections Nos. 2501, 7856, 3137, and 2537; towards the north-east by a road-line north-east of Sections Nos. 2545, 2420, 5981, 8908, and on through Sections Nos. 716 and 715, and again towards the north generally by the north bank of Ashley River; towards the east by the ocean; towards the south generally by the production of Lee's Road, and by Lee's Road, by the North Road, by a road to the south of Section No. 134; again towards the east by the road north-west of Sections Nos. 318, 237, 319, by the north branch of Waimakariri River, by the Amberley-Bluff Railway-line, by the Borough of Kaiapoi to the Waimakariri River, and by that river; towards the south generally by Kaikainui Creek, by Sections Nos. 2387 and 127, by Cherry Road, by Sections Nos. 816, 854, 8077, and 22443, by Sections Nos. 1979 and 1848, by the Oxford Tram-road; towards the west and north-west by the Cust Road, a road east of Sections Nos. 10360 and 10416, by a road passing through Sections Nos. 3979 and part 6914 and 4102; towards the south-west generally by the Oxford and Kaiapoi Road, a road south-east of Section No. 19646, and passing through Reserve No. 397, the Oxford and Ohoka Road, and that road continued past Sections Nos. 6251, 5099, 4484, and 4286; again towards the west by the road-line past Sections Nos. 927 (reserve), 362 (reserve), 5897, 14883, 6843, 7746, and 23065; towards the north generally by Sections Nos. 23267 and 33994, and by the Ashley River to the north-west corner of Section No. 10449; and again towards the west by a right line to the south-west corner of Section No. 21720.

KAIKOURA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west by the summit of the seaward Kaikouras to a point due west from the source of Buebue River; towards the north by a due east line; towards the east by the left banks of the Buebue River and Hapuka River; towards the south-east by the ocean; and towards the south-west generally by the Kahautara River and Cribb Creek, and a due north line from the source of that creek to the summit first mentioned.

OXFORD FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west by a right line from Trig. Station R to Oxford Hill; towards the north by a due east line to Ashley River, and by that river; towards the east generally by a road-line passing Sections Nos. 32764, 21713, 20778, 10836, through Section No. 4898, by Powles's Road, McJarow's Road, a road past Sections Nos. 7109, 9022, and 30412, Starvation Road, across the Eyre River, and by a road past Sections Nos. 33466 and 24130; towards the south-west generally by the Woodstock Road, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 21126 and 34732, across the south branch of the Eyre River, and by that branch to the north-west corner of Section 20, Block I., Oxford Survey District, and by a right line to Trig. Station R.

LEESTON FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west by the road-line bounding Sections Nos. 33572, 33571, 23445, 28852, 30753, 32289, and on part 23215, all in Selwyn Survey District; towards the north-east by the Hororata and Selwyn Rivers; towards the east by Lake Ellesmere; towards the south-east by the ocean; towards the south-west by the middle of the Rakaia River; and again towards the north-west by a line to the road-line first mentioned, on the left bank of the Rakaia River.

RAKAIKA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west by a road-line bounding Sections Nos. 17503, 15399, 15327, and 15593; towards the north-east by the Rakaia River; towards the south-east by a line in production of the north-west boundary-line of Section No. 7133, and by that section and Sections Nos. 1113 (reserve), 18446, 18307, and 24542; and towards the south-west by Mainwaring's Road, Kyle Road, and a road south-west of Sections Nos. 15646, 30885, 27118, 26107, 16143, and 16141.

LINCOLN FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the south-west generally by Lake Ellesmere and Selwyn River; towards the north-west generally by a road being the north-west boundary of Section No. 29770, Block V., Leeston Survey District, and its production to the Selwyn River, by that road continued past Sections Nos. 30113 and 1176 (reserve), by Burnham Road, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 32004, 31462, and 8257, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 8039 and 7499, by Maddison's Road, Haskett's Road, Carpenter's Road, Pound Road, Yaldhurst Road, and Avonhead Road, and by a road passing through Section No. 24 to Waimairi Creek; towards the north-east by that creek, and by the road to the east of Sections Nos. 12 and 85, and to the south of the last-named section, by the Lincoln and Riccarton Junction Road, by the River Heathcote to the Plantation and Road Reserve near Cashmere, by the road passing through Sections Nos. 814 and 549, continuing past 551, intersecting

Sections Nos. 562 and 138, and by Dyer's Pass Road to Lyttelton Harbour; towards the east and north generally by that harbour to the road at the head of Purau Bay; again towards the east and towards the south-east by that road passing Trig. Stations UU and VV, the road to Akaroa and Little River, a road passing through Section No. 35530, and by Kaituna River.

MALVERN FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west by Dalethorpe Road; towards the north-east generally by the Hawkins River; towards the south by the Whitecliffs Railway-line; towards the south-east generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 32747, 23841, 29401, 34457, 22522, 8976, 10144, 11468, and 10180 to the Hororata River; towards the south-west by that river; again towards the north-west generally by Hororata River, a due east line to Trig. Station M, a right line to the south-west corner of Section No. 24401, by the western boundary of that section, and by Section No. 35111, by the north-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 32907, 35110, and 32914, by the north-east boundary-line of last-mentioned section, the north-west and north-east boundary-lines of Section No. 32528, and the north-west boundary-line of Section No. 33038 to the Wakaepu River, by a right line thence to the south-west corner of Section No. 12738, by the western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 12738, 10124, 9179, and 3853, and a road-line bounding Sections Nos. 10125 and 18924.

GERALDINE FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west by the production of the road bounding Section No. 22236, Block IX., Orari Survey District, to the right bank of the Rangitata River; towards the north by a due east line to the middle of that river; to the north-east by the middle of said river to the production of the reserve bounding Section No. 25310; towards the south-east generally by that production and that reserve bounding Sections Nos. 15919, 13110, 29019, 28161, 28160, 14772, 8825, 3606, 7181, and 8847, by the railway-line, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 5961 and 11526, by Waihi River, a road bounding Section No. 9031, the Geraldine Road, the Boundary Road, and a road intersecting Section No. 5372; towards the south-west by Haehaetemoana River; again towards the north-west by Campbell's Road; again towards the north generally by Woodbury Road, Metcalfe's Road, Evans's Road, Orari Bridge Road, Hewson's Road, and a road intersecting Section No. 19206; and again towards the north-west by a road bounding Sections Nos. 19422, 36150, 32521, 31910, and 22236.

TEMUKA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west, from the Haehaetemoana River, by a road passing through Section No. 5372, by Boundary Road, by Geraldine Road, by a road bounding Section No. 9031, by Waihi River, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 11526 and 5961, by the railway-line, and by Sections Nos. 8847, 7181, 3606, 7221, and 8825; towards the north-east by Orari River; towards the south-east by the ocean; and towards the south-west by Ophi River, Tumuku River, and Haehaetemoana River.

KAWHIA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-west generally by the ocean and Kawhia and Aotea Harbours; towards the north by Aotea Harbour and a due east line to the source of Mangaroa Stream; towards the west, again towards the north, towards the south-east and south-west by the summit of the watershed of the waters flowing into Kawhia Harbour, and by a leading spur to Albatross Point.

HOWICK FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-east generally by the waters of Hauraki Gulf and by Te Puru Creek; towards the east generally by the eastern boundary-lines of the Maraetai Parish; towards the south-west by Pakuranga Parish; towards the south-east and south-west by a road bounding Sections Nos. 132, 131, 139, 176, 205, 202, 128, 127, 122, 124, 123, 52, 65, 51, and 50 to the south-west corner of Section No. 49, all of Pakuranga Parish; and towards the north-west generally by a creek running into Tamaki River, by Tamaki River, Pakuranga Creek, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 31, 29, 25, 21, 14, 9, and 5, all of Pakuranga Parish, and by Tamaki River.

MERCER FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the west generally, from the Waikato River, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 98, 97, 92, 93, 35, 91, 70, 69, 67, 66, 65, 64, and 21, all of Tuakau Parish, Sections Nos. 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 22, 23, 24, 25, 73, 26, 6, 4, 3, and 5, to the eastern corner of the last-named section, all

of Maungatawhiri Parish, and by a road passing between Sections Nos. 163 and 50, Opaheke Parish; towards the north-west by a road bounding Sections Nos. 163, 164 and 165, Opaheke Parish; towards the north-east generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 168, 169, 248, 179, and 172 of last-named parish, by Maungatawhiri Parish, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 175, 103, 113, 217, and 186 of last-named parish, bounding Sections Nos. 119 and 120, and intersecting Sections Nos. 19 and 18, and bounding Section No. 9 to its south-east corner, by a road continuing past Sections Nos. 89 and 115, and by Section No. 115 to its southernmost corner, by a right line to the western corner of Section No. 84, Koheroa Parish, and by a right line thence to the northern corner of Section No. 390, Whangamarino Parish; towards the south-east by that section, the railway-line, and by a road bounding Sections Nos. 381, 151, 219, 384, 385, 363, 364, and 371; and towards the south-west generally by the Waikato River.

HAMILTON FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 222, 122A, 122, 121, 120, 119, 118, 117, 116, 104, 105, 106, 100B, 107, 112, 55, 57, 58, 49, 44, 43A, 41, 39, 38, and 34, Pukete Parish, across and by the Waikato River, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 176, 172, 170, 180, 168, 167, 166, 149, 128, 126, 202, and Sections Nos. 202, 203, 204, 205, and 206, Kirikiriroa Parish, to the northernmost corner of Section 200; thence by a right-line to the northern corner of Section No. 302, and by its north-eastern boundary, and by the railway-line; towards the north-east generally by a road intersecting Section No. 2, Parish of Kirikiriroa, and bounding Lot No. 11 of a subdivision of said Section No. 2, and Lots Nos. 9 and 7 of a subdivision of Section No. 1, Tamahere Parish, and Sections Nos. 21 and 22, by Sections Nos. 105, 162, and 161, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 84, 47, and 48, and by the Hamilton-Cambridge Railway-line; towards the south-east generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 96, 96A, 79, 78, 77, 76, 75, 72, 71, 68, 51, 52, 47, 42, 42A, 41, 116, and 117, Hautapu Parish; towards the south-west by the Waikato River to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Section No. 78A; towards the south generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 78A, 78B, 73, 72, 82, 95, 98, 103, 104, 101, 69, 60, 43, 43, 31, 32, and 33, Te Rapa Parish, and continuing past Trig. Station C, and bounding Sections Nos. 62, 65, 66, 49, 42, 29, 10, 11, and 15, Tuhikaramea Parish; and towards the west generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 15, 6, 5, 2, and 1 of said parish, by Waipa River, and by Horotiu Parish.

CAMBRIDGE FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north generally by a road bounding Sections Nos. 154, 107, 105, 106, 352, 351, and 350, Te Rapa Parish, across the Waikato River, and by the right bank of that river, by a road bounding Sections Nos. 117, 116, 41, 42A, 42, 47, 52, 51, 68, 71, 72, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 96A, 96, 97, 333, 314, 313, 319, 320, 322, 301, 222, 223, 224, 225, 291, 289, and 288, Hautapu Parish; towards the north-east by the parish boundary to Opuahau; towards the south-east by the boundary of Pukekura Parish to the southernmost corner of Section No. 226 of said parish; towards the south-west thence by a straight line to the south-east corner of Section No. 164, Ngaroto Parish, and by a road bounding that section and Sections Nos. 182, 183, 184, 188, 189, 190, and 192A of the said parish; and towards the west generally by the road bounding Sections Nos. 192A and 191 of said parish, and Sections Nos. 301, 303, 311, 167, and 166, Te Rapa Parish.

HOKIANGA FACTORY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north generally by the Huahua Creek, by the northern boundary of Section No. 10, Block IX., Mangamuka Survey District, across and by a road bounding Section No. 39A, Block X., and by that road in a northerly direction for 80 chains from last-named section, by a due east line to Waihou River, by that river to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Block 85 (Mata old land claim), by a right line to and by that boundary-line, and by Block 78 (old land claim), and by Wairere Creek and a Native reserve; towards the south-east generally by Block 212 (old land claim) to its southernmost corner, and by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 5573 (in red), Waoku Survey District; towards the south by Sections Nos. 5574 (in red) and 875 (in red); and towards the south-west generally by Kakatahi Creek, Omanaia River, and Hokianga River to the northernmost corner of Section No. 231 (at the Narrows), by a right line due north-west across Hokianga River, and by that river to Huahua Creek first mentioned.

Diminishing the Toll Rates on the Portobello Road, Otago.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it has been found, after due inquiry, that the tolls charged by the Portobello Road Board on the Beach Road, in the Portobello Road District, Provincial District of Otago, are excessive, and should be diminished: And whereas "The Counties Act, 1886" is not in force in the said road district:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby direct the said Road Board to diminish the tolls charged at the toll-gates now erected on the road known as the Beach Road, and situate in the Portobello Road District aforesaid, so that such tolls shall not exceed the rates named in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, it is hereby declared that this Order in Council shall come into force on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and that the rates named in the said Schedule hereto shall be the maximum toll charges on the said road on and after that date.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, however, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section sixteen of "The Public Works Act 1882 Amendment Act (No. 2), 1885," it is enacted that the Minister for Public Works may from time to time, in the manner provided by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and any Act amending the same, impound, divert, and take any water from any stream or running water, or may purchase or acquire any right or interest therein, for the purpose (*inter alia*) of supplying water for the use of any railway, and the engines or machinery used thereon: And whereas by section twenty of "The Government Railways Act, 1887," it is enacted that all powers conferred upon Her Majesty, or the Governor in Council, or the Governor, or the Minister under or by virtue of "The Public Works Act, 1882," or its amendments, or under any other Act in force prior to the passing of "The Public Works Act, 1882," or under any special Act, so far as any such Act respectively relates to the management, working, and maintenance of railways, and all matters or things done or to be done, and all rights and privileges accrued or accruing under or by virtue of any such Act, shall be exercised, enforced, and enjoyed by the Commissioners in the same way as Her Majesty, or the Governor in Council, or the Governor, or the Minister might have exercised, enforced, or enjoyed the same but for the passing of this Act; and, with respect thereto, the Commissioners shall be substituted for Her Majesty, the Governor in Council, or the Governor, or the Minister, as the case may be: And whereas by section twenty-four of "The Government Railways Act, 1887," it is enacted that, where it may be necessary for the purposes of "The Public Works Act, 1882," or any amendment thereof, and this Act to make any Order in Council, Proclamation, or other instrument, it shall be sufficient if the Commissioners shall make, issue, or execute such instrument in such manner as they deem necessary, and, when required by law, shall notify the same in the *Gazette*; and any instrument authorised under "The Public Works Act, 1882," or any amendment thereof, to be made, executed, or issued by the Governor in Council, the Governor, or the Minister, for all or any of the purposes aforesaid, may be made, executed, or issued by the Commissioners in such manner as may be necessary to give effect to "The Public Works Act, 1882," or any such amendment and this Act: And whereas it is desirable to impound, divert, and take water from the stream called the Clydebournne or Big Kuri River for the purpose of supplying water for the use of the Hurunui-Bluff Railway and branches, and the engines and machinery used thereon:
