Land available for Selection by the Midland Railway Company set apart for Mining Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto, are required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing ten thousand acres: And whereas it is expedient the said lands should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

SCHEDULE.

BLOCK LIX.: All that area in the Nelson Land District, situated in the Reefton and Waitahu Survey Districts, containing 10,000 acres, more or less. Bounded by a line commencing on the left bank of the Inangahua River, at a point due south of the southern corner of Section No. 214A, Square 131, Block XIV., Reefton Survey District, and proceeding along the left bank of the Inangahua River to a right line drawn between Trig. Station N, Reefton Survey District, and Trig. Station A, Waitahu Survey District; thence by the said line to the latter trig. station; thence by a right line to Trig. Station K, Waitahu Survey District; thence by a right

line to the north-western corner of the Waitahu Survey District; thence by the northern boundary of the Mawheraiti Survey District to the road leading from Reefton to Greymouth; thence by that road to the road between Section No. 3, Block XIII., Reefton Survey District, and Section No. 155, Square 131, Block XIII.; thence by the latter road to the northern corner of Section No. 25, Block XIII.; thence by a line to the place of commencement: excepting from the above-described area all freehold and leasehold sections and reserves.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Palmerston North and Foxton Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

PALMERSTON NORTH DISTRICT.

All that area in the Land District of Wellington bounded towards the north by the Feilding Special-settlement Association's Block, in the Apati Survey District, and by the southern boundary-line of that block produced to the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence towards the south-east by the summit of that range to the Manawatu Gorge; thence by a line across the Manawatu River to the summit of the Tararua Range; and thence by the summit of that range to a point due east of the north-eastern corner of Section No. 2, Block IV., Waiopahu Survey District; thence towards the south by a right line to the said corner; thence

by the said Section No. 2 and Sections Nos. 10 and 11, Block XV., Mount Robinson Survey District, to the road fronting the western boundary of the said Section No. 10; thence by the continuation of that road passing Sections Nos. 14, 7, 4, 3, 2, and 1 of the said Block XV., and Sections Nos. 3, 2, and 1, Block X., to the Manawatu River; thence towards the north-west generally by that river to its confluence with the Oroua River; and thence by the said Oroua River to the Feilding Special-settlement Association's Block aforesaid.

FOXTON DISTRICT.

All that area in the Land District of Wellington bounded towards the north-west by the Rangitikei River from the sea-coast to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 63, Block II., Te Kawau Survey District; thence towards the north-east by the said Section No. 63, and by the road which forms the southern boundary of Section No. 64 of the said Block II., and by that road continued easterly through Blocks II., VI., VII., and VIII. of Te Kawau Survey District aforesaid to the Oroua River; thence towards the south-east by the left bank of the said Oroua River to its confluence with the Manawatu River; and thence by the left bank of the said Manawatu River to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 1, Block X., Mount Robinson Survey District; thence again towards the north-east generally by the north side of the said road and its continuation, passing Sections Nos. 2 and 3, Block X., Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, and 14, Block XV., Mount Robinson Survey District, to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 6 of the said block; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 9 and 1, Block IV., Waiopahu Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the latter section; thence by a line due east to the summit of the Tararua Range; thence again towards the south-east by the summit of that range to a point due east of the source of the Ohau River; thence towards the south by a right line to the said source; thence by the Ohau River to the sea; and thence towards the west by the sea to the Rangitikei River.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Palmerston North and Foxton Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Palmerston North and Foxton Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the same date, the island known as Goat Island, in the Otago Harbour, was set apart as a quarantine-ground for cattle, camels, deer, horses, goats, sheep, and dogs imported into the Port of Dunedin: And whereas it appears expedient to revoke the said Proclamation in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1891" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), do hereby revoke the said recited Proclamation as from the thirtieth day of September next, and do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after such last-mentioned date, Goat Island, in the Otago Harbour, shall cease to be a quarantine-ground for the purposes of the said Act (save only as to any quarantine commenced or pending at the said ground and uncompleted at such last-mentioned date).

Revoking Order in Council under the Fisheries Encouragement Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of June, 1892.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS an Order in Council prohibiting the exportation from the colony of all rock-oysters taken or produced in the waters of the colony was made, under the powers conferred by "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," on the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 77, of the fifteenth day of the same month:

And whereas so much of the said Order in Council of the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as prohibited the exportation from the colony of shore oysters or mangrove oysters was revoked by Order in Council dated the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 14, of the eleventh day of the same month:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the remainder of the said Order in Council of the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of all the powers enabling me in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke, as from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, so much of the said Order in Council of the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as was not revoked by the said Order in Council of the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Exportation of Rock, Shore, Drift or Mangrove Oysters prohibited.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of June, 1892.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the thirteenth section of "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885" (herein-

after termed "the said Act"), that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time regulate or prohibit the exportation from the colony of any fish caught or produced in the waters of the colony: And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that the term "fish" shall include oysters: And whereas it is advisable to prohibit the exportation of the oysters known as *Ostrea purpurea*, *Ostrea glomerata*, *Ostrea mordax*, or the rock, shore, drift or mangrove oyster respectively:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby prohibit, as from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, the exportation from the colony of all oysters known as *Ostrea purpurea*, *Ostrea glomerata*, *Ostrea mordax*, or rock oysters, shore oysters, drift or mangrove oysters, or by whatever name they may be locally known respectively, taken or produced in the waters of the said colony.

Regulations for Examinations, &c., under Dentists Acts.

GLASGOW, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of June, 1892.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Dentists Act, 1880" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), as amended by "The Dentists Acts Amendment Act, 1891," it is provided that the Governor in Council may appoint a Board or Boards of Examiners for the purpose of conducting examinations and granting certificates under the said Act, and that such examinations shall be conducted and such certificates granted in such manner and form respectively as regulations direct: And whereas Boards of Examiners have been appointed, and it appears expedient to make the regulations hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Acts, and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby prescribe the regulations mentioned and set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall respectively take effect on and after the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

REGULATIONS.

1. CANDIDATES for the certificate of the Board of Examiners must apply at the office of the Board for the district, and leave their testimonials and proofs of their having served a three years' apprenticeship.

2. Candidates in other respects entitled to be registered under "The Dentists Act, 1880," or "The Dentists Act 1880 Amendment Act, 1881," shall pass an examination before the Board of Examiners in the following subjects: Dental anatomy and physiology, dental pathology and therapeutics, and manipulation, including a sufficient knowledge of metallurgy.

3. When the Board of Examiners shall have ascertained that the candidate possesses those qualifications which entitle him under the Dentists Act to his certificate without examination, he shall receive a certificate setting out the nature of his qualifications, and certifying that they fulfil the requirements of the Dentists Act.

4. If the testimonials are such as to qualify the candidate to pass the examination as determined by the Act, the Secretary of the Board will give the candidate notice of the day on which the Board will be prepared to examine him, such day to be not more than one month after the date of the application and the deposit of sufficient testimonials.

5. When a candidate shall have passed an examination before the Board of Examiners, the following shall be the form of certificate of registration: "Certificate under Dentists Act.—I hereby certify that A.B. has duly passed the examination prescribed for candidates seeking registration under 'The Dentists Act, 1880,' and its amendments.—Dated this day of , 18 .—C.D., Chairman of the Board of Examiners."

6. The fee for examination in dentistry is five guineas.

7. Each Board of Examiners appointed by the Governor in Council shall hold office for a term of three years dating from the time of appointment. Any member of such Board absenting himself from three successive meetings of the Board, without leave of the Chairman, shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member of the Board, and the vacancy thereby caused shall be filled as in the case of a casual vacancy.

8. Each Board shall have power to make such by-laws as it may think necessary for regulating the conduct of business, times and places of meetings, time and place for examinations, and remuneration of examiners, and other similar matters; provided such by-laws be not inconsistent with "The Dentists Act, 1880," or its amendments, or with these regulations. A copy of every by-law shall be sent to the Colonial Secretary for approval.

9. The Board shall receive all fees payable in respect of examinations or otherwise, and shall account for the same in the same manner as other public moneys are directed to be accounted for.

Declaring a Portion of the Catlin's-Waikawa Road, in Clutha County, to be a County Road.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the road in the Clutha County known as the Catlin's-Waikawa Road, described in the Schedule below, and which was made by the Governor under the powers contained in the said Act, and has hitherto been a Government road, shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, become a county road.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that portion of the road known as the Catlin's-Waikawa Road which commences at the eastern approach of the McKenzie Bridge, near the Town of Ratanui, and proceeds in a generally south-westerly direction to the sea-coast at Taukupu Bay, all in Clutha County, Land District of Otago; as the same is delineated on the plan marked S.G. 14262A, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington, and thereon coloured red.

Powers delegated to the Otago Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of June, 1892.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Otago Public Domain Board, namely,—

THOMAS HORTON,
CHARLES REDWOOD,
JOHN CLERVAUX CHAYTOR,
ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, and
ROBERT MCARTNEY

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each month, at two o'clock p.m., at the offices of the Borough Council, Blenheim, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days'

notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

MY LORD,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of the colony under your government, the accompanying copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, providing for the exchange of light gold coins under "The Coinage Act, 1891."

I have to request that you will take steps to publish this order in the usual manner in the colony under your Government.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "The Coinage Act, 1891," it is enacted as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that gold coins of the realm which have not been called in by Proclamation, and are below the least current weight as provided by "The Coinage Act, 1870," shall, if they have not been illegally dealt with, and subject to such conditions as to time, manner, and order of presentation as may be mentioned in the order, be exchanged or paid for by or on behalf of the Mint at their nominal value.

2. For the purposes of this Act a gold coin shall be deemed to have been illegally dealt with where the coin has been impaired, diminished, or lightened otherwise than by fair wear and tear, or has been defaced by having any name, word, device, or number stamped thereon, whether the coin has or has not been thereby diminished or lightened:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the exchange of such gold coins:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Her Majesty in this behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Any gold coins of the realm which have not been called in by Proclamation, and are below the least current weight as provided by "The Coinage Act, 1870," shall at any time after the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, if they have not been illegally dealt with, be exchanged or paid for by or on behalf of the Mint at their nominal value, subject to the condition that they must be tendered during business hours at the Bank of England in London, in parcels of a nominal value of not less than one hundred pounds each, and must be left there for such time before the exchange or payment as may be reasonably necessary for examination and weighing in order to ascertain whether any coin has been illegally dealt with within the meaning of the said Act.

And the Master of Her Majesty's Royal Mint is hereby directed to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act for exchanging or paying for at their nominal value all such coins as are so tendered, and have not been illegally dealt with.

Regulations as to the Entry, Pay, &c., of Colonial Men and Boys in H.M. Navy.

THE undermentioned regulations as to the entry, pay, position, and prospects of colonial men and boys in Her Majesty's navy, received from the Admiralty, are republished for general information.

PAY, POSITION, AND PROSPECTS OF SEAMEN AND BOYS OF AUSTRALIAN, NEW ZEALAND, AND TASMANIAN BIRTH, ENTERED IN THE ROYAL NAVY.

1. MEN can be entered by order of the Commander-in-Chief on the Australian station to fill vacancies as ordinary seamen or A.B.s in Her Majesty's ships employed on that station. They must be between the ages of eighteen and twenty-eight, of very good character, able to read and write, physically fit for continuous service, and up to the following standard of measurement, viz., height, 5ft. 4in.; chest, 32in.; and they must have a fair knowledge of the ordinary duties of the rating in which they are entered.

2. These men will be entered as non-continuous service men for six months' trial, and will then, if found suitable, be allowed to join the Royal navy as continuous service men, and will be paid and count time as such from date of original entry.

3. Information as to the necessary forms to be filled up, &c., can be obtained by reference to the Commander-in-Chief.

4. The first continuous service engagement is for twelve years.

5. Men so entered will be sent to England by first convenient opportunity for training in gunnery, &c., after which the Admiralty will endeavour to allow a fair proportion of their time to be served on the Australian station, should the interests of the service admit.

6. Boys must be from fifteen to sixteen years of age, of good character, able to read and write, and have the written consent of parents or guardian.

7. Boys must come up to the standard of height and chest measurement, and undergo a medical and educational examination.

The standard is altered from time to time. At present it is,—

Age.	Height (without shoes).	Round Chest.
15 to 15½	5ft. 0½in.	30½in.
15½ to 16	5ft. 1½in.	31in.

Information as regards the standard in force, the necessary forms to be filled up, and other points, can be obtained by reference to the Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's ships on the Australian station.

8. Boys who are accepted for entry will be sent to England by convenient opportunity, and, after undergoing the necessary training, they will be dealt with in regard to service on the Australian station as in paragraph 5 relating to men.

ON BOARD THE TRAINING-SHIP.

When entered in a training-ship, a boy is credited with £6 on account of expense of clothing and bedding: this more than covers the cost of kit supplied on entry. Kit on entry comprises, amongst other articles of clothing (and bedding)—2 serge frocks, 2 serge trousers, 1 serge jumper, 2 duck working jumpers, 2 duck working trousers, 2 blue jerseys, 2 check shirts, 2 night-shirts, 2 flannels, 2 flannel drawers, 1 cap and ribbons, 1 black-silk handkerchief. Other articles are gradually added to the kit supplied on entry.

The supply of clothes being in every way sufficient, the boys' friends are requested not to furnish them with clothes of any description, as by the regulations boys are not allowed to receive them, and all such articles found in their possession will be confiscated. The clothes in which he joins the service can be returned to his friends or sold for his benefit.

On becoming a 1st class boy, he is granted a further clothing allowance of £2 10s. The pay of a 2nd class boy is 6d. a day (and for good conduct he can obtain an additional 3d. a week). A 1st class boy receives 7d. a day.

Boys can after six months' service send money home to their parents and guardians at the following rates:—1st class boys, 8s. a month; 2nd class boys, 6s. a month. The diet is liberal, and is arranged as follows:—Breakfast: 4oz. corned pork (this ration may be occasionally fried); 8oz. soft bread; $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. chocolate; $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar. Stand-easy, about 10 a.m.: 2oz. bread. Dinner: Sunday and Thursday—12oz. fresh mutton (roasted or baked); 12oz. potatoes; 8oz. flour; 1oz. suet (fresh); 2oz. raisins. Monday and Friday—12oz. fresh beef (roasted or baked); 4oz. soft bread; 12oz. potatoes. Tuesday and Saturday (sea-pie days)—12oz. fresh beef; 12oz. potatoes; 4oz. flour; $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet (fresh); 8oz. mixed vegetables. Wednesday—12oz. corned pork; 4oz. soft bread; 12oz. potatoes; 4oz. split peas. Supper: 10oz. soft bread; $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea; 1oz. sugar. Late supper: 4oz. soft bread with dripping. This dietary is not deviated from, except for boys on punishment diet, and in cases recommended by the medical officer, of boys newly raised or on the sick list.

Intoxicating drinks or tobacco are not allowed, but the money to which a first-class boy is entitled instead of grog is paid to him on his leaving the training-ship.

Instruction is given in seamanship (including boat-pulling and sailing, the use of the compass, and the use of the lead and line), sailmaking, signals, gunnery, gymnastics, swimming, and tailoring. Also, school instruction in—reading, writing (including dictation), arithmetic, geography. And voluntary study of a more advanced nature than the ordinary school course is encouraged.

Religious knowledge is given by the chaplain of the ship; but Roman Catholic boys, and others who have conscientious objections to the religious teaching, are afforded opportunities of attending religious instruction under their own ministers. On Sunday divine service is performed by the chaplain on board the training-ship. Boys who are not members of the Church of England attend at their own places of worship.

Each ship has a band, and boys are trained for the position of bandsman in the navy. Facilities are given for recreation both on board and on shore. Each ship has a large lending library of entertaining and instructive books. Games are provided, such as bagatelle, chess, dominoes, on board; cricket, skittles, football, and quoits, for the recreation-ground on shore.

The schoolrooms are thrown open every evening to enable the boys to read and play at games; also to write letters to their friends (to encourage which, writing materials are provided). Entertainments are provided both on board and on shore; and during the winter months lectures (illustrated by a magic lantern) are given twice a week.

Boys are taken for pleasure parties, and to suitable public entertainments, free of expense to themselves, as opportunities offer. Prizes are offered at all local regattas for competition by the boys in their boats. Boys have leave for the afternoon on Thursdays and Sundays, and (if privileged) on Saturdays. Long leave is granted twice a year—viz., three weeks in July and four weeks at Christmas. For boys living at a great distance, fares are assisted once a year. Return tickets, covering the period of the leave, are issued at very reduced fares by the railway authorities.

Each ship has its medical officers, whose duty it is to watch strictly over the health of the boys. Any cases of serious illness are treated at the naval hospitals.

After a year of training (and sometimes sooner) the rating of first-class boy can be obtained.

Special instruction is then imparted in gunnery and seamanship; the latter course takes place in a training-brig, and is framed so as gradually to accustom boys to active seafaring life. On completion of these courses boys become available for draft to sea-going ships.

PAY AND POSITION AFLOAT.

At the age of eighteen a boy can become an ordinary seaman; from thence he passes, as soon as qualified, to the rating of A.B., and can rise, as vacancies occur, to—Leading seaman, 2nd class petty officer, 1st class petty officer, chief petty officer, warrant officer, and to chief gunner and chief boatswain (commissioned officers). The pay is (the pay is always given for seven days a week),—

Ordinary seaman—Daily, 1s. 3d.; yearly, £22 16s. 3d. A.B.—Daily, 1s. 7d. to 1s. 9d.; yearly, £28 17s. 11d. to £31 18s. 9d. Leading seaman—Daily, 1s. 9d. to 1s. 11d.; yearly, £31 18s. 9d. to £34 19s. 7d. Petty officer, 2nd class—Daily, 2s. to 2s. 2d.; yearly, £36 10s. to £39 10s. 10d.

Petty officer, 1st class—Daily, 2s. 2d. to 2s. 7d.; yearly, £39 10s. 10d. to £47 2s. 11d. Chief petty officer—Daily, 2s. 8d. to 3s. 4d.; yearly, £48 13s. 4d. to £60 16s. 8d. Warrant officer—Daily, 5s. 6d. to 8s. 3d.; yearly, £100 7s. 6d. to £150 11s. 3d. Chief gunner and boatswain—Daily, 9s.; yearly, £164 5s.

If a man remains in the service on completing time for pension, he receives 6d. a day, £9 2s. 6d. a year, in addition. Each officer, man and boy, is supplied with provisions; the value of this ration (estimated at the low rate of cost price to the Government) is 1s. a day. Numerous additions to the pay are made:—For each good-conduct badge, 1d. a day each; three badges can be obtained, 3d. a day. For gunnery and torpedo qualifications, 1d. up to 1s. 5d. a day. More than two-thirds of the seamen are in receipt of extra pay on account of such qualifications. Warrant officers' extra allowances range from 6d. to 1s. 6d. a day. Besides the clothing allowances given to boys, a gratuity of £3 10s. for clothing and bedding is given on a man re-engaging after completing his first term of twelve years' service, and a gratuity of £25 is given on promotion to warrant officer.

The superior places open to men are,—

In the service afloat—Leading seamen, about 1,230; 2nd class petty officers, about 1,300; 1st class petty officers, about 2,825; chief petty officers, about 390; chief gunners, chief boatswains, and warrant officers, 810.

In the coastguard—Commissioned boatmen, about 1,350; chief boatmen, 311; chief boatmen, in charge, 274; chief officers, 227; besides about 1,660 places as boatmen.

Leave is granted without deduction from pay, both whilst at home and after foreign service. In the latter case a long period of leave (as much as six or eight weeks) can be obtained. Arrangements are made to give every one his turn of home service.

Medical attendance and medicine are given free of charge; in cases requiring it, treatment in a naval hospital is allowed, full pay being continued for three months, with a slight deduction after the first thirty days.

An appointment to the coastguard can be obtained after about nine years' man's service in the navy, or at the age of twenty-seven. The remuneration in money is rather lower than in the navy, but the men live almost all the year on shore, and are provided with houses for themselves and families; they receive pensions, on completing the necessary service, on the navy scale, but need not retire till the age of fifty.

TRANSMISSION OF MONEY TO RELATIONS AND FRIENDS.

Great facilities are given for allotting or remitting money to the families and friends; besides this, savings-banks are established on board Her Majesty's ships, and at Sheerness, Portsmouth, and Devonport Dockyards, in which interest on deposits is paid by the Government.

PENSIONS.

Every seaman of good character, if physically fit, can, if he chooses to do so, remain in the naval service or coastguard (thus being continuously employed) till the age of fifty.

He can, however, obtain a pension at an earlier age. Good service for twenty-two years from the age of eighteen entitles a man to this allowance; the amount of the pension varies, according to the conduct and the position filled, from £18 upwards. The average pension for men of all ranks is £31 a year.

A petty officer can obtain up to about £54 a year, with twenty-two years' service, and a good deal more if he remains to the age of fifty.

Men whose conduct has been thoroughly satisfactory are eligible for good-conduct gratuities on discharge, up to £15. Men whose health fails before completion of their time can obtain pensions or gratuities. These depend partly on service and conduct, partly on the nature of the disability. Special consideration is given where the disability is caused by injury sustained on duty, or climatic disease. £22,000 a year is given from the funds of the Greenwich Hospital to augment small naval pensions, and to assist men in bad health who have been invalided after short service, or who are in possession of a war-medal. £76,000 a year is employed to grant to eligible pensioners additional pensions of 5d. and 9d. a day on reaching the age of fifty-five years and upwards. Warrant officers and chief gunners and boatswains are pensioned on a higher scale; £150 a year is the maximum attainable by a chief gunner or chief boatswain; £120 a year by a warrant officer. In addition to the ordinary pensions for service there are Greenwich Hospital pensions of £35 a year for chief gunners and boatswains, and of £25 a year for warrant officers.

ALLOWANCES TO WIDOWS AND CHILDREN.

The widows of warrant officers and chief gunners and boatswains receive pensions of £25 and £30 a year, and higher rates if their husbands have been killed or drowned on duty. The children of the above-mentioned receive

compassionate allowances of £8 to £10 if their father is killed in action or died of wounds, and £6 to £8 if drowned or dying from extraordinary exposure. If men are killed or drowned on duty, or die from the effects of injuries or diseases clearly caused by accident, extraordinary exposure, or exertion on service, within twelve months after being first certified to be ill, their widows and orphans receive assistance from Greenwich Hospital funds. The scale of allowance is,—

Rates in excess of the foregoing scale may, at the discretion of the Admiralty, be awarded in cases needing special relief.

When men do not leave widows or children, gratuities not exceeding one year's full wages may be given at the discretion of the Admiralty to parents or other relatives dependent on such men.

A school for the support and instruction of 1,000 sons of seamen and marines is maintained at Greenwich, and education is also provided for 200 orphan daughters of seamen and marines, and a similar number of total orphan sons are placed out in schools selected by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty. Thus, a man may feel that, if he loses his life in the service of the State, his widow and children will be provided for.

APPOINTMENTS IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

Various appointments in the Civil Service are specially kept for deserving men who serve their time for pension (such as, for example, writerships in the dock and victualling yards, and messengerships in the Admiralty), with pay ranging up to 7s. a day.

The information contained in this paper is extracted from the different regulations, which are liable to alteration; no person has any right to pay, pension, or other advantage on account of apparent eligibility under the rules as herein published. [M. & V. 92[1254.]

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, however, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892.
