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Land available for Selection by the Midland Railway Company set apart for Mining Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing nine thousand acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

Block LIII.: All that area in the Nelson Land District, situated in Reefton Survey District, containing 9,000 acres, more or less. Bounded by a right line commencing at the eastern corner of Section No. 50, Block VII., Reefton Survey District, and proceeding due east to a line drawn from Trig. Station HH to Trig. Station G, Reefton Survey District; thence by a right line to the latter trig. station; thence by a line drawn in the direction of Trig. boundary of Section No. 40, Block X., Reefton Survey District; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of said Section No. 40, and the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 41, Block X., Reefton Survey District, 168, 166, 250, 259, and 248, Square 131, to the western corner of Section No. 245, Square 131; thence by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 2, Square 131, to the northern corner of Section No. 245; thence by the northern boundary of Section No. 2 to the western corner of Section No. 58, Square 131, Block V., Reefton Survey District; thence by the south-eastern side of the Reefton-Westport Road to a point distant 9 chains from the western corner of Section No. 38, Square 131, Block VI., Reefton Survey District; thence by a line to the western corner of Section No. 3, Block VI.; thence by the southern and south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 3 and 2, Block VI., 241, 242, and 243, Square 131, Sections Nos. 36, 37, and 99, Block XI., and Section No. 199, Square 131, to the southern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by the eastern boundary of the said Section No. 199 and its production to Boatman's Creek; thence by that creek and Little Boatman's Creek to a point opposite the eastern corner of the Township Reserve of Capleston; thence by a line across the latter creek to the said corner; thence by the northern boundary of Township Reserve to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 23, Block XI.; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that section and the north-eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 243, 242, 241, 178, 177, 231, 230, 180, 179, 229, 228, and 227, Square 131, Block VI., Reefton Survey District, to the southern corner of Section No. 29, Square 131; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 29, 26, 23, 18, 16, 14, 12, 11, 10, and 8 to the western corner of Section No. 26; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned section to the left bank of Larry's Creek, and by that bank to a point due south of the southern corner of Section No. 50, Block VII., Reefton Survey District; thence by a line across Larry's Creek to the said corner, and by the eastern boundary of the said Section No. 50 to the point of commencement: excepting from the above-described area all freehold and leasehold sections and reserves.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS a petition, in terms of sections forty-two and forty-three of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand from not less than fifty subscribers to the Jubilee Institute for the Blind, Auckland, praying that the said institution may be incorporated as a separate institution under the said Act: And whereas the substance of the said petition was gazetted on the eighteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and the District Board having lodged with the Colonial Secretary, within one month from the date of such publication, a copy of a resolution passed by the said Board objecting to the incorporation of the said institution as a separate institution on the ground that the said institution is not necessary, the Colonial Secretary required the District Board and the petitioners respectively to appoint a Commissioner to inquire into the case, and appointed Joseph Giles, Esquire, the Resident Magistrate of the district where the said institution is situate, to sit with the Commissioners aforesaid upon such inquiry: And whereas the said Commissioners sat, as a Court of Inquiry in the said case, on the twenty-ninth day of June last, and found that the said Jubilee Institute for the Blind is a necessary institution within the meaning of the said Act, and duly reported their decision to the Colonial Secretary: And whereas it appears expedient to make provision in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," doth hereby declare the contributors for the time being to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate, by the style and title of "The Jubilee Institute for the Blind, Auckland, New Zealand."

WHEREAS by the two hundred and twenty-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land

VICTORIA, AUSTRALIA.—WESTERN ENTRANCE, BASS STRAIT.—
EAGLE NEST OR SPLIT POINT LIGHT.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners published the 26th June, 1891, notice is hereby given that, on and after the 30th August, 1892, the arc of the red or principal light will be reduced, and will illuminate an arc of 150° seaward, or from one mile and a half off Point Addis round seaward to one mile off Cape Patton, while the arc of white light shown from the principal light towards Point Addis will be increased about 3°, thereby illuminating an arc of white light extending from the shore to one mile and a half off Point Addis.

The white lights are to warn mariners of their too close proximity to the shore or lighthouse, and care should be taken to round Split Point or Eagle Nest at a distance of not less than three miles from the lighthouse.

Upon the Split Point light being altered as herein notified, masters of sailing-vessels bound for Port Phillip from the westward, when abreast of such lighthouse by night, may proceed on to the outer pilot cruising-station until the high white light on Shortland's Bluff is sighted, and, in cases where the master has not an exempt pilot's certificate, the requisite pilot is on board. Mariners should not lose sight of the Split Point red light until they sight the high white light on Shortland's Bluff, which should be seen in ordinary weather after they have proceeded a distance of thirteen miles from Split Point towards Port Phillip Heads.

The pilot-station has been extended three miles beyond the former boundary, and two pilot-schooners are constantly cruising outside when there is a possibility of keeping the sea.

The middle cruising-station is comprised within a radius of seven miles from the centre of Port Phillip Heads to seaward.

The outer cruising-station extends from the outer boundary of the middle cruising-station to a point distant fifteen miles from the centre of Port Phillip Heads upon a line bearing north-east by north and south-west by south.

The western boundary extends from the aforesaid point towards the shore, Zealey Point bearing north-west by north.

The southern boundary extends from the same point towards Cape Schanck, bearing east three-quarters north until Arthur's Seat bears north-east one-quarter north; and thence on the same bearing towards the shore which forms the eastern boundary.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, however, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education.
