Defining the Middle Line of a Further Portion of the Otago Central Railway (Middlemarch-Hyde Section).

GLASGOW, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS the Otago Central Railway (hereinafter termed "the said railway") is a railway the con-struction of which is authorised by "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the said railway has been partly con-structed, and it has been determined to construct and main-tain a further portion of the same: Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1879," and "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exer-cise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling

cise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

SCHEDULE. Commencing at a point in the Railway Reserve between Section No. 30 and the road forming the western boundary of Section No. 29, Block V., Strath-Taieri Survey District, the said point being the termination of a portion of the rail-way as described in a Proclamation dated the 20th Novem-ber, 1890, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 68, of the 28th November, 1890; proceeding thence generally in a northerly direction for a distance of about 15 miles, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, viz., railway reserve in Block V.; railway reserve and Grown lands in Block II., Strath-Taieri Survey District; Crown lands, Sections Nos. 6, 7, and 8, Block X.; Sections Nos. 9, 8, 7, 6, and 5, and Crown lands, Block VI., Rock and Pillar Survey District; railway reserve, and Sections Nos. 21, 22, 23, 20, 19, and 18, Block III., Township of Hyde; and terminating at a point on the eastern boundary of Section No. 18 distant about 25 links from the south-east corner thereof: including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, reserves, roads, streams, rivers, and watercourses; all in the Provincial District of Otago; as the same is delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 16907, a copy of which has been deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court, at Dunedin, in the said Provincial District of Otago.

Regulations for depasturing Stock within Mining Districts.

GLASGOW, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by subsection five of section three hundred and forty-one of "The Mining Act, 1891," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations, and do hereby pro-claim and declare that the same shall take effect in all mining districts throughout the colony, as from the date of the pub-lication of the said regulations in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

Interpretation.

Interpretation. In these regulations the words and expressions following shall, if not inconsistent with the context, have the meanings hereby attached to them, viz.: "Great cattle" shall be construed to mean and include horned cattle, horses, mules, asses, male and female, and their offspring above six months of age; "small cattle" shall mean sheep, male and female, and the weaned offspring thereof; "cattle" shall mean and include "great cattle" and "small cattle" as above defined; and "district" shall mean any district constituted a mining district under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1891."

Right to depasture Cattle.

1. Every holder of a miner's right and every holder of a business license occupying land by virtue of such right or license within any district, and also any person or persons occupying land as a licensed holding, special claim, or

mineral lease within any district, shall be entitled to run one head of great cattle free of assessment fees on any Crown lands within a district which are not held under a lease or license for depasturing purposes: Provided that, if more than four persons hold or occupy land as a licensed holding or special claim, they shall not be entitled to run more than four head of great cattle in respect of every such licensed helding or special claim. holding or special claim.

Agricultural Leases.

2. Any holder of an agricultural lease within any district shall be entitled to run great cattle free of assessment fees in proportion to the acreage of the land held under such lease, as follows: For a lease of 50 acres, or any less quantity, one head; for any additional fifty acres, one head.

Depasturing License.

3. Every holder of a miner's right, business license, li-3. Every holder of a miner's right, business license, li-censed holding, special claim, agricultural lease, or mineral lease, may, subject to these regulations, run cattle upon any Crown lands, not held as aforesaid, within any district, in excess of the number which he is entitled to run free of assessment fees hereunder, on obtaining a depasturing license in the form contained in the First Shedule hereto; and any other person resident in a district may so run cattle within such district, on obtaining such a license as aforesaid.

Application to be made.

4. Any person desirous of obtaining a depasturing license shall lodge with the Clerk of the County Council having jurisdiction over that portion of the district in which he desires the depasturing license to take effect an application in writing in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and shall deposit therewith the assessment and registration fees percent of these pregulations. If each application is payable under these regulations. If such application ices refused, the assessment and registration fees will be repaid to the applicant, but not otherwise. No depasturing license will in any case be granted to any applicant under the age of eighteen years.

Application, how dealt with.

5. If the application, how deter when. five head of great cattle, the Clerk of the County Council may, with the consent and approval of the Chairman, forth-with issue a depasturing license, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto annexed, to the applicant; but if such applica-tion shall be for depasturing any larger number of great cattle, or for depasturing small cattle, the Clerk shall submit the same to the County Council at the next ordinary meeting thereof, and the County Council shall determine how such application shall be dealt with.

Assessment Fees.

6. The assessment fees to be paid annually in advance under these regulations shall be for every head of great cattle, 2s. 6d.; for every head of small cattle, 6d.

Registration.

7. All cattle depastured upon lands under these regula-7. All cattle depastured upon lands under these regula-tions, whether running free of assessment or by virtue of a depasturing license, must be branded, and the brands and a description of the cattle must be registered with the Clerk of the Council of the county within which such lands are situated. The fee for every such registration shall be 1s.; and a certificate of registration in the form contained in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be given by the sciel Clerk to Fourth Schedule hereto shall be given by the said Clerk to all persons paying any such last-mentioned fee.

Register to be kept.

Register to be kept. 8. The Clerk of the County Council within any district shall keep a register of brands and a list of depasturing licenses and registration certificates issued, with the date of issue and the names of the licensees and certificate-holders; and such register shall be kept in the Council offices, and may be inspected at any time by the public on payment of a fee of 1s.

Brands previously registered.

9. If a brand described in any application has been previously registered by any other person, the applicant shall amend his application by inserting therein some other brand not previously registered.

Penalty for depasturing Cattle whose Brands are not regis-tered or without a Depasturing License.

10. Any person depasturing great or small cattle in any district which are not branded or whose brands are not regis-tered, or without a certificate or license authorising the holder thereof in that behalf, and any person depasturing thereon a greater number of cattle than he is entitled to by virtue of such license or certificate, shall, upon conviction, for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s. per head for every head of cattle so depastured or not registered or branded. or branded.

Diseased Cattle.

11. No diseased cattle shall be depastured upon, nor shall any pigs or goats be allowed at large within, any district; and any person or persons who shall turn out or depasture any diseased cattle, or suffer any pig or goat to be allowed at large within any district, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £10 for the first offence and £20 for every second or subsequent offence.

Depasturing of Bulls prohibited.

12. No bull nor any entire horse above the age of twelve 12. No bull nor any entire horse above the age of twelve months shall be turned out or depastured or allowed to run at large upon any land subject to these regulations without the written authority of the County Council having juris-diction over such lands; or its authorised officer; or if any person shall, without the written authority aforesaid, turn out or depasture upon any of the said lands any bull or entire horse, or shall suffer or allow any bull or entire horse belonging to him or in his care or custody to be at large upon any lands subject to these regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty of ± 10 for the first offence and a penalty of ± 20 for any second or subsequent offence.

Stock not to be unnecessarily disturbed.

13. No person shall drive, harass, or unnecessarily disturb any cattle lawfully depasturing upon any land subject to these regulations; and if any person shall unlawfully drive, harass, or unnecessarily disturb any cattle so depasturing as aforesaid he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence.

Removal of Cattle.

14. No person shall remove any cattle (excepting such are his own property) from any lands subject to these regula-tions without the written sanction of the owner of such cattle.

cattle. Any person desirous of removing cattle shall drive all the cattle collected by him into the nearest stock-yard, and there examine them carefully, and shall then separate from his own cattle any cattle he may have collected which do not belong to him, and he shall forthwith drive the latter back to the place from whence they were taken. Any person com-mitting any breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5$.

Cattle not to be removed between the Hours of Sunset and Sunrise.

15. No person shall muster or remove cattle upon or from any lands subject to these regulations between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence.

Mustering Cattle.

16. The Council of the county within which any lands subject to these regulations are situated may authorise any Ranger or any other person it may think fit to muster the cattle depasturing upon any such lands for the purpose of ascertaining whether there are among them any unbranded or unregistered cattle, or any cattle depasturing contrary to these regulations, and every depasturing license issued under these regulations shall be deemed to have contained therein the reservation of such a right as aforesaid. the reservation of such a right as aforesaid.

Unbranded or Unregistered Cattle.

17. If any unbranded or unregistered cattle shall at any time be found on any lands subject to these regulations, or if any cattle shall be found illegally depasturing upon such lands, the owner of such cattle shall, in addition to any penalty otherwise provided by these regulations, be liable to pay, and shall pay, to the county authorities having jurisdic-tion over such lands all cost and charges incident to the collecting and recovering of such cattle.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act afore-said, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Te Aroha Hot Springs Public Domain Board, namely,— Board, namely,-

CHARLES AHIER, GEORGE LIPSEY, THOMAS GAVIN, JOSEPH GALLAGHER, and JAMES MILLS

JAMES MILLS (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-tions hereinafter contained, that is to say,— 1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Saturday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at the Courthouse, Te Aroha, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the third day of Septem-ber, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two. 2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or

by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' the business to be transacted at such special member, specifying no other business than that so specified shall be transacted

at such meeting. 3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any 4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting,

and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in December in every succeeding year there-after, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a cast-ing vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of

shall choose some one of their number to be channel of such meeting. 6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman. 7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Post Office Act, 1881" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and revoke rules and regulations for the manag-ing of the several post-offices, for the receiving, conveying, and delivering of letters, and, in respect of places beyond the colony, to fix, alter, and abolish the rates of postage payable within the colony for the transmission by post of (*inter alia*) newspapers to places beyond seas: And whereas by Order in Council hearing date the fifth

within the colony for the transmission by post of (*inter and*) newspapers to places beyond seas: And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, certain rules and regulations were made under the said Act, and certain rates of postage were fixed for the transmission of correspondence: And whereas it is expedient to revoke part of the said Order in Council fixing the rate of postage for newspapers to certain places beyond the colony, and to make other provision in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the rate of postage on newspapers for the places beyond the colony mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and in lieu thereof doth fix the rate following; and doth order and declare that the rate of postage payable within the colony on newspapers for the several places beyond seas

order and declare that the rate of postage payable within the colony on newspapers for the several places beyond seas respectively mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that specified in such Schedule; and, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His Excellency doth further order and declare that such rate of postage shall in all cases be paid at the time such newspapers are delivered into the Post Office; and, further, that this Order in Council shall take effect on and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninetv-two. and ninety-two.

Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, how-ever, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them-selves for examination.
