BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the one hundred and ninety-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885," and of every other power

and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be subject to the provisions of sections one hundred and ninety-eight to two hundred and nineteen of Part VII. of "The Land Act, 1885," relating to small grazing-runs.

Terms and Conditions of Sale or Selection of Village Settlement, Makarewa Village, Southland.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of August, 1892.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation issued under the provisions of section one hundred and sixty-six of the said Act and the fourteenth section of "The Land Acts Amendment Act, 1888," set apart the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto as a village-settlement small-farm lot:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by this present order, fix the following as the terms and conditions upon which the village-settlement small-farm lot mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The day upon which the land shall be open for sale or selection shall be Wednesday, the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

2. The land mentioned in the First Schedule shall be open as a small-farm allotment, for sale or selection, either for cash, or on deferred payments, or on perpetual lease.

3. The purchaser for cash of the land mentioned in the First Schedule hereto must deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district one-fifth of the purchase-money at the time of application, and shall pay the whole remainder of the purchase-money within thirty days of the granting of his application; and if not paid within thirty days his deposit shall be forfeited, and the lands shall be again open for sale or occupation forthwith; and upon full payment of the purchase-money he will be entitled to a Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way.

4. If the land mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is selected upon deferred payments, the selector shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1885."

5. If the land mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is selected under the perpetual-leasing system, the selector shall be subject to the provisions of Part IV. of "The Land Act, 1885."

6. The price stated in the First Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the land shall be open for sale for cash, or for selection on deferred payment, or on perpetual lease.

7. If there should be more than one application on the same day for the allotment in the First Schedule the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

8. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section will be required to make the declaration prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district one-tenth of the price of the allotment (such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the next first day of January or July following the date of the license, as the case may be); and, upon fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by the said Act relating to land on deferred payments, will be entitled to the Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way.

9. Each applicant for the allotment on perpetual leasing will be required to make the declaration prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, and to deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district a sum equal to one half-year's rent of the allotment included in the application, and such payment shall be in discharge of the half-year's rent due on the first day of January or July which shall first ensue after the commencement of the term, together with the sum of thirty shillings for the lease and registration thereof.

10. Each applicant for a section for cash will be required to make a statutory declaration that he is applying for the land solely for his own use and benefit, and not for the use and benefit of any other person or persons whomsoever.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council issued on the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, under the authority of the one hundred and sixty-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the terms and conditions upon which certain village-settlement lands therein enumerated should be disposed of were duly fixed, and it was provided that no person would be allowed to acquire more than one allotment in the Winslow Village Settlement:

And whereas it is expedient to allow one person to hold more than one allotment in the said settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of the power conferred by the said Act and of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby amend the Order in Council aforesaid so far as it affects the areas in which the land in the Winslow Village Settlement shall be held, and doth declare that, on and after the date hereof, any selector at present residing in the village settlement aforesaid may apply for and acquire additional allotments of land therein; and it is hereby further declared that all the provisions of the Order in Council of the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, aforesaid, shall apply, except as regards the area in which the sections may be held, to the Winslow Village Settlement.

THE several sections of the said by-laws hereinafter mentioned shall be amended as follows:—

Section 5, non-consumers' rate: The words "used as dwellings only" shall be struck out. Section 12, extraordinary supply: The word "manufacturer" shall be struck out, and the words "any person" shall be inserted in lieu thereof. Section 13: The words "at one shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, but in no case shall the amount paid be less than would be charged for ordinary supply to the same premises," shall be added to this section. Section 19: The word "stables" shall be struck out, and the word "horses" inserted in lieu thereof. Section 28: The whole of this section after the words "glass front" shall be struck out, and the following inserted in its place: "Locks, boxes, and all fittings and other materials used in connection with the said meters must be supplied by the Board, and all work or alterations shall be done by workmen employed by the said Board. The expense of such work or material, and the rent of meter then due, shall be paid by the intending consumer by meter prior to the water being turned on."

Regulations for the Importation of Sheep into Queensland.—Notice No. 354.

THE following regulations, issued by the Governor of Queensland, are published for general information.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of the Diseases in Sheep Acts, been pleased to make the following regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts:—

1. Sheep arriving by sea from any Australasian Colony in respect of which it has been notified by Proclamation that no disease has existed therein during the two years preceding the date of such Proclamation shall be deemed to be in quarantine, but may be released therefrom without being dressed or disinfected, on fulfilment of the conditions hereinafter specified.

2. Such sheep shall not be landed unless it has been certified by an Inspector at the port of shipment that they are free from infection.

3. Such sheep must be conveyed from the port of embarkation to the port of debarkation in a vessel or vessels that have not during the three preceding months traded to any colonies or places other than those in respect of which it has been notified as aforesaid that no disease has existed therein during the said term.

4. Sheep shall not be landed which have been conveyed in or have been on board the same vessel with sheep or skins of sheep the produce of a colony not proclaimed free from disease as aforesaid.

5. The master of any vessel by which sheep are conveyed from a colony proclaimed free from disease as aforesaid shall, if required so to do, make a declaration containing such information as may be required relating to the matters aforesaid.

6. Any person who shall be guilty of any offence against these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of twenty pounds.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £85, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, however, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education.
