WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-seventh sec-tion of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same : And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation issued under the pro-visions of section one hundred and sixty-six of the said Act and the fourteenth section of "The Land Acts Amendment Act, 1888," set apart the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto as a village-settlement small-farm lot: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by this present order, fix the following

part recited Acts, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by this present order, fix the following as the terms and conditions upon which the village-settle-ment small-farm lot mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of the Diseases in Sheep Acts, been pleased to make the following regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts :-

1. Sheep arriving by sea from any Australasian Colony in respect of which it has been notified by Proclamation that no disease has existed therein during the two years preceding the date of such Proclamation shall be deemed to be in quarantine, but may be released therefrom without being dressed or disinfected, on fulfiment of the conditions hereinafter specified.

2. Such sheep shall not be landed unless it has been certified by an Inspector at the port of shipment that they are free from infection.

are received intection. 3. Such sheep must be conveyed from the port of em-barkation to the port of debarkation in a vessel or vessels that have not during the three preceding months traded to any colonies or places other than those in respect of which it has been notified as aforesaid that no disease has existed therein during the said term.

4. Sheep shall not be landed which have been conveyed in or have been on board the same vessel with sheep or skins of sheep the produce of a colony not proclaimed free from disease as aforesaid.

5. The master of any vessel by which sheep are conveyed from a colony proclaimed free from disease as aforesaid shall, if required so to do, make a declaration containing such information as may be required relating to the matters

6. Any person who shall be guilty of any offence against these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of twenty pounds.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

Bay. THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regu-lations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, how. ever, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient cantres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them-selves for examination.
