

A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS by the second section of "The Government Loans to Local Bodies Act Amendment Act, 1891" (herein termed "the said Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that, before certain moneys therein mentioned shall be expended upon any block of land, it shall be necessary that the same be proclaimed as set apart for settlement: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, and for the pur-poses of the said Act, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Gover-nor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the block of land described in the Schedule hereto as set apart for settlement. for settlement.

BACK CREEK BLOCK.

A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any portion of the Colony of New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act from and after a day to be named

borough under the said Act from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the said Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district described in the Schedule hereto shall be, and the same is hereby con-stituted, as from the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, a borough under the said Act; and I do further proclaim and declare that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Danevirke, and that the boundaries thereof shall be those described in the said Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1885," the reserves enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto were temporarily reserved as endowments for education, and were also temporarily and perma-nently reserved as such endowments upon the respective dates specified in the second and third columns of the said Schedule, and severally set opposite the respective descriptions of the said reserves : And whereas notices of such reservations were laid upon the table of each House of the General Assembly : And whereas the two Houses have not jointly agreed to alter, vary, or modify the area of any of the reserves, or to nullify any of such reservations, by a resolution disapproving thereof, in terms of the two hundred and thirtieth section of "The Land Act, 1885." Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by "The Land Act, 1885," do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be reserved as endowments for primary education, as herein specified respectively.

WHEREAS by section sixty-six of "The Coal-mines Act, 1891" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, make, alter, and revoke regula-tions for regulating the management and administration of the funds and moneys mentioned or referred to in section sixty-nine of the said Act: And whereas it appears expe-pedient to revoke the regulations made by Order in Council of the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and minety-one, and in lieu thereof to make the hundred and ninety-one, and in lieu thereof to make the regulations hereinafter set forth: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of

New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, aforesaid, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby further declare that such regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

No withdrawal of money from the account mentioned in the said Act as "the Sick and Accident Fund," at any Post Office Savings-bank, shall be permitted until the mining association of the district shall have nominated at least two persons as trustees of the said fund, and shall have given to the Chief Postmaster of the district and to the Minister of Mines written notice of such nomination, and of the accept-

When any change takes place in the office of trustee, either by death, resignation, removal, or otherwise, similar notices shall at once be given by the association. 4. Whenever any sum of money is withdrawn by the trustees from the Sick and Accident Fund (hereinafter referred to as "the said account"), the trustees shall give to the Inspector of Mines residing nearest to the Post Office Savings-bank where the said account is kept full particulars of the sum or sums so withdrawn.

of the sum or sums so withdrawn. 5. All moneys withdrawn from the said account shall be paid and applied to one or other of the objects hereinafter set forth, namely :-

- (a.) When any workman has been off work through an accident for one week or more, he shall receive the sum of 10s. per week, or at the rate of 1s. 8d. for every working-day after the expiration of the first week from the date of the accident; such payments to be made on the certificate of a medical officer, and shall continue so long as such medical officer shall certify that such workman is unable to work, or. in case any workman is permanently disabled. or, in case any workman is permanently disabled, he may be granted a fixed sum, not exceeding £50, (b.) If any workman meets with an accident which proves
- granted a sum not exceeding £10 towards defraying
- granted a sum not exceeding £10 towards defraying the funeral expenses of the deceased workman; and an additional sum, not exceeding £15, may be granted to the widow or other near relative of such deceased workman in full satisfaction of all claims.
 (c.) Any workman who meets with an accident which disables him from work shall send, or cause to be sent, within three days of such accident occurring, a notice, in writing, to the Inspector of Mines; and all applications for relief must he made within ten all applications for relief must be made within ten days from the date of the accident, or the claim cannot be entertained.
- (d.) No workman shall be entitled to relief from the Sick and Accident Fund for any accident caused by drinking intoxicating liquors, fighting, or any kind of athletic sports or game of amusement, or for any accident caused by the misconduct of such workman.

S. The trustees shall keep proper books of account showing the various items of receipts and expenditure in relation to the said account, and such books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any Inspector of Mines, who may take such extracts therefrom as he may require.

9. No sum exceeding $\pounds 20$ in amount shall be withdrawn from the said account without the written authority of an Inspector of Mines.

If in any case the trustees or either of them shall wil-fully commit a breach of any of these regulations, or shall misspend or misappropriate any of the moneys standing to the credit of, or withdrawn from, the said account, then it shall be lawful for the Minister of Mines, on proof of the fact, by notice to the Chief Postmaster of the district, to prohibit any further dealing with such account by the said trustees or either of them, and to remove the offending trustee or trustees from office; and any moneys so misappropriated may be recovered in the name of the Minister of Mines as a debt due to Her Majesty the Queen. In case of removal of the trustees or either of them from office as last aforesaid, the Minister shall, by writing, forth-with request the miners' association of the district to appoint other persons or person to fill the vacancy, and, if such association shall neglect so to do for the space of fourteen days after service of such written request, then the Minister of Mines may appoint a trustee or trustees to fill such

Regulations under "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," for the Election of Members of Boards by Contributory Local Authorities in Grouped Districts.

GLASGOW, Governor.

W HEREAS by section six of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1886," it is pro-vided that the Governor, by Order in Council, shall, before the month of November next ensuing, and at the same period in every third year thereafter, apportion the representation of the various contributory local authorities in any district on the Board of such district, in the manner therein set forth : And whereas it is necessary that regulations shall be made for the elections of members of the Boards of such districts

by such contributory local authorities as are grouped together in terms of the above-mentioned section: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by section ninety-nine of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," doth hereby make and prescribe the regulations hereinafter set forth for the conduct of the said recited elections, and the proceedings incidental thereto, namely :--

REGULATIONS.

1. The local authorities named in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have respectively the number of votes the norm of the second column of the said Schedule, and their representative or representatives shall meet at the time and place set opposite the names of such local authorities in the third and fourth columns of the said Schedule, respectively to elect such member or members as have been apportioned to such local authorities by Order in Council of the fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

2. The Presiding Officer to conduct the election in each case shall be the person named in the fifth column of the said Schedule, opposite the name of each local authority. Any local authority may, if it think fit, send only one representative to such election, and such representative shall then be entitled to exercise the full number of votes which such local authority is given by regulation one aforesaid.

3. Any local authority may appoint, by writing under the hand of the Chairman or Mayor, as the case may be, any person or persons residing at or near the place of meeting as aforesaid to be its representative or representatives at such meeting, and such representative or representatives shall be entitled to exercise the full number of votes which such local authority is given by regulation one.

4. In case any contributory local authority shall not send a representative to such election, the representative or repre-sentatives of the local authority or authorities present at the meeting called for such election shall elect the member or members which such local authorities together are entitled to have, and that either at the meeting then held, or at a sub-sequent meeting to be specially convened for the purpose by the Presiding Officer of such first-mentioned meeting.

5. The Presiding Officer at every meeting of local authorities as aforesaid shall make a return in writing to the Secre-tary of the Board to which any member has been elected, setting forth the names of the person or persons elected to serve as members of such Board. The Secretary shall thereupon notify the Inspector of Hospitals of the result of such election or elections for publication in the *Gazette*, and such publication shall be deemed to be *primit facie* evidence that the persons named therein were duly elected in terms of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885."

6. In the event of the number of votes on each side at any election being equal, the Presiding Officer shall give a casting vote.

One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regu-lations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, how-ever, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education

Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.
