GLASGOW, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Premier's residence, at Wellington, this twentieth day of October, 1892.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS application has been made to the Governor in Council by Tare Warahi, the Native owner of the lands described in the second column of the Schedule hereto, praying that the restrictions on the alienation of such lands contained in the Land Transfer certificate bearing date the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, described in the first column of the said Schedule, may be removed: And whereas inquiry has been duly made by the Native Land Court, and the said Court has reported that the provisions of the law in that behalf have been complied with: And whereas it appears expedient to grant such application: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by "The Native Land Act, 1888," and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that all restrictions imposed by the said Land Transfer certificate on the aliena-tion of the said lands are hereby removed. ### Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regu-lations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the

Native Schools Code, 1886. The questions set will, how-ever, be more difficult than those given at the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 19th and 20th December, 1892. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them-selves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next. Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be

Notice is hereby given that, in exercise of the jurisdiction conferred by the said recited order, and of every other authority in that behalf, the Court will, at a sitting to be opened at Waiomatatini on the 13th day of January, 1893, proceed to inquire into and make order upon the several matters brought within its jurisdiction as aforesaid so far as concerns the land specified in the said Schedule to the said order and in the Schedule hereto. Note.—Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated are allotted to the boroughs where the diseases were contracted, and not to that in which the deaths actually took place. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 391, against 411 in September, a decrease of 20. The deaths in October were 140, a decrease of 27 on the number in September. Of the total deaths, males contributed 75; females, 65. Thirty-nine of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 27.86 per cent. of the whole number; 26 of hese were under 1 year of age.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 Years of Age and 5 Years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each Cause, in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, that were registered during the Month of October, 1892.

The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in October were 211, against 232 in September, a decrease of 21. The deaths amounted to 80, against 94 in September, a decrease of 14. There were 12 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 70 and 68, and 2 females of 78 and 74, died at Auckland; 3 males of 89, 81, and 73, and 1 female of 79, at Wellington; 1 female of 73 at Christchurch; 2 males of 80 and 70, and 1 female of 79, at Dunedin.

of 79, at Dunedin. Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—A still lower rate of mortality is again observed ; the total number of deaths being only 4 in the four chief towns, or at the rate of 5 per cent of the total deaths from all causes, against 9:57 per cent. in Septem-ber. Of these 4 deaths, 1 at Wellington was from diphtheria, and 1 from the same cause at Dunedin. Typhoid fever caused 1 death, at Wellington—making 23 from this disease since the beginning of the year, as against 8 at Auckland, 2 at Christchurch, and 1 at Dunedin. There was 1 death at Christchurch from what is termed septic pneumonia. Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from this class of disease were 22 in number, as against 21 for the previous month. Cancer caused 6 deaths, against 3 in September and 4 in August. The deaths from phthisis were 8, against 9 in September, 11 in August, and 18 in July. With milder weather the mortality has declined. Local Diseases.—The proportion of the total deaths at the four centres of population, which was 58:51 per cent. in September, fell to 50 per cent. in October, the number of deaths being 40. Of these, diseases of the respiratory organs accounted for 13, against 21 in September, 18 in August, and 14 in July. Of the 13 deaths last month, 5 took place at Wellington, 4 at Auckland, 1 at Christchurch, and 3 at Dunedin. All were from bronchitis and pneumonia. Violent Deaths.—The total number was 5, 3 accidental and 2 suicidal. An adult male was accidentally drowned ; a child of 7 years accidentally wounded in the neck, causing fatal result ; and a woman of 35 years of age was scalded to death during an epileptic fit. One suicide was by poison, another was a case of throat-cutting while temporarily insane. The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
