Altering Boundaries of the Westland and Nelson District Court Districts.

(L.S.) GLASGOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which District Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, a district was defined within which a District Court should be held under the said Act, and it was thereby declared that the said Court should be designated by the name of "The Nelson District Court:"

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the boundaries of the said district so defined were altered:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, a district was defined within which a District Court should be held under the said Act, and it was thereby declared that the said Court should be designated by the name of "The District Court of Westland:"

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the boundaries of the said district so defined were altered:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, the boundaries of the said districts so defined were further altered:

And whereas it is expedient to further alter the boundaries of the said Nelson and Westland Districts so defined as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of January next, the boundaries of the districts within which the Nelson District Court and the District Court of Westland shall respectively be held shall be altered, and that thenceforth the boundaries thereof shall be the boundaries hereinafter described:—

NELSON DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT.

All that area in the Land Districts of Nelson and Marlborough bounded towards the west and north generally by the sea from Kohaihai Bluff, on the West Coast, to Croixelles Harbour; thence by a line due east to Elaine Bay, Tennyson Inlet; towards the south-east generally by Tennyson Inlet, Tawhitinui Reach, Popoure Reach, Hikapu Reach, and Mahau Sound to Black Point; thence by the summit of the watershed leading to Elliott Peak; thence by the Counties of Marlborough and Amuri respectively to Mount Humboldt; and towards the south-west and again towards the west generally by the District Court District of Westland, hereinafter described.

DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT OF WESTLAND.

All that area in the Land Districts of Nelson and Westland bounded towards the north by Collingwood County; towards the south-east by the Counties of Waimea and Inangahua to the Buller River; thence towards the north-east by a right line to Mount Humboldt; again towards the south-east by the County of Amuri to the Hurunui Saddle; thence by the summit of the Southern Alps to Mount Aspiring; towards the south-west by a right line to the mouth of the Awarua River; and towards the north-west by the ocean.

A PROCLAMATION.

and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby notify, order, and declare that the following proviso is hereby added to regulation number two of the above-recited regulations, and that such regulations shall be read and construed accordingly, namely:—

“Provided that nothing in these regulations or in the Schedule hereto shall extend to prevent the payment in money of such fees as are payable to a Bailiff under ‘The Sheriffs Act, 1883,’ or any amendment thereof, or under any order, rule, regulation, or table made thereunder respectively.”

And it is hereby further declared that this Order in Council shall take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

WHEREAS by “The Factories Act, 1891” (hereinafter termed “the said Act”), it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time divide New Zealand, or any portion thereof, into such districts as he shall think fit, and notice of the constitution of every such district shall be given in the *Gazette* as occasion requires:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby divide the portions of the said colony enumerated in the Schedule hereto into districts for the purposes of the said Act, the descriptions and boundaries whereof shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto; and I do hereby declare that for the purposes of the said Act each of such districts shall be known by the name set over the description of each such district respectively.

WHEREAS by "The Factories Act, 1891," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal regulations not inconsistent with the said Act for the several purposes specified in that behalf: And whereas it is expedient to repeal the regulations made by Order in Council, dated the twenty-fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and to make the regulations hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby repeal the regulations made by the said Order in Council, dated the twenty-fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that such last-mentioned regulations shall come into force and take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

SCHEDULE.

(1.) Form of Notice under Section 9 of Act.

THE notice to be given under section 9 of "The Factories Act, 1891" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), by the occupier of a factory or work-room, and the particulars to be set forth in such notice, shall be in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto, or to the like effect. The fees to be taken and received for the registration of factories and work-rooms are prescribed by the said Act as amended by "The Factories Act Amendment Act, 1892," and are herein set forth as follows:—

- (a.) For every factory or work-room in which more than thirty persons are employed. £ s. d. 2 2 0
- (b.) For every factory or work-room in which more than ten, and not more than thirty, persons are employed 1 1 0
- (c.) For every factory or work-room in which more than two, and not more than ten, persons are employed 0 5 0

Such fees shall be paid by the occupier of a factory or work-room on or before the 31st day of January in each year to the Inspector.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the lands described in the Schedule thereto are declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to

1. 2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. Additional Rules of the Native Land Court, made under "The Native Land (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892."

GLASGOW, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Native Land Court Act, 1886," as amended by "The Native Land Court Act 1886 Amendment Act, 1888," and "The Native Land Court Acts Amendment Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make rules for regulating the sittings, practice, forms, and procedure of the Court, and for the government of all persons acting under the said first-mentioned Act, and for fixing the fees to be paid under the said first-mentioned Act, the time and mode of payment, and for enforcing the payment thereof, and such rules from time to time by other rules to alter or revoke:

And whereas by "The Native Land (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892," it is enacted that the said last-mentioned Act shall be read together with "The Native Land Court Act, 1886," and the several Acts amending the same; and it is expedient that rules should be made in respect of the procedure to be observed under "The Native Land (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892:"

Now, therefore, I, Hugh Garden Seth-Smith, the Chief Judge of the said Court, do hereby, in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Acts, make the rules following, which shall be read together with the rules of the Native Land Court dated the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety:—

RULES.

107. In these rules "the said Act (1892)" shall mean "The Native Land (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892."

108. All applications for inquiry under the said Act (1892) must be forwarded in duplicate to the Registrar of the Court in the District of Wellington, at his office in Wellington.

109. Each application must be in writing, and must be signed by the applicant, and have annexed thereto a translation in the Maori language, certified as correct by a licensed interpreter. Each application must describe the land by name or otherwise, and the district of the Registrar of the Native Land Court in which it is situate, and must contain the date of each deed, memorandum, or document in respect of which inquiry is applied for, and a short description of the contents thereof, together with the names of all persons who have, or are alleged to have, executed or signed the same.

110. It shall be the duty of the Registrar of the Court in the District of Wellington forthwith to cause such application to be printed in the *New Zealand Gazette* in the English language, and in the *Kahiti* in the Maori language; and, if the land mentioned in the said application is situate in the district of the Registrar of the Native Land Court of Auckland or Gisborne, the said Registrar of the District of Wellington shall forward one of the duplicate applications, together with copies for distribution of the *Gazette* or *Kahiti*, or of an extract therefrom, containing the application so printed as aforesaid, to the Registrar of the district in which such land is situate. The other duplicate application shall be recorded and retained in the office of the said Registrar of the District of Wellington.

111. It shall be the duty of the Registrar in whose district such land is situate to forward by post a copy of such *Gazette* or *Kahiti*, or extract as aforesaid, to each person who appears by such application to be interested in the subject-matter of the inquiry, and to all such other persons, if any, as appear by the records of the Court to have any interest in the land intended to be affected by the said application.

112. Subject to any special directions that may be given in any case, every notice of a sitting of the Court to hold an inquiry under the said Act (1892) shall be inserted in the *Gazette* in the English language, and in the *Kahiti* in the Maori language, not less than six clear weeks before the day appointed for the sitting of the Court as aforesaid, and copies of such *Gazette* or *Kahiti*, or extract therefrom, containing such notice, shall be forwarded to the same persons in the same manner as prescribed by Rule 111 for the forwarding of copies of applications.

113. If the inquiry is not held by the Chief Judge, it shall be the duty of the presiding Judge of the Court at the close of such inquiry to forward to the Chief Judge, at his office in Wellington, the evidence taken upon such inquiry, duly signed as required by section 5 of the said Act (1892), together with the certificate if such certificate be given, and the reason for refusing the certificate if such certificate be refused, and all deeds, documents, plans, or other exhibits that have been received in evidence.

114. Any application to the Chief Judge to refer any matter or question for further inquiry or for further consideration, in pursuance of section 14 of the said Act (1892), must be in writing, and must state the grounds upon which that application is made.

115. All notices or documents required by Rules 111 and 112 to be forwarded by post shall be forwarded by registered letter, and addressed to the person for whom the same is intended at his last known place of abode, unless a Judge of the Court shall, for good cause shown, direct that a notice be given in some other way.

116. A record shall be kept of the names of the persons to whom registered letters are forwarded in accordance with the provisions of these rules, together with the dates on which such letters are posted.

117. The fees set out in the Schedule of Fees hereto are hereby fixed as the fees to be paid upon proceedings taken under the said Act (1892).

Despatch.—Recognition of Acting Consular Appointments.

(Circular.)

Downing Street, 27th September, 1892.

MY LORD,—I have the honour to request that, instead of the arrangement laid down in Lord Stanley of Preston's circular despatch of the 28th January, 1886, with reference to the recognition of acting consular appointments in British colonies, the following may be substituted:—

When a Consul is authorised by the consular regulations of the country which he represents, or by the terms of his appointment, or by special instructions from his Government, to nominate an Acting Consular Officer in his absence, you will be at liberty to recognise the officer so nominated without reference to the Secretary of State.

It will be sufficient, in the first case, that the Consul should inform the Colonial Government once for all of the consular regulations of the country which he represents; and, in the second case, that he should communicate the terms of his appointment to the Colonial Government on taking up his post; but, in the third case, the nomination should always be accompanied by the special instructions.

In all other cases acting consular appointments made by the consular representatives of a foreign country should be provisionally recognised, unless there are special reasons for objecting to the person nominated on either personal or other grounds; and the question of the definitive recognition of the appointment should be referred to the Secretary of State.

I have to request that you will make a notification in this sense to the Consuls in the colony under your Government.

THE following information, received from H.M.S. "Curaçoa," is hereby promulgated:—

HYDROGRAPHIC REMARKS.

1. Fiji Islands, Viti Levu, West Coast, Nandi Waters: A small shoal of coral (herein noted as Curaçoa Patch) in the fairway through Nandi Waters, 120 yards (W. by N., E. by S.) long and 90 yards broad (N. by E., S. by W.) within its 5-fathom limit, has one shoal-head of 9ft. in its centre and 2½ fathoms close to its east and west edges: is dangerous, as it could not in the most favourable light be

distinguished at more than 700 yards, and then only showed as a dull-green streak. H.M.S. "Curacoa" grounded on this patch at 10.45 a.m. on the 13th October, 1892, the leads giving no warning, and, though the ship's course was being carefully watched from aloft in a favourable light, the shoal was not seen till the vessel took the ground. The patch and its surrounding area within a radius of one mile was subsequently sounded over, and the position of the danger fixed.

Curacoa Patch: Lat. 17° 46' 15" S., long. 177° 18' 15" E. Double Hill (North Peak), S. 5° E., 6½ miles; Iakuilau Island (centre), N. 71° E., 3½ miles; Sand Cay, south of Malamala Island (north-east extremity), N. 54° W., 1½ miles.

Charts affected: No. 2691, Fiji Islands (xii., 90); No. 845, Kandavu Passage to Kawata Island (i., 91).

Sailing directions: Pacific Islands, Vol. ii., 1891, pages 136 and 137.

2. Ovalau Island: East Danger is a small coral patch having only 1½ fathoms over it. This shoal-head was plainly seen. This patch is marked by a small black buoy immediately to the south of it.

West Danger is a small coral patch having not more than 15ft. on it, and showed plainly.

East Danger, from south reef of Namgani Island: Lat. 17° 36' 10" S., long. 178° 44' 20" E. South extreme point of Namgani Island, N. 81° W., 3 miles.

West Danger: Lat. 17° 34' 45" S., long. 178° 38' E. South extreme point of Namgani Island, E., 3½ miles.

These dangers are reported by Mr. Smith, master of the s.s. "Ovalau," proceeding from Levuka to the north and west. The "Ovalau" passed immediately south of both dangers.

IN pursuance and exercise of all the powers and authorities conferred upon me by "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1892," I, James Kemmis Warburton, the Public Trustee of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following additional regulations thereunder:—

1. At any meeting under section eight of the said Act, the presiding officer shall enter in the minute-book the name of every person who is appointed in writing, as hereinafter provided, to represent as agent an applicant for a new lease present at such meeting. NOTE.—Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated are allotted to the boroughs where the diseases were contracted, and not to that in which the deaths actually took place. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 378, against 391 in October, a decrease of 13. The deaths in November were 152, an increase of 12 on the number in October. Of the total deaths, males contributed 85; females, 67. Forty-one of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 26.97 per cent. of the whole number; 27 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in November were 196, against 211 in October, a decrease of 15. The deaths amounted to 88, against 80 in October, an increase of 8. There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 males of 80, 72, and 67, and 3 females of 85, 76, and 69, died at Auckland; 1 male of 77, and 1 female of 68, at Wellington; 2 males of 81 and 73, and 1 female of 67, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The number of deaths from these causes was again 4 altogether, but the proportion to the total of deaths from all causes was only 4.55 per cent., being slightly less than in October, when it was 5 per cent., and considerably less than in September, for which month the proportion was 9.57 per cent. One of the 4 deaths in November was from typhoid fever at Dunedin. The mortality from this disease since the beginning of the year has been: Wellington, 23 deaths; Auckland, 8; Christchurch, 2; and Dunedin, 2. There was 1 death from diarrhoea and another from septicæmia, both at Auckland. The fourth death was from puerperal peritonitis, and occurred at Dunedin.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 24 deaths, 7 resulted from cancer, against 6 in the previous month, 3 in September, and 4 in August. Phthisis caused 9 deaths, being 1 in excess of the number for October. One death occurred from what was returned as "suspected leprosy." The deceased was a Chinaman.

Local Diseases.—The proportion of deaths from all causes from local diseases was 43.18 per cent. In October the proportion was higher (50 per cent.), and in September higher still (58.51 per cent.). The number of deaths for November was 38. Diseases of respiratory organs caused 7 of these deaths, against 13 in October.

Violent Deaths.—The 8 deaths were all from accident. A man was killed by falling from a cart, another by a kick from a horse; three grown persons were found drowned; a child was accidentally burnt, and another received fatal injuries at its birth. One death, that of a boy, was caused by pyæmia, resulting from injury to foot.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
