A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken, under "The Public Works Act, 1882," and its amendments, for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Clutha County:

And whereas the Clutha County Council has laid before the Governor the memorial, accompanied by a map, and also the statutory declaration, required by the said Act and the amendments thereof:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby taken for the purposes of the construction of the said road.

Vesting Control of Waikato Bridge at Cambridge in Waikato County Council, and apportioning Cost of Maintenance.

(L.S.) GLASGOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what, part of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made under the hereinbefore in part recited Act for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and known as the Waikato Bridge at Cambridge, shall, from and after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Waikato County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the said Council"); and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authorities hereinafter mentioned in the following proportions, namely: Waikato County Council, forty-seven and one-half per centum; Borough Council of Cambridge, twenty-seven and one-half per centum; Piako County Council, fifteen per centum; Waikato County Council, ten per centum. And I do also hereby direct that the contributions hereby required to be made as aforesaid towards the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge shall be paid from time to time, in the proportions hereinbefore prescribed, by the Borough Council of Cambridge out of the Borough Fund of the Borough of Cambridge, and by the Piako County Council out of the County Fund of the Piako County, and by the Waikato County Council out of the County Fund of the Waikato County, within a period of ten days after a demand in writing, made

by or on behalf of the said Council, stating the amount so required to be paid and the purpose for which it is so required, shall have been left at the office of the local body liable hereunder to make such payment; and the payments so to be made shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Council for and on behalf of the said Council.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twentieth day of December, 1892.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1891," the trustees of the estate of the late Honourable William Robinson, of Christchurch, in New Zealand, deceased, as owners of the lands lying within the County of Cheviot, in New Zealand, called or known as "The Cheviot Hills Estate," on or about the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, furnished a return to the Commissioner of Taxes, wherein the value of the said lands for the purposes of the said Act was stated to be two hundred and sixty thousand two hundred and twenty pounds: And whereas in virtue of the powers vested in him under the said Act the said Commissioner assessed the value of the said lands at the sum of three hundred and four thousand eight hundred and twenty-six pounds: And whereas on or about the tenth day of October last the said trustees gave notice in writing to the said Commissioner to the effect that they were dissatisfied with the amount at which the said lands were assessed, and called upon him to reduce such assessment to the sum at which such lands had been valued in the return so made by the said trustees, or else to purchase such lands at such sum: And whereas the Commissioner has determined not to reduce the assessment so made by him, but to purchase or acquire the said lands, subject to the approval hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him under "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1891," and "The Land and Income Assessment Act Amendment Act, 1892," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby consent to and approve of the purchase or acquisition from the said trustees by the said Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, of all the lands lying in the County of Cheviot aforesaid, called or known as "The Cheviot Hills Estate," at or for the price or sum of two hundred and sixty thousand two hundred and twenty pounds, being the value of such lands as specified in the return furnished by the said trustees as aforesaid.

WHEREAS by the two hundred and twenty-seventh section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that if, through any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission, anything required by the said Act to be done is omitted to be done or is not done within the time fixed, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, and may validate anything which may have been irregularly done in matter of form, so that the intent and purpose of the said Act may have effect: And whereas, at the annual meeting of the Licensing Committee for the District of Wairio, held on the eighth day of June last,

William Snodgrass applied for a renewal of an accommodation license for the Lake Te Anau Hotel, Te Anau, and the application was granted, and a certificate was thereupon issued for such renewal: And whereas the said William Snodgrass, through inadvertence, neglected to pay the necessary fee within the required time, but did subsequently pay the said fee, and thereupon the Treasurer of the Wallace County Council granted such license to the said William Snodgrass:

THAT the following by-laws for licensing hawkers and pedlars and places of amusement be made, in accordance with the provisions of "The Counties Act, 1886:"—

HAWKERS AND PEDLARS.

From and after the commencement and coming into operation of this by-law it shall not be lawful for any person to carry on the business of a hawker or pedlar in any place whatsoever within the Pelorus Road Board District without having previously obtained a license as hereinafter directed.

Every person carrying on such business as aforesaid shall be deemed and taken to be unlicensed, unless he or she shall prove to the contrary by the production of his or her license or otherwise.

The word "hawker" or "pedlar" shall include any person or persons who, with or without horses or carriages, shall carry or convey for sale and immediate delivery from house to house any goods, wares, or merchandise, or who shall seek for orders for the purchase, sale, and delivery, at any future time, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, or who shall expose any goods, wares, or merchandise for sale in any public place within the said Road Board district.

And shall also include any person or persons who shall within the said Road Board district sell, or seek for orders for the sale or purchase of, books or other publications, including prints, engravings, and pictures, either for themselves as principals, or as agents for the publishers of such books or publications, prints, engravings, or pictures, or for any other person or persons whatsoever, or who shall by way of or as auctioneer set up or offer for sale by way of Dutch auction (which is by taking a less price for the goods offered than that at which it was first offered) any property, goods, or chattels of any description whatsoever.

The license shall be issued by the Secretary of the Pelorus Road Board to any person applying for same on payment of the under-mentioned fees, which shall be payable to the Road Board Fund for such licenses: License for a year, £3; license for a quarter of a year, £1; license for a month, 10s.

Yearly licenses shall expire on the 31st December next ensuing, and shall after that date expire upon the 31st day of December of each and every subsequent year.

All licenses shall be dated on the first day of the month then current.

Nothing in this by-law shall render it necessary for a license to be obtained by the following persons as such: (1) Commercial travellers or other persons selling or seeking orders for goods, wares, or merchandise to or from any persons who are dealers therein, and who buy to sell again; (2) persons selling or exposing to sale goods, wares, or merchandise in any public mart, market, or fairly legalised establishment; or any person selling or offering for sale meat, bread, fish, fruit, garden farm or dairy produce.

Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall, for every breach thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

LICENSES FOR PUBLIC HALL, ETC.

The following shall be the fees respectively to be paid for licenses to use for places of public amusement the buildings or enclosures within the Pelorus Road Board District, hereinafter, that is to say:—

For every theatre, for the period of one year or any less period, £5.

For every circus or enclosure used for public amusement or performance, for the period of one year, £20; for six months, £10; for less period, £5.

For every public hall used for any description of public meeting, entertainment, or performance, not being a theatre or a circus, £2, for any period not exceeding one year.

For every bowling- or skittle-alley, £1 per annum or less period.

For every shooting-gallery, £1 per annum or less period.

For every billiard- or bagatelle-room, £1 per annum or less period.

For any building or enclosure not hereinbefore specified, £2 per annum or less period.

Every such license, at whatever time of the year the same may be issued in the first instance, shall terminate on the 31st day of December.

SIR,—His Excellency the Minister of the Interior has just mentioned to me that the Sanitary Administration has no means of assuring itself that cattle and sheep, the flesh of which is actually imported from Australia to Port Said, were in sound condition at the time of slaughtering, and that they had no taint of contagious disease.

The Sanitary Administration, in the interest of public health, demands, therefore, that meat so imported shall be accompanied by a certificate from a competent authority setting forth that the animals from which it (the flesh) comes were perfectly sound.

As the question is of interest, in the first place, to public health and hygiene, I venture to hope, Sir, that you will be so good and kind as to take care that the sanitary authorities may be satisfied, and that the certificate they demand may be produced in future.

Altering Rules of the Native Land Court, made under "The Native Land (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892."

WHEREAS by "The Native Land Court Act, 1886," as amended by "The Native Land Court Act 1886 Amendment Act, 1888," and "The Native Land Court Acts Amendment Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make rules for regulating the sittings, practice, forms, and procedure of the Court, and for the government of all persons acting under the said first-mentioned Act, and for fixing the fees to be paid under the said first-mentioned Act, the time and mode of payment, and for enforcing the payment thereof, and such rules from time to time by other rules to alter or revoke: And whereas by "The Native Land (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892," it is enacted that the said last-mentioned Act shall be read together with "The Native Land Court Act, 1886," and the several Acts amending the same: And whereas on the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, certain regulations purporting to be additional rules of the Native Land Court, and numbered one hundred and seven to one hundred and seventeen inclusive, were duly made and approved under the authority aforesaid for the purpose of regulating the procedure with regard to applications under "The Native Lands (Validation of Titles) Act, 1892:" And whereas it is expedient to amend and alter the said rules in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, George Boutflower Davy, the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court, in exercise of the powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby rescind and annul rule one hundred and ten of the said additional regulations, and in lieu thereof make the regulation following:—

It shall be the duty of the Registrar of the Court in the District of Wellington forthwith to cause such application, or a concise notice thereof, specifying with reasonable certainty the land to be affected thereby, and (so far as can be ascertained from such application) the names of the persons interested, to be printed in the *New Zealand Gazette* in the English language, and in the *Kahiti* in the Maori language; and, if the land mentioned in the said application is situate in the district of the Registrar of the Native Land Court of Auckland or Gisborne, the said Registrar of the District of Wellington shall forward one of the duplicate applications, together with copies for distribution of the *Gazette* or *Kahiti*, or of an extract therefrom, containing the application or notice so printed as aforesaid, to the Registrar of the district in which such land is situate. The other duplicate application shall be recorded and retained in the office of the said Registrar of the District of Wellington.

The above regulation shall be read together with the regulations made as aforesaid on the 2nd day of November, 1892. Dated at Wellington, this 3rd day of January, 1893.

NOTE.—Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated are allotted to the boroughs where the diseases were contracted, and not to that in which the deaths actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 372, against 378 in November, a decrease of 6. The deaths in December were 156, an increase of 4 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 85; females, 71. Sixty-seven of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 42.95 per cent. of the whole number; 55 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in December were 182, against 196 in November, a decrease of 14. The deaths amounted to 91, against 88 in November, an increase of 3. There were 16 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 males of 82 and 72 (2), and 2 females of 68 and 65, died at Auckland; 2 males of 83 and 72 at Wellington; 1 male of 67, and 2 females of 86, at Christchurch; 2 males of 69 and 65, and 4 females, 2 of 67 and 2 of 65, at Dunedin.

Comparison of Death-rates.—Comparing the death-rates of the four chief towns for December, Auckland is found to have the highest, 1.05 per 1,000 persons living; Dunedin follows with a rate of 1.03 per 1,000; at Wellington the rate was 0.87, and at Christchurch 0.68, per 1,000.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths for December in the above centres numbered 20, being 21·98 per cent of the mortality from all causes. This is a large increase on the figures for November, when the deaths were only 4, and the percentage only 4·55 of the total deaths. Since April, when the deaths numbered 21, the mortality from zymotic disease diminished until last month, when the sudden rise alluded to above took place. The chief causes of increase were bowel complaints. From diarrhoea and cholera infantum there were 9 deaths, 6 of them at Auckland, 2 at Wellington, and 1 at Dunedin, all cases of children under 5 years of age. Dysentery caused 1 death at Dunedin. Influenza appears as the next highest cause of death; it was again epidemic and fatal in 6 cases, 1 at Wellington, 2 at Christchurch, and 3 at Dunedin. Two deaths resulted from typhoid fever, both at Auckland; the aggregate mortality from this disease for the year has been: Wellington, 25 deaths; Auckland, 9; Christchurch, 2; and Dunedin, 2.

Constitutional Diseases.—Out of 15 deaths, 5 were caused by phthisis and 4 by cancer; this last disease was fatal in 7 cases during November and 6 in October.

Local Diseases.—The proportion of deaths from local diseases fell from 43·18 per cent in November to 39·56 per cent. in December, the numbers being 38 and 36 deaths for those months respectively. Diseases of the respiratory system caused 11 of the 36 deaths in December.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 6 altogether, of which 5 were accidental: 3 were cases of drowning, 1 a death by fracture of spine through falling through a skylight, and 1 from an injury received at birth. There was 1 suicide by poisoning.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
