At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-sixth day of January, 1893.

Present: THE HONOURABLE SIR P. A. BUCKLEY, K.C.M.G., PRE-SIDING IN COUNCIL.

SIDING IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1888," Frederick Wil-liam Matthews, of Mangawhare (hereinafter called "the li-censee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore near Te Koporu, on the Wairoa River, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to extend a wharf constructed by him in accordance with plans marked M.D. 1514 and 1515, which were approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of Sep-tember one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and, the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of Sep-tember, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1793), showing the place where it is intended to make such extension, and the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the said licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter

and its lett to only balance and conditions hereinafter purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as afore-said; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark on which the extension of the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of extending the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and sub-ject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:— 1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined

by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister. 2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark occupied by the extension to the said wharf as shown on plan marked M.D. 1793.

M.D. 1793.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of two pounds, payable on the 1st day of January, dating from the 1st day of January, 1893.
4. All Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said extension of the wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.
5. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in

5. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said extension of the wharf

without payment. 6. The licensee shall complete the erection of the said extension of the wharf, in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1793, within twelve calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

7. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned exten-sion of the wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Pro-vided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been

vided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister. S. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all rea-sonable times, enter upon the said extension of the wharf and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such extension of the wharf, requiring him within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made. to be removed or such repairs to be made. 9. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsis-tent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regula-tion of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amend-ments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force. 10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said extension of the wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and de-posited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Harbourmaster for the Port of Kaipara, or by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister

by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the 24th day of September, 1889, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
 The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.
 The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said extension of the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.
 In case the licensee shall—

 Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein.

- In case the licensee shall—

 Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-before set forth, or any of them;
 Cease to use or occupy the said extension of the wharf;
 Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relations to hardwarder.
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
 (5.) Die during the subsistence of the license hereby

(5.) Die during the subsistence of the license hereby granted, then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and pri-vileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined. Regulations for the Preservation of Peace and Good Order in Samoa

High Commissioner's Office, Western Pacific, Suva, Fiji, 29th December, 1892. My LORD,—Herewith I have the honour to enclose copies of a regulation which I have passed for the preservation of peace and group order in Sameo

a regulation which I have passed for the preservation of peace and good order in Samoa. At present, under the Western Pacific Orders in Council, an attempt to create disorder can only be dealt with by an order of prohibition forbidding the person prohibited from residing within certain limits; or an order to find sureties for good behaviour, and in default an order of deportation. As sureties can seldom be found, the Court is obliged to either dismiss the case with a caution or order the defendant to be deported, a course which would be justifiable only in a

to be deported, a course which would be justifiable only in a very grave case. At present there are, I believe, many Europeans in Samoa who are inciting the natives not to pay their taxes, and to offer at least a passive resistance to the Government con-stituted by the Final Act of the Berlin Convention on Samoan affairs. It is therefore likely that a mere warning may not be a sufficient deterrent, and I have therefore passed the enclosed regulation, which will enable the Court to deal with persons seeking to create disturbance by a small fine or imprisonment, so that it will be unnecessary to issue any order of deportation except, as indicated above. to issue any order of deportation except, as indicated above, in a case of special gravity and danger. A REGULATION made in the name and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879, for the Main-tenance of Peace and good Order in Samoa.

1. ANY British subject who shall be guilty of sedition towards the Government of Samoa shall be liable on con-viction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds, or to imprison-ment without hard labour for not more than three months,

ment without hard labour for not more than three months, with or without a fine not exceeding ten pounds. 2. The expression "Government of Samoa" shall mean the Government recognised as such in Samoa by the prin-cipal British Consular Officer for the time being in Samoa. 3. The expression "Sedition towards the Government of Samoa" shall embrace all practices, whether by word, deed, or writing, having for their object to bring about in Samoa discontent or dissatisfaction, public disturbance, civil war, hatred or contempt towards the King or Government of Samoa, or the laws or constitution of the country, and gene-rally to promote public disorder in Samoa.

Samoa, or the laws or constitution of the country, and gene-rally to promote public disorder in Samoa. 4. If at the trial of any person under this regulation it shall appear that the offence charged is one which would, if this regulation had not been made, be punishable as criminal libel, or otherwise, by English law or under any Order in Council issued by Her Majesty and being in force in Samoa, or by any other regulation made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, the Court may either proceed with the trial under this regulation, or may order that the charge under this regulation be dismissed and that the accused be put on his trial for criminal libel, or otherwise, as the case put on his trial for criminal libel, or otherwise, as the case

may be. 5. This regulation shall come into operation on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and may be cited as "The Sedi-tion (Samoa) Regulation, 1892." My LORD,—With reference to the protection of British subjects and their interests in the New Hebrides and the Western Pacific generally, your Excellency is doubtless aware that a question has been before the Law Officers of the Crown as to whether an ordinance might not be pro-perly passed in Fiji providing for the detention in the colony of natives of the Western Pacific Islands who were shown to have perpetrated criminal acts against British subjects. I have now the honour of informing your Excellency that such an ordinance was passed at a recent session of the Legislative Council of this colony, of which I beg leave to transmit copies for the information of your Excellency's Government. AN ORDINANCE enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Fiji, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Coun-cil thereof, to authorise the Reception and Detention in the Colony of Fiji of certain Persons when brought there by Her Majesty's Naval Officers.

Preamble. WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the detention in certain cases in the Colony of Fiji of persons who in places not being within Her Majesty's dominions or the jurisdiction of any civilised Power have committed crimes, outrages, or disorders :

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows :---

and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows. —
Certain prisoners brought to Fiji by Her Majesty's naval officers may be received and detained.
1. It shall be lawful for the Governor to receive and to detain in the colony during Her Majesty's pleasure any persons, not being Her Majesty's subjects or the subjects or citizens of any civilised Power, who have been taken prisoners and brought to the colony by Her Majesty's naval officers on the ground of crimes, outrages, or disorders committed by such persons in places not being within Her Majesty's dominions or the jurisdiction of any civilised Power.

Custody of such prisoners.

2. Every prisoner so received and detained shall be under the legal custody of the Superintendent of Police and of all officers and constables of the Police Force of the colony, and also under the legal custody of any person who may be from time to time especially appointed by the Governor in that bebelf behalf.

Governor may provide for place of detention and make regu-lations for care of such prisoners.

lations for care of such prisoners. 3. The Governor may appoint from time to time any place in the colony to be the usual place of detention of the prisoners or any of them, or may make such other provision as he thinks fit for their detention, and in either case may from time to time make special regulations for the care, custody, and maintenance of the prisoners, and as to com-munication with them ; and any person offending against such regulations shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, or, in default of pay-ment, to imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months. months.

Penalty for assisting escape of such prisoner.

4. Any person inciting or aiding and abetting, and any person conniving at or negligently permitting, the escape, or attempt to escape, of any such prisoner from the colony shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not ex-ceeding fifty pounds, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for any period not exceeding six months, or both both.

JERSEY, Governor. Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies. NUCHEBEAS by section ten of "The Imported Stock Act

the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies. W HEREAS by section ten of "The Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor is empowered, by Proclama-tion in the Government *Gazette*, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduc-tion of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by a Pro-clamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, published in the Government *Gazette* of this date, pursuant to the provisions of "The Imported Stock Act of 1871," amongst other things, scab in sheep was declared to be an infectious or contagious disease : And whereas there is reason to believe that scab does not now exist in sheep in the Colony of New Zealand : Now, therefore, I, Victor Albert George, Earl of Jersey, Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby withdraw the Proclamation of the eighteenth day of December last (1892), which prohibits the importation or introduction of any sheep, or any fodder or fittings put on board any vessel with, or for the use of, any sheep from the Colony of New Zealand.
