*Regulations under Land and Income Assessment Acts.—  
Shipping and Insurance.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of March, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities vested in him by or under "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1891," and "The Land and Income Assessment Act Amendment Act, 1892," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations under and for the purposes of the said Acts, that is to say,—

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person or company engaged in any business as owner or charterer of shipping shall be assessed for taxation in respect thereof upon income derived from such business as such owner or charterer carried on in New Zealand, and also upon income from any business as such owner or charterer originating in New Zealand and carried on with places beyond New Zealand, but not upon income from any such business originating in places beyond New Zealand and carried on with places within New Zealand.

The Commissioner of Taxes may require such owner or charterer to supply him with any information he may consider necessary to enable him to determine what income of a person or company engaged in business as owner or charterer of shipping is income liable to be assessed for taxation under "The Land and Income Assessment Act, 1891," and its amendment.

2. The income of every insurance company derived from business carried on in New Zealand, and from income from investments in New Zealand other than upon land or mortgages of land, shall be deemed to be the income of such

company in New Zealand; and the income of such company shall not include income from business carried on beyond New Zealand, or income from investments beyond New Zealand.

The Commissioner of Taxes may require to be supplied with information he may consider necessary to enable him to determine what income of an insurance company is income in New Zealand and liable to be assessed for taxation under the provisions of the said Acts.

3. Every person or company engaged in business in New Zealand as an owner or charterer of shipping, and every company carrying on business in New Zealand as an insurance company within the meaning of the said Acts, shall be liable to all other provisions of the said Acts or either of them, or of any regulations now or hereafter in force thereunder, so far as the provisions of the said Acts or regulations are or may be applicable to any such person or company as aforesaid.

*Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License-fee, &c., Marlborough District.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants, Californian quail, and hares may be taken or killed within the Marlborough District, consisting of the Counties of Marlborough and Sounds (except in the Wairau Lagoons and Lake Grassmere), from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that

licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at Blenheim is hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further notify that Native game, excepting tui, huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the said district during the period between the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive.

*Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License-fee, &c., Nelson District.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants and quail may be taken or killed within the Nelson District, consisting of the Counties of Waimea, Buller, and Collingwood, from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned); and I do further notify that licenses to take or kill game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of ten shillings each, and that licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmasters at Nelson and Westport are hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further declare that native game, excepting tui, huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned district from the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive.

*Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License-fee, &c., Otago District.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that hares and Californian quail may be taken or killed within the Otago District—being all that area in the Provincial District of Otago bounded on the east and south by the ocean, from Shag Point to the mouth of the Mataura River; on the west, south-west, and south by the Mataura River and the Counties of Southland and Wallace; on the north-west by the ocean; and on the north, north-west, and north-east by the Counties of Westland and Waitaki: excepting therefrom the County of Lake—from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at Dunedin is hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further declare that native game, excepting wild geese, tui, huia, white heron, bittern, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned district from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive.

*Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License-fee, &c., Waitaki District.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of

New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants and quail may be taken or killed within the Waitaki District, consisting of the County of Waitaki, from the first day of June to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive; and that hares may be taken or killed within the said district from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at Oamaru is hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further declare that native game, excepting tui, huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned district from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive.

*Coursing Season for Hares, and Shooting Season for Native Game, License-fee, &c., Inangahua District.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that hares may be taken or killed, by coursing only, within the Inangahua District, consisting of the County of Inangahua, from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to course hares within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of ten shillings each, and that licenses to sell hares and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Postmaster at Reefton is hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further declare that native game, excepting tui, huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned district from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive.

*Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License-fee, &c., South Canterbury District.*

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants and Californian quail may be taken or killed within the South Canterbury District, consisting of the Counties of Waimate and Mackenzie, and that part of the Geraldine County lying south of the Opihi River, from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on the payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at Timaru, and the Postmaster at Waimate, are hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further declare that native game, excepting tui, huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned district from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive.
