Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License-fee, &c., Taranaki District.

GLASGOW, Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants and Californian quail may be taken or killed within the Taranaki District, consisting of the Counties of Taranaki, Clifton, and Stratford (excepting therefrom the reserve known as Mount Strationd (excepting therefrom the reserve known as Mount Egmont Forest Reserve, being the area included within the circumference of a circle having a radius of six miles from the summit of the said Mount Egmont), from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both inclusive (subject, nevertheless, to the re-strictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further patient that licences to take or kill such area within the said shillings each, and that licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that licenses to sell game and native game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at New Plymouth is hereby And I do further declare that native game, excepting tui

huia, white heron, and crested grebe, may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned district, excepting therefrom the aforesaid Mount Egmont Forest Reserve, from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, both days inclusive.

And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued Acts mentioned).
