A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the one hundred and seventy-second section of "The Land Act, 1892," and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be subject to the provisions of sections one hundred and seventy-two to one hundred and eighty-six of Part V. of "The Land Act, 1892," relating to small grazing-runs.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this tenth day of April, 1893.

THE HONOURABLE W. P. REEVES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight the Native Land Court, sitting at Wanganui, investigated the title to a block of land, containing three thousand two hundred and fifty acres, more or less, called in the application for investigation the Okirae Block: And whereas the Native Land Court, upon the investigation of such title, notified its intention to exclude from the memorial of ownership to be issued for the said block a piece of land situated in the south-west corner of the said Okirae Block, containing one hundred and twenty-five acres, more or less, and known as Te Kiato, the boundaries of the said land not being completely defined by water and bounds, but being marked on a plan then produced to the Court: And whereas through an error of the said Court a memorial of ownership was subsequently issued for the whole block, therein called the Okirae Block, containing three thousand two hundred and fifty acres, more or less: And whereas the block described on such memorial of ownership, excluding certain reserves, but including the said piece of land consisting of one hundred and twenty-five acres, known as Te Kiato, became subsequently vested in purchasers for value, claiming under the persons named in the said memorial of ownership, with an indefeasible title under the Land Transfer Acts, notwithstanding that the ownership according to Native custom of the said piece of land called Te Kiato had never been ascertained: And whereas the Supreme Court of New Zealand in the case of the Okirae Block (10 N.Z. L.R. 677) expressed an opinion that the Natives entitled according to Native custom have a valid claim upon the Assurance Fund under "The Land Transfer Act, 1885," and the Acts amending the same in respect of the deprivation of their interests in the said land: And whereas it is desirable, for the purpose of ascertaining the persons entitled to make such claim, that the matters and questions hereinafter specified should be within the jurisdiction of the Native Land Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by "The Native Land Court Act, 1886," and "The Native Land Court Act Amendment Act, 1889" (hereinafter termed "the said Acts"), and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that the following questions shall be and the same are hereby brought within the jurisdiction of the Native Land Court established under the said Acts, that is to say:—

1. Who are the persons who would, but for the issue of the said memorial of ownership for the whole block called Okirae, containing three thousand two hundred and fifty acres, and the subsequent dealings therewith, now be entitled according to Native custom to the said piece of land known as Te Kiato, containing one hundred and twenty-five acres, more or less, if the same were now Native land the title to which was unascertained, and was the subject of an application to the said Native Land Court for investigation of the title thereto?

2. In what proportionate shares would such persons in such case be respectively entitled in the said piece of land?

And it is hereby further ordered and declared that this order shall take effect as from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

Altered Regulations for the Management and Administration of Funds and Moneys under Section 69 of "The Coal-mines Act, 1891."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE HONOURABLE W. P. REEVES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section sixty-six of "The Coal-mines Act, 1891" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, make, alter, and revoke regulations for regulating the management and administration of the funds and moneys mentioned or referred to in section sixty-nine of the said Act: And whereas it appears expedient to alter the regulations made by Order in Council on the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the alterations in the regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, aforesaid, as hereinafter set forth, that is to say,—

In regulation 5 (a), by omitting the words "after the expiration of the first week," and by inserting, after the words "medical officer," the words "and the trustees"; also by inserting the following words at the end of the regulation: "Provided that no workman shall be entitled to any payment unless he shall have been so disabled by accident as to prevent him working for a period of not less than one week or more."

In regulation 11 (a), by omitting the words "after the expiration of the first week," and by inserting the following words at the end of the regulation: "Provided that no workman shall be entitled to any payment unless he shall have been so disabled by accident as to prevent him working for a period of not less than one week or more."

And, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby declare that such altered regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Amending Parcel-post Regulations.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this tenth day of April, 1893.

THE HONOURABLE W. P. REEVES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Post Office Act 1861 Amendment Act, 1886," and "The Post Office (Foreign Parcels) Act, 1888" (hereinafter termed "the said Acts"), Orders in Council were made on the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, prescribing regulations and fixing rates of postage for the transmission of parcels through the post respectively within the colony to the United Kingdom, to foreign places by way of the United Kingdom, and to certain of the Australian Colonies and Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the regulations and certain of the rates of postage made by the said Orders in Council and all amendments thereof (except the regulations contained in the Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, making regulations, *inter alia*, for the collection of Customs duty on parcels received from abroad), and to make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby revoke the regulations made by the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council and all amendments thereof, except as aforesaid, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto as set out therein, do affirm and reappoint the rates of postage by such Orders in Council or their amendments as aforesaid required to be demanded and paid for the transmission through the post of any such parcel as aforesaid and as set out in the Schedule aforesaid, except such rates as have heretofore been demanded and paid for parcels addressed to Ceylon and the Straits Settlements, and do hereby order and declare that the rates of postage for parcels addressed to Ceylon and the Straits Settlements shall be those set out in the said Schedule; and do further order and declare that this Order in Council shall be and remain in force on and after the tenth day of April instant.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSMISSION.

1. In order that a packet may be sent by Parcel Post, it should be handed in at a Post Office counter or delivery-window and bear the words "Parcel Post" written or printed conspicuously in the left-hand top corner. It is also desirable that every parcel should bear the name and address of the sender on the cover, but in such a position as not to be taken for the address of the parcel. The officer to whom the parcel is handed will check the size, weight, and postage affixed before accepting the parcel.

Parcels should be handed in at counter, and bear sender's address.

2. Parcels not exceeding 11lb. in weight, 3ft. 6in. in length, or 6ft. in length and girth combined, are accepted for transmission to all places within the colony, excepting those not served by railway, coach, or steam-boat (see next section), the Australian Colonies (excepting New South Wales), and the United Kingdom. Thus a parcel measuring 3ft. 6in. in length could be 2ft. 6in. in girth, while one of 3ft. in length might be 3ft. in girth, &c. The limits of weight and size of parcels for other countries will be found at pages 491 to 496, second last column.

Limits of weight and size.

3. Parcels for New Zealand offices not served by railway, coach, or steamer, a list of which is given at pages 497 to 499, must not exceed 5lb. in weight, 2ft. in length, and 1ft. in breadth or depth; nor can parcels for those offices be accepted which are of too fragile a nature to permit of their safe transmission in mail-bags. These same limitations apply also to all parcels posted at such places.

Maximum dimensions and weight to and from New Zealand offices not served by railway, coach, or steamer.

4. Parcels must not be posted in posting-boxes; infringements of this rule render inland parcels liable to a fine of 6d. on delivery, and foreign parcels to detention.

Not to be posted in posting-boxes.

5. The sender of a parcel addressed to any place beyond New Zealand will require to make a Customs declaration (on a form to be obtained at any Post Office) describing the contents and stating the value thereof, and also giving the name of the office of destination and the sender's signature and place of residence. False declaration involves the forfeiture of the parcel, and renders the sender liable to prosecution under the Customs laws.

6. The postage must be fully prepaid in postage stamps, which should be affixed by the sender or the person handing in the parcel to a label which may be obtained at the counter to be affixed to the parcel in the right-hand top corner.

7. Parcels bearing or containing writing or marks of an offensive or indecent character, or containing gunpowder, cartridges, lucifer matches, or anything explosive or liable to sudden combustion, bladders containing liquid, live animals, offensive or filthy matter, or any substance likely to cause injury to other parcels or to the officers of the Post Office, are not accepted for transmission. Parcels addressed to countries beyond the colony must not contain any perishable articles, such as fish, game, &c., and are, in addition to the above, liable to the further prohibitions indicated at pages 491 to 496, last column.

Prohibited parcels.

8. Parcels containing perishable articles, such as game, fish, eggs, &c., may be accepted for inland transmission. Razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments, liquids, or semi-liquids, such as paints, &c., bottles, or glass in any form, may be forwarded both inland and to such of the countries beyond the colony as do not specially prohibit their introduction (see prohibitions at pages 491 to 496, last column). All such articles must, however, be securely packed, so as to prevent all risk or injury to other parcels or the officers of the Post Office.

Parcels which can only be admitted if specially packed.

9. Parcels must not contain any letter, coin, or bank-notes (unsigned and cancelled bank-notes may, however, be forwarded to places in the colony in sealed packets), or any packet or parcel intended for delivery at an address other than that borne by the parcel itself. For every letter so enclosed, and for each article directed to a different address than the one on the parcel, the parcel becomes liable to a surcharge of double the postage which such enclosure would have cost if sent separately. Invoices may, however, be sent in parcels addressed to offices within the colony. Parcels having written thereon any communication in the nature of a letter are subject to a fine of 6d.

Not to enclose letters, or articles addressed differently to the parcel itself.

- Inland parcels may be registered. 10. Parcels for delivery in the colony may be registered on the same conditions as letters, and for an additional fee of 2d. a receipt will be obtained from the addressee on delivery and forwarded to the sender. Certificate of posting for foreign parcels. Parcels directed to places beyond the colony cannot be accepted for registration, but, in lieu, the sender may obtain a certificate of posting on payment of a fee of 2d. Neither certificate of posting nor registration involve any liability on the part of the department beyond that named in clause 23.
- Jewellery and valuables to be specially packed, and if for New Zealand, registered. Gold export duty to be prepaid. 11. Parcels containing gold, jewellery, and such like valuables should be securely packed, and, if addressed to any place within New Zealand, are recommended to be registered. Their transmission to certain countries is not permitted (see prohibitions, pages 491 to 496, last column). Parcels containing gold mined in the North Island, if addressed to countries beyond the colony, can only be posted at Money Order Offices, and senders will have to pay thereon the gold export duty (2s. per ounce) in addition to the usual parcel postage.
- Manner of packing. 12. The public will greatly facilitate the work of the Post Office and help towards the safe delivery of parcels by taking care that they are in all cases compactly, strongly, and securely packed, especially those with fragile or perishable contents. It must be borne in mind that each parcel must be several times handled before it reaches its destination, and although every care will be taken by the officers through whose hands they pass, yet it will be impossible to avoid occasional damage if the packing be defective.
- Contents may be examined by postal officers. 13. Parcels may be opened and examined by postal officers, but this does not make it obligatory that the ends shall be left open by senders. After so opening the examining officer will securely refasten them.
- Possible delay of parcels. 14. Parcels may be delayed when their transmission would interfere with the due despatch of letter mails.
- Delivery of parcels. 15. At places served by letter-carriers delivery of parcels will be made by them as far as practicable. Where letter-carriers are not employed, or where they are unable to deliver parcels, delivery must be taken at the Post Office. Senders are recommended to inform addressees by post of the despatch of parcels so as to assure prompt delivery.
- Redirected parcels liable to fresh rate of postage. 16. Redirected parcels are liable to a new rate of postage for each redirection.
- Parcels liable to demurrage. 17. Parcels addressed to a Post Office "To be called for" will, after they have remained in the office seven clear days (excluding Sundays and holidays), be charged demurrage at the rate of 1d. a day. No demurrage, however, will be charged on parcels for places at which there is no house-to-house delivery, or to persons on board ship.
- Charges to be paid before delivery. 18. Parcels cannot be delivered until all charges due thereon, such as Customs duty, redirection fees, &c., are paid.
- Senders to be advised if parcels refused or undeliverable. 19. When parcels are refused by the addressees, or known to be undeliverable, senders will be immediately communicated with, and they may elect to have them redirected to another place or returned, but they must pay a fresh rate of postage for such redirection or return.
- Unclaimed parcels. Undeliverable parcels. 20. Unclaimed parcels will be retained at the office from which they should be delivered for one clear month, exclusive of the one in which they are received. At the end of that period the sender will be advised that they cannot be delivered, as provided in the preceding section.
- How disposed of. 21. Inland parcels, if not claimed by the addressees or senders within three months, exclusive of the one in which they have been received, will be disposed of as the Postmaster-General may direct. Parcels with perishable contents may be destroyed immediately they become offensive. Parcels from countries beyond New Zealand, if unclaimed, will be retained until expiry of six months from the date of posting of the advice of non-delivery to the sender, and then returned through the Dead Letter Office to countries of origin.
- Parcel once posted cannot be handed back to sender. Department not liable for delay. 22. Postmasters are forbidden to hand a parcel back to the sender.
- Department liable for loss or damage up to £2. 23. The Postmaster-General is not responsible for the delay of any parcel.
24. In the event of any damage or loss of any parcel occurring during transit, the Postmaster-General shall in no case be liable to pay, by way of compensation to the owner or otherwise, a greater sum than two pounds sterling in respect of any parcel.

BRITISH, INTERCOLONIAL, AND FOREIGN PARCEL POST.

NOTE.—Until arrangements are made for the exchange of direct parcel-mails with China, India, Canada, &c., parcels to and from these countries will be forwarded through the General Post Office, London. (Parcel-mails to London are forwarded by Direct Steamers only.)

Rules for regulating the procedure under the Act in the Scotch and Irish Courts have been prepared, but are not yet ready for issue.

"COLONIAL PROBATES ACT, 1892."—CHAPTER 6.

AN Act to provide for the Recognition in the United Kingdom of Probates and Letters of Administration granted in British Possessions. [20th May, 1892.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Her Majesty the Queen may, on being satisfied that the Legislature of any British possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom, direct, by Order in Council, that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the order, apply to that possession, and thereupon, while the order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly.

2. (1.) Where a Court of Probate in a British possession to which this Act applies has granted probate or letters of administration in respect of the estate of a deceased person, the probate or letters so granted may, on being produced to, and a copy thereof deposited with, a Court of Probate in the United Kingdom, be sealed with the seal of that Court, and thereupon shall be of the like force and effect, and have the same operation in the United Kingdom, as if granted by that Court.

(2.) Provided that the Court shall, before sealing a probate or letters of administration under this section, be satisfied—

(a.) That probate duty has been paid in respect of so much (if any) of the estate as is liable to probate duty in the United Kingdom; or

(b.) In the case of letters of administration, that security has been given in a sum sufficient in amount to cover the property (if any) in the United Kingdom to which the letters of administration relate;

and may require such evidence, if any, as it thinks fit as to the domicile of the deceased person.

(3.) The Court may also, if it thinks fit, on the application of any creditor, require, before sealing, that adequate security be given for the payment of debts due from the estate to creditors residing in the United Kingdom.

(4.) For the purposes of this section a duplicate of any probate or letters of administration sealed with the seal of the Court granting the same, or a copy thereof certified as correct by or under the authority of the Court granting the same, shall have the same effect as the original.

(5.) Rules of Court may be made for regulating the procedure and practice, including fees and costs, in Courts of the United Kingdom, on and incidental to an application for sealing a probate or letters of administration granted in a British possession to which this Act applies. Such rules shall, so far as they relate to probate duty, be made with the consent of the Treasury, and, subject to any exceptions and modifications made by such rules, the enactments for the time being in force in relation to probate duty (including the penal provisions thereof) shall apply as if the person who applies for sealing under this section were a person applying for probate or letters of administration.

3. This Act shall extend to authorise the sealing in the United Kingdom of any probate or letters of administration granted by a British Court in a foreign country, in like manner as it authorises the sealing of a probate or letters of administration granted in a British possession to which this Act applies, and the provisions of this Act shall apply accordingly with the necessary modifications.

4. (1.) Every Order in Council made under this Act shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as may be after it is made, and shall be published under the authority of Her Majesty's Stationery Office.

(2.) Her Majesty the Queen in Council may revoke or alter any Order in Council previously made under this Act.

(3.) Where it appears to Her Majesty in Council that the Legislature of part of a British possession has power to make the provision requisite for bringing this Act into operation in that part, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to direct, by Order in Council, that this Act shall apply to that part as if it were a separate British possession, and thereupon, while the order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly.

5. This Act when applied by an Order in Council to a British possession shall, subject to the provisions of the order, apply to probates and letters of administration granted in that possession either before or after the passing of this Act.

6. In this Act—

The expression "Court of Probate" means any Court or authority, by whatever name designated, having jurisdiction in matters of probate, and in Scotland means the Sheriff Court of the County of Edinburgh;

The expressions "probate" and "letters of administration" include confirmation in Scotland, and any instrument having in a British possession the same effect which under English law is given to probate and letters of administration respectively;

The expression "probate duty" includes any duty payable on the value of the estate and effects for which probate or letters of administration is or are granted;

The expression "British Court in a foreign country" means any British Court having jurisdiction out of the Queen's dominions in pursuance of an Order in Council, whether made under any Act or otherwise.

7. This Act may be cited as "The Colonial Probates Act, 1892."

WHEREAS by the first section of "The Colonial Probates Act, 1892," it is enacted as follows: "Her Majesty the Queen may, on being satisfied that the Legislature of any British possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom, direct, by Order in Council, that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the order, apply to that possession, and thereupon, while the order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly":

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the British possessions hereinafter mentioned have made adequate provision for the recognition in those possessions of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

"The Colonial Probates Act, 1892," shall apply to the British possessions hereunder mentioned: Cape of Good Hope, New South Wales, Victoria, New Zealand, Gibraltar, British Honduras.

And the Most Honourable the Marquis of Ripon, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ADDITIONAL RULES AND ORDERS

For the Registrars of the Principal Probate Registry, in Non-contentious Business, for carrying out the Provisions of "The Colonial Probates Act, 1892."

92. APPLICATION to seal a grant of probate or letters of administration, or copy thereof, under "The Colonial Probates Act, 1892," may be made in the Principal Probate Registry by the executor or administrator, or the attorney (lawfully authorised for the purpose) of such executor or administrator, either in person or through a solicitor.

93. Such application must be accompanied by an oath of the executor, administrator, or attorney in the form in the Appendix, or as nearly thereto as the circumstances of the case will allow.

94. The Registrars are to be satisfied that notice of such application has been duly advertised. (Form of advertisement in Appendix.)

95. On application to seal letters of administration the administrator or his attorney shall give bond (in the form set out in the Appendix) to cover the personal estate of the deceased within the jurisdiction of the Court. The same practice as to sureties and amount of penalty in bond is to be observed as on application for letters of administration.

96. Application by a creditor under section 2, subsection (3), of the Colonial Probates Act is to be made by summons before one of the Registrars, supported by an affidavit setting out particulars of the claim.

97. In every case, and especially when the domicile of the deceased at the time of death as sworn to in the affidavit differs from that suggested by the description in the grant, the Registrars may require further evidence as to domicile.

98. If it should appear that the deceased was not at the time of death domiciled within the jurisdiction of the Court from which the grant issued, the seal is not to be affixed unless the grant is such as would have been made by the High Court of Justice in England.

99. The grant (or copy grant) to be sealed and the copy to be deposited in the Registry must include copies of all testamentary papers admitted to probate.

100. When application to seal a probate or letters of administration is made after the lapse of three years from the death of the deceased the reason of the delay is to be certified to the Registrars. Should the certificate be unsatisfactory the Registrars are to require such proof of the alleged cause of delay as they may think fit.

101. Special or limited or temporary grants are not to be sealed without an order of one of the Registrars.

102. Notice of the sealing in England of a grant is to be sent to the Court from which the grant issued.

103. When intimation has been received of the resealing of an English grant, notice of the revocation of, or any alteration in, such grant is to be sent to the Court by whose authority such grant was resealed.

104. The affidavit for inland revenue pursuant to the Customs and Inland Revenue Acts, 1880 and 1881, shall be transmitted to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue as if the person who applied for sealing under "The Colonial Probates Act, 1892," were a person applying for probate or letters of administration.

105. The affidavit for inland revenue and accounts, and schedules forming part thereof, shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury.

(NOTE.—The affidavit to be used will, in fact, be Form A, with some few modifications to suit the circumstances.)

The objects of the said proposed Bill are to enable the Trustees of the will of the Honourable William Robinson, late of Cheviot Hills and Christchurch, Gentleman, deceased, to pay and divide all capital moneys which shall come to or be in their hands, to answer the trusts in favour of the testator's daughters, into five equal parts or shares, and to set apart and constitute such shares into five separate trust estates, and to appoint Trustees of such trust estates respectively, and to define the manner in which such five trust estates respectively shall be dealt with. Also to define the securities upon which the moneys belonging to the said respective trust estates may be invested. Also to provide for the appointment of new Trustees, and to grant to the Trustees of such trust estates respectively such immunities and privileges as are conferred by law on Trustees appointed by deed or will.

Copies of the said Bill will be deposited in the office of the Examiner of Standing Orders on the day after Parliament assembles.
