ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of May, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto have been set apart under the said Act and declared open for lease as a village settlement, and it is expedient to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said lands shall be disposed of:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby fix the terms and conditions on which the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be disposed of by way of lease in perpetuity, and which said terms and conditions are set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and also doth direct that the lands in the said village settlement shall be divided into village-homestead allotments only.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

1. THE lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto are first-class lands, and are divided into village-homestead allotments, open for selection on lease in perpetuity, under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act").

2. The day on which the lands shall be open for selection shall be Wednesday, the nineteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

3. The rental stated in the First Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the land shall be open for selection.

4. Applications for leases shall be made in manner as provided in Part I. of the said Act; and all such applications shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Wellington; and leases will be issued in accordance with the provisions of Part I. aforesaid.

5. Each applicant shall state his or her residence, occupation, and condition in life (namely, whether married or single), and will be required to make the declaration prescribed in Schedule C to the said Act.

6. Each applicant shall also deposit the first half-year's rent, together with the lease and registration fee, as provided in the 63rd section of the said Act.

7. All rents must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first days of January and July in each year, as provided in section 157 of the said Act; and the first half-year's rent is payable as before provided.

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in each lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the said Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations.

9. No lessee shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than four allotments, including that already held, and all such allotments shall be held for his sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the road known as the Pukerimu Road, described in the Schedule below, and which was made by the Governor under the powers contained in the said Act, and has hitherto been a Government road, shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, become a district road.

Powers delegated to the Cust Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of May, 1893.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Cust Domain Board, namely,—

- THOMAS O'FARRELL,
- STEPHEN EARLY,
- WILLIAM CROMIE,
- DAVID THOMAS McCULLOUGH,
- JAMES MCKIE, and
- WILLIAM THOMPSON

(hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at four o'clock p.m., at the Cust Road Board Office, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days'

notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

The above sections, situated in Blocks V., VI., VII., and VIII. of the Lake Ellesmere Reserve, are situated on the eastern shores of the lake. As will be seen by the sale-plan, most of the sections comprise areas both above and below the flood-level of the lake. The lands above flood-level consist generally of light sandy soil, with some areas of better quality, and are covered with tussock, various native grasses, with self-sown rye and other English grasses, and are well known for their grazing capabilities. The area along the Spit, from Section 1 of Block VIII. to Section 6 of Block VII., consists of dry shingly soil, with a mixed and inferior vegetation of native grasses. The area below flood-level comprises generally light sandy soil, carrying a growth of salt-weed, rushes, and in places good native forage-plants, the soil and pasture in the south-eastern part of the area being of superior character, though this portion is more low-lying, and much better than the rest.

It must be distinctly understood that, when the lake and Halswell River are in flood, all the contiguous low-lying lands are subject to inundation, and liable to be under water for long periods. When the lake is low cattle and sheep graze on these low-lying areas, and apparently thrive thereon, provided they have access also to dry pasture.

Selectors, when choosing their future holdings, must bear in mind that, owing to the fact that the lake fluctuates in level about 6ft., the area of dry land on many of the sections is very limited as compared with the flooded area.

The roads of access other than the main road are not formed. The Christchurch-Little River Railway and main road pass through and form frontages to the majority of the sections for a distance of about seven miles, between Rabbit Island and Birdling's Flat. The railway-stations at Rabbit Island, Kaituna, and Birdling's Flat are conveniently situated, and easily accessible; the distance from Christchurch respectively being twenty-one, twenty-six, and thirty miles. But few of the sections are naturally provided with water. Artesian wells have been successfully sunk on the northern flats, and possibly may be on these lands.

Under proper precautions, and with due regard to the fact previously stated, that the lower lands are subject to be under water part of the year, these lands will in the main be found to be well adapted for grazing cattle and for dairy purposes, and in parts for grazing sheep. The Tai Tapu Dairy Factory is about six miles from Rabbit Island.

BY THE QUEEN.—A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-third year of our reign, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint," it is amongst other things enacted, That We, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, shall from time to time by Proclamation determine the design for any coin:

We have therefore thought fit to order that certain of the coins made at our Mint, mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

That every five-pound piece should have for the obverse impression our effigy, with the inscription "Victoria·Dei·Gra·Britt·Regina·Fid·Def·Ind·Imp·", and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every two-pound piece should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every half-sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every crown should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, and on the edge of the piece in raised letters "Decus et Tutamen Anno Regni," the year of the reign being in Roman numeral letters; and that every half-crown should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria·Dei·Gra·Britt·Reg·", and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a shield surmounted by the Royal Crown and surrounded by the collar of the Garter, with the inscription "Fid·Def·Ind·Imp·", together with the words "Half-crown," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every florin should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, and for the reverse two royal sceptres in saltire behind three shields, the shield on the dexter, in bend, bearing the arms of England, that on the sinister, in bend sinister, Scotland, and that in base Ireland; between them the three emblems, the rose, the thistle, and the shamrock, each shield surmounted by the Royal Crown, the Garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Florin·Two Shillings," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every shilling should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, and for the reverse three shields, that on the dexter bearing the arms of England, that on the sinister Scotland, and that in base Ireland, each surmounted by the Royal Crown; between them the three emblems, the rose, the thistle, and the shamrock, the Garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Shilling," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every sixpence should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, and for the reverse the words "Six Pence," placed in the centre of the piece, having an olive branch on one side and an oak branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, with a graining upon the edge; and that certain other pieces of silver money called "the Queen's maundy moneys," of fourpence, threepence, twopence, and one penny, should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled by an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown, with a plain edge.

And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at our Mint, and will be coined there and, so far as relates to gold coins, at our branch mints, in pursuance of orders which we have given for that purpose, We have, therefore, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, and we do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined and to be coined as aforesaid shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that

this our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation in the United Kingdom from the date on which it is published in the *London Gazette*, and in the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria from the date on which it is published by the Governors of those colonies respectively.

Given at our Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, this thirtieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of our reign.

That the licensee shall prevent the destruction or burning of timber or bush on the land comprised in the license:

That the licensee shall prevent the growth or spread of gorse, broom, and sweetbriar on the land comprised in the license, and shall with all reasonable speed remove or cause to be removed all gorse, sweetbriar, broom, or other noxious weeds or plants, as may be directed by the Commissioner:

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1893. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1893. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1893.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education.
