

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this eighteenth day of April, 1893.

THE HONOURABLE W. P. REEVES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

THEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for a public work authorised to be constructed by the Government, to wit, the construc-tion of beacons on which leading-lights for the Port of Gis-

tion of beacons on which leading-lights for the Port of Gis-borne are to be erected: And whereas the said land is held or occupied by Native owners under a title which is not derived from the Crown: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and the thirteenth section of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the public work above mentioned shall be constructed on the land described in general terms in the Schedule hereto. land described in general terms in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### BEACON-SITE AT POVERTY BAY.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, situated in Block VII., Turanganui Survey District, containing by admeasurement 3 roods 1 perch, more or less, being a strip admeasurement 3 roods 1 perch, more or less, being a strip of land 50 links wide, the centre-line of which commences at a point in Wai-o-hi-harore No. 1 Block distant 9691 links north and 5541 links west of Trig. #### GLASGOW, Governor.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Land Act, 1892," the Governor is empowered to make, alter, or revoke rules, regulations, and orders for, among other things, the care, management, and protection in every manner of all commonages :

And whereas the Land Board of the Land District of Otago, in accordance with section one hundred and sixteen of the said Act, has thought fit to fix the terms and condi-

of the said Act, has thought it to fix the terms and condi-tions hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority hereinbefore mentioned, I, David, Earl of Glas-gow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following make results and and the following make the gow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following rules, regulations, and orders for the care and management of the several commonages of Clyde and Cromwell described in the First Schedule hereto, and do hereby impose the rents to be paid as hereinafter provided,

hereby impose the rents to be pair as hereinater provided, that is to say:— 1. The words "great cattle" shall be construed to mean and include cattle, horses, mules, and asses, male or female, and their offspring above six months of age; and the words "small cattle" shall be construed to mean sheep, male and female, and their offspring above the age of six months. 2. Persons may run great cattle or small cattle upon such of the lands respectively described in the First Schedule as may be mentioned in the depasturing license, to be obtained as hereinafter provided.

may be included in the depasting incense, to be obtained as hereinafter provided. 3. Persons desirous of obtaining a depasturing license must lodge with the Ranger an application in writing in the form or to the effect contained in the Second Schedule hereto. and deposit therewith the license-fee payable hereunder. If such application be refused the fee shall be refunded to the applicant. 4. The number of cattle to be depastured shall be men-

tioned in the license, and the rent to be paid in respect of such license shall be calculated upon the following scale, that is to say :s. d.

For every head of great cattle mentioned in the license 10 0

For every head of small cattle mentioned in the license 2 6

license ... 2 6 Every such license shall be in the form or to the effect contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall expire on the 30th June in every year, when such license may be renewed in accordance with the foregoing provisions. Every license shall be granted subject to the conditions herein set forth, and shall be issued and signed by the Com-missioner of Crown Lands. 5. All cattle depastured must be branded, and the brand and a description of the cattle must be registered with the Banger. The Ranger shall issue a certificate of regis-

Ranger. The Ranger shall issue a certificate of regis-tration in such form as he thinks fit, and the fee for every such certificate shall be 1s. But if the brand is regis-tered with the application no further registration shall be necessary.

necessary. 6. No great cattle or small cattle suffering from any disease shall be depastured upon nor shall any pigs or goats be allowed to trespass or be at large upon or within the lands described in the First Schedule. No bull, ram, or stallion shall be depastured without the express permission in writing of the Commissioner; and any person or persons committing a breach of this provision shall be liable to any penalty prescribed by or under "The Land Act, 1892." or under any other law or statute for the time being in force, and applicable to the case.

7. If any licensee shall at any time commit or suffer a breach of the conditions or terms upon which the license is granted, as the same are herein set forth, the Commissioner

granted, as the same are herein set forth, the Commissioner may on such evidence as he thinks fit cancel and determine the license then held by such licensee, and he shall have no claim to any refund or allowance in respect thereof. 8. No person shall remove from beyond the boundary of the land described in the First Schedule any cattle other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall have authority from the Ranger, under a penalty not exceeding 45 exceeding £5.

9. If any person not being licensed as aforesaid shall depasture any great cattle or small cattle upon the lands described in the First Schedule, or either of them, or being so licensed shall depasture on such lands or either of them as so licensed shall depasture on such lands or either of them as aforesaid a greater number of such cattle than shall have been apportioned to him, every such person shall be liable to any provision of "The Land Act, 1892," that may be applicable to such a case, and to any penalty or disability thereby im-posed in respect of unlawful occupation of Crown lands. 10. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to interfere with the powers or duties of the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the district in which the lands described in the First Schedule are situated, whether under "The Land Act, 1892," or under any other law or statute for the time heing in forme:

GLASGOW, Governor. W HEREAS by the two hundred and thirty-fifth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned : And whereas by the two hundred and thirty-fifth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said two hundred and thirty-fifth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette* : And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notification of which was published in the *Gazette* specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule: Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

"(d.) The said green and red side-lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least 3ft. forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow " bow.

"Article 15.—If two ships under steam are meeting end-on, or nearly end-on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard, so that each may pass on the port side of the other. This article only applies to cases where ships are meeting end-on, or nearly end-on, in such a manner as to involve risk of collision, and does not apply to two ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses, pass clear of each other. The only cases to which it does apply are when each of the two ships is end-on, or nearly end-on, to the other—in other words, to cases in which by day each ship sees the masts of the other in a line, or nearly in a line, with her own, and by night to cases in which each ship is in such a position as to see both the side-lights of the other. The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in May were 239, against 173 in April, an increase of 66. The deaths amounted to 78, against 113 in April, a decrease of 35. There were 9 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 males of 74, 75, and 79, and one female of 74 died at Auckland; 1 male of 72 at Wellington; 1 male of 75 at Christchurch; 2 males of 65 and 69, and one female of 71, at Dunedin.

The death-rates for May at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch were lower than for April, but at Dunedin the rate was somewhat higher for the later month. Of the rates at these towns Dunedin had the highest, 0.86 per 1,000 persons living. At Auckland the rate was 0.83 per 1,000; at Wellington, 0.68; and at Christchurch, 0.54. The rates in May of the year 1892 were all considerably higher, being—Auckland, 1.29; Wellington, 1.22; Christchurch, 1.23; and Dunedin, 1.03. Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The number of deaths in May at the four towns was 19, or 24.36 per cent. of the whole mortality. In April there were 13 deaths, and the proportion of the total was only 11.50 per cent. Ten of the deaths in May were at Auckland, 3 at Wellington, and 6 at Dunedin, while at Christchurch there were no deaths from this class of disease. Measles caused 9 and diphtheria 1 of the 10 deaths at Auckland. Diphtheria was also fatal at Wellington in one case, while the other 2 deaths at this town were from typhoid fever and diarrheea. From 1887 until the month of May last there were no deaths from measles, the others being from influenza and diarrheea. From 1887 until the month of May last there were no deaths from this cause. Constitutional Diseases.—The total number of deaths fell from 25 in April to 13 in May. Local Diseases.—The comparison with April shows only 35 deaths in May against 47 in the previous month. Diseases of the respiratory system numbered 8, including 3 from laryngitis and 2 from bronchitis. There were 9 deaths from diseases of the digestive system.

Violent Deaths.—The mortality is unusually small, comprising the accidental death of a child by burning, and the suicide of an adult male by shooting himself with a revolver. The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maoris under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, and are open to all Maoris under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have not been pupils at Te Aute or St. Stephen's, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the In-spector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1893. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified In the Native Schools Code, 1893. Calificates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1893. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1893.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them-selves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secre-tary for Education.
