Land available for Selection by the Midland Railway Company set apart for Mining Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing nine thousand acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

SCHEDULE.
Block XCIII.

ALL that area in the Land District of Nelson, situated in the Te Miko and Waiwhero Survey Districts respectively, and containing 9,000 acres, more or less. Bounded by a line commencing at a point on the west coast intersected by the northern boundary-line of Block II., Te Miko Survey District, and proceeding thence along the said boundary-line and the northern boundary-line of Block XIII., Waiwhero District, to a point on the latter distant 1½ miles from the north-eastern corner thereof; thence along a right line to Trig. Station L, Waiwhero; thence easterly and southerly along the summit of the Paparoa Range to Trig. Station K, Waiwhero; thence along a right line drawn between that

trig. station and Trig. Station H, Cobden, to its intersection with the eastern boundary-line of the Grey Coalfield Reserve; thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said reserve to the sea-coast; and thence northerly along the sea-coast to the point of commencement: excepting and excluding from the above-described area all freehold and leasehold lands and reserves.

Licensing Districts defined.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same: And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the Districts of Norsewood and Ruataniwha:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Licensing Districts of Norsewood and Ruataniwha, which shall, from and after the first day of July, be those described in the Schedule hereto.

Lands withdrawn from State Forests.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto is a State forest under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said land is now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said land, and a statement of the reasons why it is no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable David, Earl of Glasgow, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by "The New Zealand State Forests Act Amendment Act, 1888," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the Proclamation specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, in so far as it relates to the land described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the land described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

Land vested in the Public Trustee for the Ngatirangiwehewehi Tribe.

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of June, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was permanently reserved for the use of the Ngatirangiwehewehi Tribe, under the provisions of the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," on the fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and the said land still remains vested in the Crown for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to vest the said land in the Public Trustee, under the powers hereinafter mentioned, upon the trusts and for the purposes hereinafter particularly set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the fifteenth section of "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby vest the land so permanently reserved as aforesaid, and which is described in the Schedule hereto, in the Public Trustee, who shall forthwith enter upon and take possession thereof for the purposes of this Order in Council, to hold the said land unto the Public Trustee and his successors from the day of the date of this Order in Council in trust for the use and benefit of the several persons who now are or hereafter may be members of the tribe of aboriginal natives of New Zealand known as the Ngatirangiwehewehi Tribe, with power to lease the said land, or any part thereof, for any term not exceeding twenty-one years in possession, and with or without a right of renewal for a like or any shorter period, subject to a new assessment of rent at every such renewal, and subject also to such conditions and covenants as the Public Trustee and his successors think fit on the original or any subsequent letting, including in every case a right to the lessee to have valuation for his improvements secured to him, the same to be ascertained and paid as shall be provided in the lease. And it is hereby declared that every lease shall be disposed of by public auction or public tender, after due notification thereof has been given by advertisement in a newspaper circulating at Tauranga; that the rent to be reserved shall be the best improved rent obtainable at the time; and that no fine, premium, or foregift shall in any case be taken upon any lease: and also that the rents, issues, and profits from time to time derived or received by the Public Trustee and his successors from the said land shall be paid to any person or persons who may from time to time be appointed by the Native Land Court to receive the same or any part thereof; and the receipt or receipts in writing of any such person or persons for the moneys therein expressed to be received shall be a good discharge to the Public Trustee and his successors. And, lastly, it is hereby declared that, subject as aforesaid, the said land is hereby vested in the Public Trustee and his successors, subject to all trusts now attaching to the said land, and also subject to the provisions of "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," and all Acts in force amending the same; and also to all the provisions of "The Native Reserves Act, 1882," and the Acts in force amending the same, so far as applicable and not inconsistent with the several trusts hereby declared and defined.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of June, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Rabbit Nuisance Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1886" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"),

it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, alter and redefine the boundaries of any district constituted under the said Act: And whereas the district known as "The Hawke's Bay Rabbit District" has been constituted under the said Act, and it appears expedient to alter the boundaries of the same in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Hawke's Bay Rabbit District, so constituted as aforesaid, and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said district shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the name of the said district, and the Board of Trustees acting for such district, shall continue as at present existing, subject to the provisions of the said Act; and, further, that this Order in Council shall take effect on and after the twenty-seventh day of June, 1893.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that portion of the Colony of New Zealand, comprising the Counties of Hawke's Bay, Waipawa, and Patangata, together with that portion of the County of Wairoa, bounded as follows, viz.: Commencing at Te Ngaru; thence by the sea northward to the mouth of the Mohaka River; thence by the Mohaka River to its intersection with the south boundary of the Wairoa County; thence by said county-boundary to the point of commencement.

Place where Miners' Rights and Business Licenses may be issued.

Regulations under "The Friendly Societies Act, 1882," and its Amendments.

GLASGOW, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him in this behalf by "The Friendly Societies Act, 1882," and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth revoke the regulations numbered seventeen and eighteen of the regulations made under the said Act on the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, under the heading "Juvenile Societies," and in lieu thereof doth hereby make and prescribe the following regulations, viz.:—

Juvenile Societies.

Sec. 13 (10).

17. Societies and branches consisting wholly of members between three and twenty-one years of age may be registered provided they are—

- (a.) In connection with some institution or school, and managed by the managers or teachers thereof, or by a committee appointed wholly or partly by such managers or teachers;
- (b.) In connection with some society registered under the Act, or a branch of any such society, and managed by the committee or officers of such society or branch, or by persons appointed wholly or partly by them.

18. The rules of every such society or branch shall contain provisions for the following matters in addition to those required in the case of societies by Schedule I. of the Act and Form No. 1 to these regulations, and in the case of branches by Regulation 50:—

- (1.) Whether or not parents and guardians of members shall be entitled to be present and vote at meetings of the society, and to perform acts of membership on behalf of their children.
- (2.) The giving of security by the treasurer.
- (3.) The investment of the funds in a savings-bank, or in Government or real securities, but not otherwise.
- (4.) The acceptance of a member into a registered society or branch, or the payment to him of a share of the accumulated funds, if any, on his attaining the age of sixteen years or upwards.

The forms annexed to Regulations 1 to 63 may be modified, by authority of the Registrar, to suit their application to juvenile societies or branches.

Rules and Regulations of the Printing and Stationery Department.

Wellington, 26th June, 1893.

THE following rules and regulations in connection with the Printing and Stationery Department have been approved by the Government.

A. J. CADMAN.

ATTENDANCE.

1. THE hours of attendance shall be from 8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., with an interval of one hour for dinner, except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 8.30 a.m. to 1 p.m. continuously. If during the parliamentary session it be found necessary to organize a staff of night-hands, the hours of attendance for such staff shall be from 6 p.m. to 2 a.m., one hour being allowed for supper; except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 1.30 to 5 p.m. An additional remuneration of 10s. per week shall be paid to members of the night staff. The hours of attendance for the clerical branch shall be the same as those observed in the Government Buildings.

2. Punctual attendance must be strictly observed, and continuance at work until the signal is given to cease. Time-keepers of the several branches are required carefully to note late arrivals and absentees, and to report them to the Superintending Overseer every morning by ten o'clock.

OVERTIME.

3. If at any time attendance should be required earlier in the morning or later at night than usual, the extra time will be paid for as overtime, according to the scale set forth in Schedule A hereto.

ABSENCE.

4. Any permanent employé who shall absent himself from the office during working-hours owing to any cause other than sickness must, not later than the following day, when feasible, report to his overseer, in writing or otherwise, the cause of his absence; and a record of the time lost shall be entered, for subsequent deduction from his salary, in a book to be kept for the purpose.

Should the alleged cause of absence be deemed frivolous, or should any employé be frequently absent without sufficient cause, it shall be the duty of the overseer to report the matter, through the Superintending Overseer, to the Government Printer, who may admonish or, in extreme cases, disrate the offender.

If in any case absence be caused by sickness, and extend beyond two days, the employé must apply for sick leave, and forward a medical certificate, at the earliest opportunity.

5. Persons wishing to interview any of the employés during hours of attendance shall first communicate with either the Government Printer or the Superintending Overseer, either of whom may grant permission, unless in his opinion the work of the department is likely to be unduly interfered with. It shall be the duty of the overseer of any branch to see that the visits of strangers are neither too frequent nor unduly prolonged.

SICKNESS.

6. In cases of sickness of members of the permanent staff, the Government Printer may, on receiving a certificate signed by a legally-qualified medical practitioner, specifying the ailment, and declaring the inability of any person to discharge his duties, grant to such person during the continuance of such sickness, but not for a longer period than three months, sick pay at the follow-

ing rate: For the first month, full salary; after the first month, half-salary. In the event of prolonged sickness, the Government Printer may submit such special case for the consideration of the Minister having control of the department.

7. Any person guilty of practising imposition under the plea of sickness shall be subject to instant dismissal, disratment in rank, or reduction in salary, as the Minister may determine.

HOLIDAYS.

8. All public holidays will be granted to the permanent staff.

9. Should the attendance of a portion of the staff be necessary on holidays, an equal amount of time will be allowed for such attendance. Double pay will be allowed for working on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and Christmas Day.

APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

10. Applications by permanent employés for leave of absence shall in all cases be made in writing by or through the Government Printer to the Minister of the department, and shall be accompanied by a statement showing the total length of absence of the employé from duty, from all causes, during the previous part of the same year. The Government Printer shall also, in all cases of application for leave of absence by any employé under him, make a special report (1) as to the general conduct of the employé during the previous portion of the year, and (2) as to the regularity or irregularity of attendance by the employé for the same period during the hours of attendance prescribed by the first regulation. But overseers, and readers on the permanent staff, shall be entitled without diminution of salary to two weeks' leave of absence in each year, at such time as the Government Printer may consider convenient.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

11. Any permanent employé absent from the office without such application having been made and granted shall, except in case of sudden illness, or other emergency as mentioned in section 4, be deemed to be absent without leave.

12. On application, leave of absence may be granted by the Minister of the department, on the recommendation of the Government Printer, to overseers and readers for a period not exceeding three months on full pay, and to others permanently employed for a period not exceeding two months on full pay, after ten years' continuous service in the department.

13. In cases of pressing necessity leave of absence may be granted for one week without deduction of salary to any person permanently employed, provided the circumstances under which the request is made are stated in writing, and are considered sufficient to justify the request being granted.

CLASSIFICATION, PROMOTION, AND DISRATING.

14. The officers permanently employed in the Printing and Stationery Department shall be grouped under three heads, termed the "General," "Clerical," and "Mechanical" divisions, as set forth in Schedule C; and such officers shall, subject to the annual Appropriation Act, be entitled to be paid severally the annual increases of salary set forth therein.

15. Every accrued increase of salary shall date from the first day of the financial year during which such increases may be voted by Parliament; but, in the case of promotion to a higher position, the increase shall take effect on the day of promotion.

16. It shall be the duty of the Superintending Overseer, and of the overseers of the general, clerical, and mechanical divisions respectively, to furnish a report half-yearly, through the Government Printer, to the Minister in charge of the department, showing the efficiency, diligence, regularity of attendance, and punctuality of each officer under his control. And it shall also be the duty of the overseer in charge of the time workers on the temporary staff to report annually, in like manner, on the character and ability of at least three of the above staff who are, in his opinion, the best qualified for and most deserving of promotion to the permanent staff.

17. It shall be the duty of the Government Printer half-yearly to furnish the Minister in charge of the department with a report on each of the overseers of the general, clerical, and mechanical divisions, showing their efficiency, promptness in producing work (especially at session-time), care as against extravagance, and quoting instances of delay, neglect, &c.

18. Vacancies in the respective divisions shall, where practicable, be filled by promotion from the division next below that in which the vacancy occurs. In selecting a person to fill such vacancy, fitness and merit shall be the first consideration, and seniority shall be the next consideration; but in cases of equal or nearly equal merit the senior officer shall take precedence. Promotion to the permanent staff shall be made from the ranks of the time workers on the temporary staff.

19. In order to give effect as fully as possible to the foregoing rule, the question of promotion shall be decided by the Government Printer on the half-yearly reports of the overseer of the department in which the vacancy occurs. In the event of any member of the division in which a vacancy occurs feeling aggrieved at the manner in which the vacancy has been filled, he may appeal to the Minister in charge of the department, in whose hands shall rest the definite decision on the question. In the event of a vacancy in the reading staff, such vacancy shall be filled by the Government Printer on the recommendation of the permanent readers.

20. Should any member of the permanent staff be guilty of negligence or insubordination, it shall be the duty of his overseer to admonish him; but, should such negligence or insubordination be repeated, it shall be the duty of the overseer (through the Superintending Overseer) to report the matter to the Government Printer, who may disrate or, in extreme cases, dismiss the offender. Any member of the permanent staff who shall have been reported by the Superintending Overseer to the Government Printer for negligence, insubordination, or other misconduct shall not receive for the following year the accrued increase of salary to which he would otherwise have been entitled under Rule 14.

21. In all cases of disrating merely, the disrated employé shall take lowest rank in the class or grade to which reduced; but upon subsequent good conduct, extending over a period of twelve months, shall be eligible for promotion in turn.

CONFIDENTIAL WORK.

22. To insure due secrecy, Ministerial statements and memoranda, Customs-tariff alterations, policy measures, and all work of a strictly confidential character shall, where practicable, be intrusted only to members of the permanent staff. Should the extent or urgency of the work, however, require a wider distribution, it shall be the duty of the overseers to confine it to as few hands as possible.

23. Any employé who may reasonably be suspected of divulging information of a confidential nature shall be suspended, and should proof be forthcoming he shall be at once dismissed by the Government Printer.

PERMANENT STAFF.

24. The permanent staff shall comprise all employés whose names shall appear in a register to be called "The Staff Register," which shall contain a record of date of appointment, age, absences, gratuities, and any other matters that may be deemed necessary.

TEMPORARY STAFF.

25. The temporary staff of compositors shall comprise all those not included in the permanent staff, and may be employed either on piece or time work. Men for time-work shall be selected, on the recommendation of the overseer in charge, on the ground of general proficiency.

26. Temporary hands of less than three months' standing will be under engagement by the day, terminable without notice on either side; all others shall be subject to one week's notice on either side. Temporary hands will have no claim for payment for holidays that may occur during the time they are employed, unless engaged in the office for two consecutive months immediately preceding such holiday.

27. The rates of remuneration for temporary compositors shall be those set forth in Schedule B hereto, which, however, may be altered from time to time as may be deemed expedient.

APPRENTICES.

28. Applicants for employment as apprentices must not be under fourteen years of age, and must be of sound bodily health and of good character, and shall have passed an examination equal to that of the Fourth Standard under the Education Act.

29. The period of apprenticeship shall be six years, and the rates of wages shall be as follow:—

30. Apprentices will be placed in the branches for which they seem best adapted. Those selected for the composing branch shall pass at least one year in the reading-room prior to being transferred to the composing-room; but in no case shall more than one year passed in the reading-room be reckoned as part of the period of apprenticeship.

31. Apprentices in all branches who shall have served their full term satisfactorily shall be entitled to one year's employment at the rate of pay of temporary employés, and shall thereafter form part of the temporary staff, and be entitled to the privileges of temporary hands of two years' standing.

32. In the case of apprentices, machine-boys, assistants, and female employés two weeks' leave of absence on full pay will be granted annually to a number not exceeding ten of the males and females respectively, these to be selected in accordance with the half-yearly reports furnished by the overseer in charge.

FEMALE SEWERS AND FOLDERS.

33. Candidates for employment must not be under fourteen years of age, and must be in sound bodily health and of good character.

34. Females will be taken for the first three months on probation, at 5s. per week. Should they prove themselves capable and industrious, they will then receive the following rates of wages:—

After the fourth year they will be placed on pay as full hands, at wages ranging from £1 to £1 5s. per week, in accordance with nature of work and ability.

ALTERATION IN REGULATIONS.

35. All rules or regulations may, subject to the approval of the Minister, be altered or amended from time to time as occasion may require.

BY-LAWS.

36. The Government Printer shall have power, subject to the Minister's approval, to make, alter, or amend by-laws, not being inconsistent with these rules, for the internal regulation and discipline of the department, and to inflict fines or temporarily suspend employes from duty for breach of such by-laws. All fines to be deducted from the wages of the offender. In cases of suspension from duty, report shall be made to the Minister of the department, with the necessary recommendation as to the confirmation or otherwise of such suspension.

37. All moneys received from fines shall be placed by the Government Printer in a common fund to be applied towards the expenses in connection with the annual picnic held by the employes.

The ordinary rate for composition, either solid or leaded, shall be 1s. 1d. per 1,000 ens. A special rate of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 ens will be allowed on works of a technical or scientific character; and a rate of 1s. 4d. per 1,000 ens for *Hansard*.
