Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1893. Candidates for the questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1893. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1893. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them-selves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next. Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding insti-tutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secre-tary for Education.
