Land available for Selection by the Midland Railway Company set apart for Mining Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not in the aggregate exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing ten thousand acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

BLOCK XCVII.

ALL that area in the Land District of Nelson, situated in the Waiwhero and Punakaiki Survey Districts respectively, and containing 10,000 acres, more or less. Bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of Punakaiki or Deadman's Creek on the west coast, and proceeding thence along the southern bank of the said creek to its confluence with the

left-hand branch; thence along the said left-hand branch stream to a point on the same intersected by the eastern boundary-line of Block II., Waiwhero Survey District; thence along that boundary-line to the south-eastern corner of the said block; thence along the southern boundary-lines of Blocks II. and I., Waiwhero Survey District, to the west coast; and thence northerly along the coast to the point of commencement: excepting and excluding all freehold and leasehold lands and reserves.

Licensing Trustees for the Akaroa Boating Club to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Akaroa Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of August, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Akaroa Boating Club, of Akaroa (hereinafter called "the club"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license, under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore in Akaroa Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a boat-shed and slip; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1860 and 1861), showing the place where it is intended to erect such boat-shed and slip, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the boat-shed and slip: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to Herbert Onslow Clarke, of Akaroa, solicitor, and Beilby Barker, of Akaroa, coachdriver, as trustees for the club, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the club as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the said trustees for the club to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan marked M.D. 1860 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boat-shed and slip, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said trustees for the club upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such boat-shed and slip, which is shown, coloured green, on the plan marked M.D. 1860, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the said trustees for the club shall, on demand being made, pay to the Minister an annual sum of one shilling, within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

4. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-shed and slip without payment.

5. The said trustees for the club shall complete the erection of the said boat-shed in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1861, within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The said trustees for the club shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-shed and slip in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said boat-shed and slip and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the said trustees for the club or either of them a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-shed or slip, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the said trustees for the club to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said trustees for the club shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may at any time be resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said trustees for the club three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the said trustees for the club or either of them.

11. The said trustees for the club shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-shed and slip, or either of them, may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part, or the part of the club.

12. In case the said trustees for the club shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed and slip for the purposes aforesaid; or
- (3.) In case the club be in any manner wound up or dissolved,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the said trustees for the club or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said trustees and to the club, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Licensing Messrs. R. and J. Mitchelson to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Kaipara Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of August, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Messrs. Richard and John Mitchelson, of

Kaipara, timber merchants, trading there under the style or firm of R. and J. Mitchelson (hereinafter called the "licensees"), have applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore, and of the land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, at Aoroa, on the Wairoa River, Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain two wharves thereon; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," have deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1847 and 1859), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the wharves: And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of the purpose for which the said foreshore and land below low-water mark are to be occupied: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensees under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 1847 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said two wharves, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark occupied by the said two wharves as shown on plan marked M.D. 1847.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of five pounds, payable on the first day of August, dating from the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharves, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharves without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharves in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharves and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves, requiring them within a reasonable time, to be therein described, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara, by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharves or either of them may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

13. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves or either of them for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto was permanently reserved for a site for an Athenæum by notification in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, No. 109: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient that the said land should be vested in the Winton Borough Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," doth hereby declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the reserve mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and burgesses of the Borough of Winton, in trust, for a site for an Athenæum, and such reserve shall be under the control and management of the Corporation of the said borough.

His Excellency the Governor having been pleased, under the provisions of the above-recited Act, to appoint me to ascertain the title of certain Natives to a piece of land situate at Te Pupuke, in the County of Whangaroa, and containing 3 acres 1 rood, appropriated by them as a school-site, I respectfully beg to report,—

1. I gave notice in the *Northern Luminary* newspaper that I would hold an inquiry at the Courthouse, Whangaroa, on the 19th day of July, 1893, and which inquiry I subsequently postponed till Wednesday, the 26th day of July, 1893. I caused copies of the same to be forwarded to the several chiefs in the Whangaroa district.

2. On Wednesday, the 26th day of July instant, I held the inquiry notified at the Courthouse, Whangaroa, where I met the principal chiefs of the Tahawai Hapu (a section of Ngapuhi Tribe). I produced the plan of the proposed site, and explained to the Natives present the provisions of the above-recited Act.

3. Mita Hape, grandson of the late chief Ururoa, produced a letter from his uncle, Paora Putete Ururoa, the chief of the hapu Te Tahawai, consenting to the appropriation of the land specified in the survey plan as a school-site. Mita Hape then addressed the people assembled, as well as Mio Tuāauru and Paora Putete the younger.

It was unanimously agreed that the land set forth in the boundaries shown on the plan was the property of the hapu Te Tahawai, and that it should be set apart for a school-site. And I certify that, after due investigation, I am satisfied as to the ownership of the land, and that the owners consent to set it apart for a school-site, in accordance with the above-recited Act.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1893. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1893. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1893.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education.
