3. By striking out the word "known," in line 16, and inserting in place thereof the words "of the class commonly termed."

4. By striking out the word "as," in line 16.

5. By substituting the word "afterwards" for the word "finally," in line 20.

6. By striking out the words "the desired fineness," in lines 20 and 21, and inserting in place thereof the words "a powder."

7. By substituting the words "crude stuff from the first reduction" for the words "powder then obtained," in line 21.

8. By substituting the words "during subsequent reductions" for the word "then," in line 23.

9. By inserting between the words "being" and "eliminated," in line 25, the word "gradually."

10. By crossing out the words "improved facing" in line 30.

11. By substituting the words "for facing" for the word "to," in line 31.

12. By substituting a comma for the full-stop after the word "core," in line 33, inserting after the comma the word "and," and altering the "T" of the word beginning the next sentence into a small "t."

13. By substituting a full-stop for the comma after the word "water," in line 35, crossing out the following word, "and," and changing the small "t" at the beginning of the next word into a capital "T."

14. By inserting the words "of which," between the words "result" and "will," in line 35.

15. By substituting the words "In the preparation of sand-moulds for" for the words "The application to moulds used in"; inserting the words "the application of such moulds as a facing" before the words "of a natural"; striking out the words "substance or," and substituting the words "commonly termed" for the words "known as"—all in the present claim, which it is desired to number "1."

16. By the addition of a second claim as follows, namely:—

"2. In the preparation of the cores for moulds used in the casting of metals, the combination with clay or other suitable material of a substance obtained from a mineral known as soapstone, steartite, or steatite, such cores being afterwards, before use, washed over with a coating of the same substance substantially as herein described, and for the purpose indicated."

The applicant states as his reasons for the request, "I am advised that my invention is not sufficiently described in the original specification."
