WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company with contains a vectories. defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for bona fide mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but and which lands shall from time to thine be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not in the aggregate exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for bonâ fide mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing eight thousand nine hundred and sixty acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for bonā fide mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

That the Mauku Road District be divided into three wards, under the names of the Waiau Ward, the West Mauku Ward, and the Patumahoe Ward, with the following

The Waiau Ward.—That portion of the Mauku Road District bounded towards the north generally by the Manukau Harbour; towards the east generally by the south-western boundary of the Parish of Karaka from Sutton's Creek to the eastern corner of Lot 12 of a subdivision into allotments

boundary of the Parish of Karaka from Sutton's Creek to the eastern corner of Lot 12 of a subdivision into allotments of original Allotment 11, Parish of Waiau; towards the south generally by the centre of the Waiuku and Drury Roads to the southern corner of Allotment 20 of the same parish; towards the west generally by the Mauku River, the Taihiki Estuary, and the Waiuku Estuary to the Manukau Harbour, the place of commencement.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. The senior scholarship is offered for competition among Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1893. Candidates for the junior scholarships will be examined in the subjects specified for Standard IV. in the Native Schools Code, 1893. The questions will, however, be more difficult than those set for the standard examinations. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1893. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, and writes to the Ingressor of Native Schools. Education

Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place

place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 456, against 433 in July, an increase of 23. The deaths in August were 249, a decrease of 7 on the number in July. Of the total deaths, males contributed 147; females, 102. One hundred and fourteen of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 45.78 per cent. of the whole number; 70 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in August were 253, against 223 in July, an increase of 30. The deaths amounted to 141, against 124 in July, an increase of 17. There were 14 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 men of 68, 72, and 86, and 3 women of 70, 76, and 78, died at Auckland; 1 man of 72, and 2 women of 69 and 74, at Wellington; 1 man of 74, and 1 woman of 86, at Christchurch; 2 men of 67 and 68, and 1 woman of 81, at Dunedin.

The death-rates per 1,000 persons living at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch for August were higher than those for the preceding month, but at Dunedin the rate was lower. Comparing with August, 1892, similar results are found:—

From the above figures it will be seen that the death-rate at Christchurch was the highest of those for the four cities in August last. Wellington takes the second place, followed by Auckland, and lastly by Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The total number of deaths at the four towns in August was 33, being the same number as in July; but the proportion per cent. of deaths from all causes fell from 26.61 in July to 23.40 in August. The mortality was greatest at Wellington, where there were 17 deaths, of which 14 were from measles. The deaths at Christchurch were 11, all from measles. At Auckland there were 5 deaths, including 1 from measles. At Dunedin there were no deaths from zymotic diseases during the month, a remarkable circumstance.

Parasitic Diseases.—A death from hydatid disease is observed at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths in August numbered 29, against 15 in July. Tubercular complaints contributed no less than 21 deaths to the total for last month, while 6 deaths are recorded from cancer.

Local Diseases.—From this class of disease the deaths were 59, against 62 in July. Diseases of the respiratory organs caused 24 deaths, including 21 from pneumonia and bronchitis, nine of which were at Wellington. Deaths from diseases of the nervous system amounted to 16, including 6 of children from convulsions. There were 8 deaths from heart-disease, and 8 from diseases of the digestive system.

Violent Deaths.—The accidental deaths included 2 of adult males by fracture (one being from a fall out of a window), 1 caused by the fall of a tree, 1 by drowning, and 1 from tetanus, being the result of wounds received in a carriage accident. There was 1 case of suicide—by poison.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
