WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Kawatiri Rowing Club, of Westport (hereinafter called "the club"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license, under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore in Westport Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a boat-shed; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine

Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1867), showing the place where it is intended to erect such boat-shed, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the boat-shed: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to John Joseph Moynihan, of Westport, Solicitor, John Marris, of Westport, Sawmiller, and Alfred Wright, of Westport, Medical Practitioner, as trustees for the club, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the club as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the said trustees for the club to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated in green colour on the plan marked M.D. 1867 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boat-shed, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said trustees for the club upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such boat-shed, which is shown, coloured green, on the plan marked M.D. 1867, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the said trustees for the club shall, on demand being made, pay to the Minister an annual sum of one shilling, dating from the day of the date of this Order in Council.

4. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-shed without payment.

5. The said trustees for the club shall complete the erection of the said boat-shed in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1867, within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The said trustees for the club shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-shed in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said boat-shed and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the said trustees for the club or either of them a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-shed, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the said trustees for the club to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said trustees for the club shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may at any time be resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said trustees for the club one calendar month's previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the said trustees for the club or either of them.

11. The said trustees for the club shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-shed may cause any vessel or

boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part, or the part of the club.

12. In case the said trustees for the club shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed for the purposes aforesaid; or
- (3.) In case the club be in any manner wound up or dissolved,

The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for five years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

4. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on demand, pay to the Minister an annual sum of one shilling during the continuance of the license hereby granted.

5. Every person shall at all reasonable times have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom, upon payment of the dues payable in like cases and charged for the time being on the Foxton Railway Wharf; and all such dues shall be collected by the licensee, and shall be paid by the licensee as collected from time to time, along with the dues payable on goods and merchandise the property of the licensee, to the New Zealand Railway Commissioners: Such dues shall be collected and payments made to the Commissioners within one week from the date that such dues shall become due.

6. The Governor, his staff and servants, and all officers in the Government service or employ, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

7. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

8. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law or regulation relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee one calendar month's previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy;
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause four of these conditions on the same being duly demanded; or
- (5.) Fail to pay the dues payable under clause five within the period specified therein:

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges hereby granted to the licensee, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the wharf by the licensee under the conditions hereinbefore set forth shall be deemed to be an acceptance by such licensee of all such conditions, and to be an agreement on the part of the licensee to observe the same.
