A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for bonâ fide mining purposes and the several pur-poses connected therewith or incidental or conducive theretor, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and required for bond file limits purposes and be or the reto, poses connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for bonâ fida mining purposes and the several purposes connected there-with, and the said lands are comprised in one block, con-taining four thousand three hundred and twenty acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exer-cise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this be-half under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or other-wise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land

A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION. TN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage dis-tricts known as the Matakana and Waipukurau Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow whereof shall be as follow :

#### MATAKANA DISTRICT.

MATAKANA DISTRICT. All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by a right line from the southernmost corner of Section No. 64, Arai Parish, to the north-western corner of Section No. 57, Pakiri Parish; thence by the last-mentioned section, the Wangarapo Stream, and Sections Nos. 19, 18, 15, 13, 76, 73, 75, and 77, Pakiri Parish; thence towards the north generally by the last-mentioned section, No. 78, the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 101, by Section No. 111, by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of the last-men-tioned section, by Sections Nos. 110, 104, a road-line, and Sec-tions Nos. 67, 68, 121, and 120, Omaha Parish; towards the east generally by the sea; and towards the south-west gene-rally by the Mahurangi and Hoteo Parishes, by Section No. 2, Block XII., Pakiri Survey District, and Sections Nos. 2 and 1, Block VIII., of the said survey district to the road intersecting the last-mentioned section; thence by that road and its continuation past Section No. 12 of the said Block VIII. to the boundary of Arai Parish; and thence towards the north-west by the said Arai Parish. OMAHA DISTRICT.

OMAHA DISTRICT. All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded towards the north generally by the Makaretu and Tukituki Rivers respectively and Hawke's Bay County to the ocean; towards the east by the ocean to Black Head; towards the south generally by the Hapuku Line (being the south-western boundary of Taumumu Riding, Patangata County), and by Patangata County to the Ngahape Stream, thence by that stream to its source, and thence by a line running due west to the eastern boundary-line of Block 69; and towards the north-west generally by said Block 69 and the Maharakeke River. ## TAKAPAU DISTRICT.

TAKAPAU DISTRICT. WHEREAS by Order in Council, made under the pro-visions of "The Post Office Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1886," and "The Post Office (Foreign Parcels) Act, 1888," and issued on the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, certain rates of postage were prescribed for the transmission of parcels through the post respectively within the colony, to the United Kingdom, to foreign places by way of the United Kingdom, and to certain of the Australian Colonies, and Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient to extend the parcel-post to New South Wales: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Post Office Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1886," and "The Post Office (Foreign Parcels) Act, 1888," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulation, that is to say: The rates of postage prescribed by the regulations made by the herein-before-mentioned Order in Council are hereby revoked so far as the same relate to the Australian Colonies, and in lieu thereof the rates of postage set forth in the Schedule hereto including New South Wales. IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excel-lency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulation for the Auckland Acclimatisation District, which includes the Provincial District of Auckland (with the exception of the Counties of Tauranga, Whakatane, and Cook) and the waters thereof; and doth hereby deelare that this regulation shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, supersede regulation number four, made by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 65, of the twenty-ninth day of November in the same year; and doth also deelare that in all other respects the regulations made by the last-named Order in Council shall remain in full force and virtue. and virtue.

#### REGULATION.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout and perch, and may use a landing net or gaff to secure any trout or perch caught with such rod and line, in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," which known as "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," which includes the Provincial District of Auckland with the excep-tion of the Counties of Tauranga, Whakatane, and Cook, from the first day of November in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, both inclusive.
