WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1885," and "The Land Act, 1892," the reserves enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto were temporarily reserved as endowments for education upon the respective dates specified in the second column of the said Schedule, and severally set opposite the respective descriptions of the said reserves:

And whereas notices of such reservations were laid upon the table of each House of the General Assembly: And whereas the two Houses have passed resolutions upon the dates specified in the third column approving in terms of the two hundred and thirty-eighth section of "The Land Act, 1892," of the lands being permanently set aside as endowments for education:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by "The Land Act, 1892," do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be reserved as endowments for primary education, as herein specified respectively.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing four thousand three hundred and twenty acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land

defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

(L.S.) GLASGOW, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Matakana and Waipukurau Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

MATAKANA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by a right line from the southernmost corner of Section No. 64, Arai Parish, to the north-western corner of Section No. 57, Pakiri Parish; thence by the last-mentioned section, the Wangarapo Stream, and Sections Nos. 19, 18, 15, 13, 76, 73, 75, and 77, Pakiri Parish; thence towards the north generally by the last-mentioned section, Section No. 78, the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 101, by Section No. 111, by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section, by Sections Nos. 110, 104, a road-line, and Sections Nos. 67, 68, 121, and 120, Omaha Parish; towards the east generally by the sea; and towards the south-west generally by the Mahurangi and Hoteo Parishes, by Section No. 2, Block XII., Pakiri Survey District, and Sections Nos. 2 and 1, Block VIII., of the said survey district to the road intersecting the last-mentioned section; thence by that road and its continuation past Section No. 12 of the said Block VIII. to the boundary of Arai Parish; and thence towards the north-west by the said Arai Parish.

OMAHA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east by the sea; towards the south generally by the sea, Whangateau Harbour, Sections Nos. 29, 65, 66, Omaha Parish, the road forming the western boundary of Section No. 67, and by reserve and Sections Nos. 41, 45, and 110A, Omaha Parish, by Sections Nos. 101, 107, 97, and 108, Matakana Parish, and Section No. 110, Pakiri Parish; thence towards the south-west by Sections Nos. 111, 81, and 80, Pakiri Parish, the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 73, and by Sections Nos. 86, 85, 87, 96, and 98, Pakiri Parish, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; and thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 64, Arai Parish; and towards the north-west by the said Arai Parish.

WAIPUKURAU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded towards the north generally by the Makaretu and Tukituki Rivers respectively and Hawke's Bay County to the ocean; towards the east by the ocean to Black Head; towards the south generally by the Hapuku Line (being the south-western boundary of Taumunu Riding, Patangata County), and by Patangata County to the Ngahape Stream, thence by that stream to its source, and thence by a line running due west to the eastern boundary-line of Block 69; and towards the north-west generally by said Block 69 and the Maharakeke River.

TAKAPAU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded towards the north by the Makaretu River; towards the south-east by the Maharakeke River and Blocks 48, 60, and 70, Takapau Survey District, to a line running due west from the source of the Ngahape Stream; thence towards the south by that line to the Manawatu River, by that river to its source, and a line running due west to the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence towards the west by the summit of that range to a point due west of the source of the Makaretu River; and again towards the north by a right line to the source of that river.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Matakana and Waipukurau Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Matakana, Omaha, Waipukurau, and Takapau Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-sixth day of September, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council, made under the provisions of "The Post Office Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1886," and "The Post Office (Foreign Parcels) Act, 1888," and issued on the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, certain rates of postage were prescribed for the transmission of parcels through the post respectively within the colony, to the United Kingdom, to foreign places by way of the United Kingdom, and to certain of the Australian Colonies, and Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient to extend the parcel-post to New South Wales:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Post Office Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1886," and "The Post Office (Foreign Parcels) Act, 1888," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulation, that is to say: The rates of postage prescribed by the regulations made by the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council are hereby revoked so far as the same relate to the Australian Colonies, and in lieu thereof the rates of postage set forth in the Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed in respect of all the Australian Colonies, including New South Wales. This regulation shall come into force on and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

*Regulation for Trout and Perch-fishing, Auckland Acclimatisation District: Amended Season.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-sixth day of September, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulation for the Auckland Acclimatisation District, which includes the Provincial District of Auckland (with the exception of the Counties of Tauranga, Whakatane, and Cook) and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that this regulation shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede regulation number four, made by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 65, of the twenty-ninth day of November in the same year; and doth also declare that in all other respects the regulations made by the last-named Order in Council shall remain in full force and virtue.

REGULATION.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout and perch, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout or perch caught with such rod and line, in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," which includes the Provincial District of Auckland with the exception of the Counties of Tauranga, Whakatane, and Cook, from the first day of November in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, both inclusive.
