

"It will be evident from this description of the several parts that our invention consists in providing an apparatus whereby

the wint we evident from this description of the several parts that our invention consists in providing an apparatus whereby one sack can be filled whilst the other is at rest, and that this operation can be performed either by hand or automatically; and the principle can be extended to more than two sacks if desired."


