WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Lyttelton to Bluff Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a road:

And whereas it has been certified by the New Zealand Railway Commissioners that such land is not required for railway purposes: And whereas such land is situated in Ashburton County, the local authority of which has consented to the issue of this Proclamation:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, is of opinion that the said local authority can conveniently

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, in the name and on behalf of His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and as his duly-appointed Deputy, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section five of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1889," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, become a road, and that the said road shall be under the control of the Ashburton County Council, and shall be maintained by the said Council in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Council.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE DEPUTY-GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by "The Counties Vehicle-Licensing Act, 1893," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by his duly-appointed Deputy, Sir James Prendergast, Knight, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby declare that, in addition to the powers under section three hundred and eleven of "The Counties Act, 1886" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), the several County Councils of the counties enumerated in the Schedule hereto are respectively authorised from time to time to make, alter, or repeal by-laws under the said Act to provide for the licensing of all vehicles drawn upon or along any road within the county, and to prevent unlicensed vehicles using any of the said county roads, and for appointing the several sums to be paid to the county fund for the licensing of vehicles as herein mentioned; which sums may be appointed to vary in respect of different classes of vehicles, the number and species of animals used in drawing the same, the weight of the load laden on such vehicles, the width of the tires of the wheels, or the number of passengers to be carried respectively. Regulations fixing Terms and Conditions for the Occupation of Lands leased under "The Land for Settlements Act,

GLASGOW, Governor. By his Deputy, JAMES PRENDERGAST. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of November, 1893.

#### Present .

HIS EXCELLENCY THE DEPUTY-GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by the seventeenth section of "The Land for Settlements Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor by Order in Council may from time to time make all such regulations as he shall see fit for the disposition of any land acquired under the said Act, or for regulating the conditions of occupation of any such land:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony
of New Zealand, by his duly-appointed Deputy, Sir James
Prendergast, Knight, Chief Justice, in pursuance and exercise
of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and
by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council
of the said colony dath basely for the full said solony. of the said colony, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions for the disposition of open and partly open lands acquired under the said Act, and for the occupation of such lands, that is to say,-

REGULATIONS.

1. All lands acquired under "The Land for Settlements Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), shall be disposed of by lease upon the terms and conditions following—namely, every lease shall be for a term of 999 years, to be reckoned from the next 1st day of January or July following the date thereof, and shall in addition include the period between the date of lease and such day.

The land shall be divided into allotments not exceeding 320 agree each

2. The yearly rental in respect of each allotment shall be

2. The yearly rental in respect of each allotment shall be an amount equal to 5 per cent. on the cost to the Government of such land, and shall be payable in equal parts half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July in each year, to the Receiver of Land Revenue.

3. Every applicant shall make the declaration hereby prescribed, and shall, immediately on being declared successful, pay a sum equal to one half-year's rent of the land applied for. Such payment shall be in discharge of the half-year's rent due on the 1st day of January or July following. He shall also pay the sum of £1 1s, for the preparation of the lease and the registration thereof.

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire or to hold more than one allotment, and no person who is the owner or

than one allotment, and no person who is the owner or occupier of land under the said Act which with the land applied for would exceed in area 320 acres shall be capable

of applying for or holding any allotment.

5. When more applications than one are made on the same day for the same land, the right to occupy the land shall be decided by ballot.

6. The lessee must reside on the land leased within one year from the date of lease, and thereafter such residence

shall be continuous.

7. The lessee shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements as under:—

- (a.) Within one year from the date of his lease to a value equal to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. of the price of the land;

  (b.) Within two years from the date of his lease to a value equal to another  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. of the price of the land;
- (c.) And thereafter, but within six years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another 2½ per cent.

of the price of the land; and in addition thereto shall, within six years from the date of his lease, put substantial improvements of a permanent character to the value of £1 for every acre of such land.

Substantial improvements of a permanent character mean substantial improvements of a permanent character mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of bush, gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivation, planting gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, sheep-dips, making embankments or protective works of any kind, in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of earner procedule building.

improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of any non-movable building.

8. The lessee must fence the land leased with a ring-fence within the second year of the term; and such fence must be sufficient to comply in all respects with "The Fencing Act, 1881," or any other law to regulate the fencing of land which shall for the time being be in force.

9. The lessee must once a year properly cut and trim all live fences now on the land, or which may be planted upon the land during the term, and stub all gorse not growing as fences, and also stub all broom and sweetbriar.

10. The lessee must not take more than three crops, one 10. The lessee must not take more than three crops, one of which must be a root-crop, from the same land in succession; and either with or immediately after a third crop of any kind the land must be sown down with good permanent cultivated grasses and clovers, and be allowed to remain as pasture for at least three years from the harvesting of last crop before being again cropped.

11. At all times during the lease the land, if the area of the whole exceed 10 acres, must be so farmed that not less than one-third of the farm be maintained in permanent.

than one-third of the farm be maintained in permanent

pasture.

12. The lessee must not cut the cultivated grass or clovers for hay or seed during the first year from the time of sowing as aforesaid.

13. The lessee must not burn any straw grown upon the

14. The lessee must once a year properly clean, clear from weed, and keep open all creeks, drains, ditches, and watercourses which now are or may be upon the land, and the Commissioner of Crown Lands or any Crown Lands Ranger of the district shall have the power at any time to enter upon and make any drain through the land that he

enter upon and make any drain through the land that he may deem necessary.

15. In the event of the lessee failing to comply with any of the conditions hereinbefore mentioned relating to the trimming of live fences and stubbing gorse, broom, and sweetbriar, and to the cleaning, clearing from weed, and keeping open all creeks, drains, ditches, and watercourses, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioner to have such work done, and to recover the cost of the same from the lessee.

16. All buildings erected upon the land must be kept in

good order and repair.

17. The lessee is liable for all rates, taxes, and assess

ments during the term.

18. Subject as aforesaid, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and regulations made thereunder with respect to applications for and the grant of leases in perpetuity shall apply, so far as applicable, to all applications for leases under "The Land for Settlements Act, 1892."

Prescribing a Close Season for Mullet.

GLASGOW, Governor, By his Deputy, JAMES PRENDERGAST.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of November, 1893.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE DEPUTY-GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which said regulations shall have force and effect only in any waters and places specified therein:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations here-

inafter set forth, prescribing a close season for the fish of the species of Mugil known as mullet or kanae, inhabiting the waters of the colony hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and by his duly-appointed Deputy, Sir James Prendergast, Knight, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations, to have force and effect within the waters hereafter specified in the said regulations :---

REGULATIONS.

1. The period from the twentieth day of December in one year to the twentieth day of March in the next succeeding year, both days inclusive, is hereby prescribed a close season in respect of the fish of the species of Mugil known as mullet or kanae, during which close season it shall be unlawful for any person to take any such fish contrary to the provisions of the said Act.

2. These regulations shall have force and effect in all waters as defined by the said Act in the North Island of New Zealand, bounded by a line commencing at Cape Wiwiki and proceeding seawards on a bearing of N. 45° E. for a distance of three miles; thence running generally parallel to and three miles distant from the coast-line to a point bearing N. 45° E. from Trig. Station No. 29 on the South Head of Whangaruru Bay; thence along a right line in the direction of that trig. station to the high-water mark of the sea; and thence along a line following the high-water mark of the sea round Whangaruru Bay, Whangaruru Harbour, Wangamumu Harbour, and Bay of Islands, and following the said high-water mark up the tidal rivers and crossing such rivers at the points where the tidal effect terminates.

3. Any person committing a breach of these regulations

3. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, to be recovered as by the said Act is provided.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE DEPUTY-GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license bearings W to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Queen's Drive Boating Club, of Port Chalmers (hereinafter called "the club"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license, under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore between the Export Pier and Cannon Point, of the foreshore between the Export Pier and Cannon Point, Port Chalmers, in Otago Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a boat-shed and platform; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D., 1891; Sheets Nos. 1 and 2), showing the place where it is intended to erect such boat-shed and platform, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the boat-shed and platform: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to Nicholas Dodds, of Port Chalmers, Chemist, and William Pedlow, of Port Chalmers, Grocer, as trustees for the club, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony

- 1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
- 2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order 2. The concessions and privileges conterred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such boat-shed and platform, which is shown in red edging on the plan marked M.D. 1891 (Sheet No. 1), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.
- 3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the said trustees for the club shall, on demand being made, pay to the Minister an annual sum of one shilling, dating from the day of the date of this Order in Council.
- 4. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-shed and platform without payment.
- 5. The said trustees for the club skall complete the erection of the said boat-shed and platform, in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1891 (Sheet No. 2), within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.
- 6. The said trustees for the club shall maintain the abovementioned boat-shed and platform in good order and repair.
- 7. - 8. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the said customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
- 9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said trustees for the club shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.
- 10. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may at any time be resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said trustees for the club three calendar months previous notice in writing. - 11. The said trustees for the club shall be liable for any injury which the said boat shed and platform may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part or the part of the club.

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by his duly-appointed Deputy, Sir James Prendergast, Knight, Chief Justice, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and determine as follows:—

1. As soon as conveniently may be after the making of this Order in Council of acting in the former of the fo

1. As soon as conveniently may be after the making of this Order in Council, a notice in the form or to the effect hereinafter set forth shall be given to the Natives affected by the said Act, by publishing such notice in the New Zealand Gazette in the English language, and by publishing a like notice in the Kahiti in the Maori language.

2. The Native Minister shall also cause inquiry to be made as to what Natives are affected by the said Act, so far as the same can be reasonably ascertained, and shall cause a like notice in the Maori language to be given to every such Native, by delivering the same to him or her personally, or by leaving the same at, or addressing it by post to, his or her usual or last known place of abode. usual or last-known place of abode.

3. Every such notice shall be signed by the Native Minister, or by some other Minister, being a member of the Executive Council of the colony, acting for such Native Minister, and may, when addressed to one or more individuals, be varied or altered as circumstances may require.

#### FORM OF NOTICE.

To all Native persons interested in lands in the Bay of Plenty which are referred to in "The Whakatane Grants Validation Act, 1878."

Notice is hereby given that the General Assembly of New Zealand has lately passed an Act the Short Title of which is "The Native Trusts and Claims Definition and Registration Act, 1893."

Section 2 of this Act relates to lands in the Bay of Plenty which have been granted to trustees under the circumstances mentioned in "The Whakatane Grants Validation Act, 1878," and a copy of the Schedule to the latter Act is set out in the mentioned in "The Whakatane Grants Validation Act, 1878," and a copy of the Schedule to the latter Act is set out in the First Schedule to this notice, showing what land was originally granted, to whom it was granted, and the nature of the trusts comprised in the grant. In "The Native Equitable Owners Act, 1886," the preamble states that in many cases grants have been made to Natives as absolute owners, when in fact they were only intended to be trustees for themselves and others, members of their tribe, or happu, or otherwise; and then, in sections 2 to 5, inclusive, provision is made enabling the Native Land Court to inquire into the nature of the title of any Native interested in any such land, to declare who are the persons beneficially entitled thereto, and empowering the Court to declare such beneficial owners to be tenants in common of the land, as if their names had been inserted in the grant or certificate affecting such land. These sections are set out at length in the Second Schedule to this notice. By "The Native Trusts and Claims Definition and Registration Act, 1893," before mentioned, it is enacted that cestuis que trustent may apply to the Native Land Court to become certificated owners of the lands above-mentioned. The legal expression cestuis que trustent means persons for whom other persons are trustees. In this case the persons to whom the grant is made are the legal owners; and the persons who are entitled to the rents or proceeds of the land are the equitable owners. The effect, then, of the second section of the last-mentioned Act is that equitable owners of these lands mentioned in the First Schedule may apply to the Native Land Court, under "The Native Equitable Owners Act, 1886," to ascertain who are the persons beneficially entitled to such lands and to be declared the owners thereof as therein provided. Every such application would of course be dealt with in accordance with the law affecting it. Section 2 of "The Native Trusts and Claims Definition and Registration Act, 1893," is set affecting it. The foregoing enactments shall not apply where the land the subject of such certificate or Crown grant as aforesaid, or any share therein, has heretofore been sold or conveyed by such nominal owners or any of them or their successors; but this exception shall not apply to land in the South Island portions whereof have been disposed of to the Government: Provided always that no Native claimant shall have any claim on the Government, or be allowed to question the title of

the Government to any land purchased by it. Where land subject to this Act is also subject to a lease for an unexpired term of years, any order made as aforesaid shall not prejudice the estate or term of the lessee, but the lessee after notice of such order shall pay any rent to accrue due under his lease to the Public Trustee, whose receipt shall be a good discharge for the same.

Such rent shall be paid out to and among the parties beneficially entitled in accordance with any partition or determination of interest as aforesaid.

This block is situated on the New Zealand and Australian This block is situated on the New Zealand and Australian Land Company's Parcora Estate, to the south of the Parcora River, and west of the main line of railway, the nearest station on which is St. Andrew's, distant about two miles. The block is also connected with Timaru by the Main South Road, the distance being about eight miles. The sections comprise open, level, agricultural land, of good quality, at present laid down in English grasses. Substantial gorse and wire fences surround and intersect the block, and have, with two executions here adopted as the houndaries of the allot wire fences surround and intersect the block, and have, with two exceptions, been adopted as the boundaries of the allotments. 4. At the time fixed for the ballot the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or officer appointed by him, shall read over the names on the ballot-cards, and deposit the cards in the ballot-bay

ballot-lox.

5. The drawing shall then take place in the presence of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or the officer appointed by him to superintend such drawing, and the person whose name appears on the card first drawn shall be declared by the Commissioner or other officer to be the successful appli-

cant.
6. Immediately upon the successful applicant being declared he shall pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue the rent and fees required for the land applied for; and should such applicant or his representative not make the said payments forthwith then a fresh ballot shall be taken between the other applicants without delay. Or, should there be only one other applicant he shall be declared successful, subject to the said payments being forthwith made.
7. Immediately after the final ballot all ballot-cards shall be destroyed by the Commissioner.

Regulations under "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," for the Election of Members of Boards by
Contributory Local Authorities in Grouped Districts.

GLASGOW, Governor. By his Deputy, JAMES PRENDERGAST.

JAMES PRENDERGAST.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1886," it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, shall, before the month of November next ensuing, and at the same period in every third year thereafter, apportion the representation of the various contributory local authorities in any district on the Board of such district in the manner therein set forth:

And whereas it is necessary that regulations shall be made for the elections of members of the Boards of such districts by such contributory local authorities as are grouped together in terms of the above-mentioned section:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by his duly-appointed Deputy, Sir James Prendergast, Knight, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by section ninety-nine of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," doth hereby make and prescribe the regulations hereinafter set forth for the conduct of the said recited elections, and the proceedings incidental thereto, namely:—

# REGULATIONS.

- 1. The local authorities named in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have respectively the number of votes set opposite them in the second column of the said Schedule, and their representative or representatives shall meet at the time and place set opposite the names of such local authorities in the third and fourth columns of the said Schedule respectively to elect such member or members as have been apportioned to such local authorities by Order in Council of the fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
- 2. The Presiding Officer to conduct the election in each case shall be the person named in the fifth column of the said Schedule, opposite the name of each local authority. Any local authority may, if it think fit, send only one representative to such election, and such representative shall then be entitled to exercise the full number of votes which such local authority is given by regulation one aforesaid.
- 3. Any local authority may appoint, by writing under the hand of the Chairman or Mayor, as the case may be, any person or persons residing at or near the place of meeting as aforesaid to be its representative or representatives at such meeting, and such representative or representatives shall be entitled to exercise the full number of votes which such local authority is given by regulation one.
- 4. In case any contributory local authority shall not send a representative to such election, the representative or representatives of the local authority or authorities present at the meeting called for such election shall elect the member or members which such local authorities together are entitled to have, and that either at the meeting then held, or at a subsequent meeting to be specially convened for the purpose by the Presiding Officer of such first-mentioned meeting.
- 5. The Presiding Officer at every meeting of local authorities as aforesaid shall make a return in writing to the Secretary of the Board to which any member has been elected, setting forth the names of the person or persons elected to serve as members of such Board. The Secretary shall thereupon notify the Inspector of Hospitals of the result of such election or elections for publication in the Gazette, and such publication shall be deemed to be prima facie evidence that the persons named therein were duly elected in terms of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885."
- 6. In the event of the number of votes on each side at any election being equal, the Presiding Officer shall give a castingvote.
