*Accession of New Zealand to the Trade-marks Convention between Great Britain and Ecuador.**

MY LORD,—With reference to your Lordship's despatch No. 4, of the 7th March last, I have the honour to inform you that the accession of New Zealand to the Trade-marks Convention between Great Britain and Ecuador, of the 26th August, 1892, has been duly notified to the Government of Ecuador, in conformity with the stipulation in Article II. of the Convention.

I enclose translation of the decree which has been issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs at Quito.

In virtue of the contents of the notes of Her Britannic Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires, dated the 20th and 28th June last, and in conformity of the stipulation in Article II. of the Anglo-Ecuadorian Convention relative to trade-marks, signed on the 26th August, 1892, and ratified on the 3rd February last, the following colonies are hereby included in the operation of the Convention, and entitled to the privileges accruing therefrom:—

Queensland, Natal, Newfoundland, the Cape of Good Hope, and New Zealand.

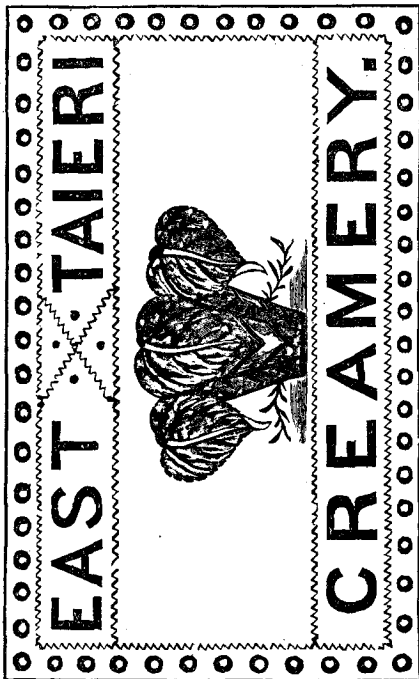

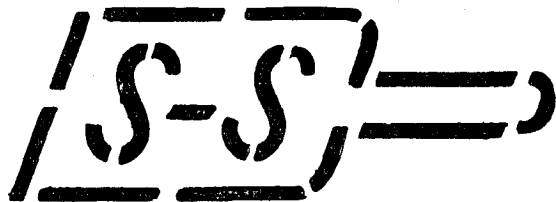
