ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this fourth day of December, 1893.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth by this present order delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to

The CHAIRMAN AND COUNCILLORS, and INHABITANTS of the MACKENZIE COUNTY,

which shall be known as the Fairlie Domain Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the County Council Office, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the third Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

*Amending Regulations for Trout- and Perch-fishing,  
Wellington Acclimatisation District.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this fourth day of December, 1893.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of September then instant, certain regulations were made under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), providing for trout- and perch-fishing within the Wellington Acclimatisation District as therein defined: And whereas by a further Order in Council, bearing date the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the nineteenth day of January then instant, the said regulations were in part amended: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such last-mentioned Order in Council, and the amendments thereby made, and to make other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the said recited Order in Council of the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order as follows:—

Regulation number two of the regulations made under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," dated the twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of September then instant, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words: namely, "Provided further that it shall be lawful for the said secretary or his deputy in any case where application is made for a license on or after the 20th day of December in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence, but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season."

cency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth hereby make the regulation hereto annexed regarding certain payments of capitation allowance to Education Boards; and, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby prescribe that this order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

NOTWITHSTANDING anything to the contrary contained in an Order in Council made on the 5th day of January, 1888, under the provisions of "The Education Act, 1877," relating (*inter alia*) to attendance registers and returns, the payment of capitation-allowance to Education Boards for the quarter ending on the 31st day of December, 1893, shall be according to the working-average attendance of the last-preceding quarter, as working-average is defined by Order in Council dated the 5th day of July, 1887, and made under the provisions of the before-mentioned Act.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council issued on the ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in pursuance of the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," delegating the powers conferred by the said Act to the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the Kaikoura County, as the Kaikoura Domain Board, in respect to the Kaikoura Recreation-grounds, it was directed that the first meeting of the Board should be held on Wednesday, the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, at the County Council Offices at Kaikoura, at the hour of two o'clock p.m.:

And whereas no meeting of the Board has been held as directed by the Order in Council aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to fix a time and place for the meetings of the Kaikoura Domain Board:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth by this present Order amend the first clause of the Order in Council issued on the ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three aforesaid, and with the like advice and consent doth hereby order and direct that the first meeting of the Kaikoura Domain Board shall be held at the County Council Offices at Kaikoura, on Saturday, the sixteenth day of December next, at the hour of two o'clock p.m., and that subsequent meetings shall be held at such other time and place as may from time to time be fixed by the Domain Board.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 69, of the tenth day of December in the same year, the Tauranga Improvement Company (Limited) was, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," licensed and permitted to use and occupy a portion of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark in Tauranga Harbour, for the purpose of constructing or erecting baths thereon:

And whereas it is provided by clause two of the conditions of the said Order in Council that the said company shall, in consideration of the concessions and privileges granted thereby, pay to the Minister having charge of the Marine Department an annual sum of one pound:

And whereas the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by the said Order in Council have, with the consent of the said Minister, been transferred to the Tauranga Borough Council:

And whereas it is desirable that the said Borough Council should be relieved of the payment of the said annual sum of one pound:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke so much of the said Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, as provides for the annual payment of the sum of one pound.

*Licensing A. Buckland to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Kaipara Harbour.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this fourth day of December, 1893.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," Alfred Buckland, of Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark on the Kaipara River, Kaipara Harbour, in order to extend a wharf constructed by him in accordance with the plans marked M.D. 1236, 1237, and 1238, which were approved by the Governor in Council on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1899), showing the place where it is intended to make such extension, and the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the said licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark on which the extension of the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of extending the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark occupied by the extension of the said wharf as shown on plan marked M.D. 1899.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound, payable on the 1st day of December, dating from the 1st day of December, 1893.

4. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said extension of the wharf without payment.

5. The licensee shall complete the erection of the said extension of the wharf, in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1899, within twelve calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned extension of the wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said extension of the wharf and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such extension of the wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said extension of the wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara.

10. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said extension of the wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said extension of the wharf;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy;

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

*Licensing Trustees for the New Brighton Lifeboat and Fishing Association to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore at New Brighton.*

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the New Brighton Lifeboat and Fishing Association of New Brighton (hereinafter called "the association") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license, under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore at New Brighton, in order to erect and maintain thereon a boat-shed; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1892), showing the place where it is intended to erect such boat-shed, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such

purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the boat-shed: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to James Shand, of Christchurch, merchant, George Thomas Hawker, of New Brighton, baker, Edwin Wells, of New Brighton, tailor, and John Etherden Coker, of New Brighton, hotelkeeper, as trustees for the association, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the association as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the said trustees for the association to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated in pink colour on the plan marked M.D. 1892 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boat-shed, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said trustees for the association upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the said trustees for the association shall pay to the Minister an annual sum of one pound, dating from the day of the date of this Order in Council, the first of such annual payments to be made on the trustees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-shed without payment.

5. The said trustees for the association shall complete the erection of the said boat-shed, in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1892, within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The said trustees for the association shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-shed in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said boat-shed and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the said trustees for the association or either of them a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-shed, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the said trustees for the association to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said trustees for the association shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may at any time be resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said trustees for the association one calendar month's previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the said trustees for the association or either of them.

11. The said trustees for the association shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part or the part of the association.

12. In case the said trustees for the association shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed for the purposes aforesaid; or
- (3.) In case the association be in any manner wound up or dissolved,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the said trustees for the association or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said trustees and to the association, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 361, against 391 in October, a decrease of 30. The deaths in November were 193, an increase of 27 on the number in October. Of the total deaths, males contributed 101; females, 92. Fifty of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 25.91 per cent. of the whole number; 32 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in November were 205, against 227 in October—a decrease of 22. The deaths amounted to 104, against 93 in October—an increase of 11. There were 15 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: one man of 69 and one woman of 75 died at Auckland; two men of 74, and four women of 69, 78, 80, and 86 at Wellington; one man of 74 and one woman of 74 at Christchurch; one man of 70, and four women of 66, 72, 77, and 78 at Dunedin.

Of the four chief towns Dunedin had the highest death-rate for November, being 1.16 per 1,000 persons living. At Wellington the rate was 1.01 per 1,000; at Auckland, 0.96; while Christchurch had the lowest rate, being 0.78 per 1,000 persons. As compared with November, 1892, the rate will be found higher at Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, but lower at Auckland:—

*Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.*—The mortality for November at the four cities was not so low as in October, the number of deaths having risen from 6 to 15, and the proportion per cent. of deaths from all causes from 6.45 to 14.42. Measles are still observed at Auckland and Christchurch, but there was only one case at each town last month. Scarletina caused one death at Auckland; influenza, one at Dunedin; and diphtheria, one at Wellington. There were also at the four towns 3 deaths from whooping-cough, 2 from typhoid fever, and 3 from diarrhoea.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—These numbered 27, against 23 in October. 15 deaths were attributable to phthisis, 2 were from tuberculosis, and 3 from tubercular meningitis. The deaths from cancer were 3, an unusually small number.

*Local Diseases.*—The total number of deaths was 45, of which diseases of the respiratory organs (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.) numbered 11. Diseases of the nervous system (apoplexy, meningitis, &c.) contributed 9 deaths. The deaths from diseases of the urinary organs were 8, including 5 from Bright's disease. From diseases of the circulatory organs (heart-disease, &c.) the deaths were 7. To these must be added 6 deaths from diseases of the digestive system, and 4 others to complete the mortality in the class.

*Violent Deaths.*—The total number is 5. A boy of 10 years of age was accidentally run over by a tram-car at Sumner, a man of 60 was found drowned in Auckland Harbour, a child of 15 months was choked by a bread-crumbs, and a youth of 16 died from blood-poisoning caused by accidental injury to the ankle. The fifth death was the suicide of a woman of 23, who shot herself while temporarily insane.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
