In exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Counties Act, 1886," and "The Kiwitea County Act, 1893," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do heredy divide the new County of Kiwitea, as constituted by the said Acts, into seven ridings, to be called the Kimbolton Riding, the Oroua Riding, the Makino Riding, the Waituna Riding, the Ongo Riding, the Hautapu Riding, and the Apiti Riding, and declare that the boundaries thereof shall be those set forth under the names of the said ridings respectively in the Schedule hereto. Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby declare that one member shall be elected

And I do hereby declare that one member shall be elected for each of the said ridings.

And I do further declare that Monday, the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said County of Kiwitea shall take place; and that Saturday, the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, at noon, shall be the time, and the Kiwitea Road Board Office, Feilding, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

RULES OF THE BIRMINGHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Rules of the Birmingham Public Cemetery.

1. Such portion of the Birmingham Cemetery now fenced in and laid out into blocks shall be from time to time divided into burial-plots, measuring 10ft. by 5ft. The following shall be the burial charges: viz., For every single interment in ordinary grave or vault, per adult, 10s.; children under twelve years, 7s. 6d.; for reopening grave or vault for interment, adult or child, 15s.

2. Any person desiring to have the exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in any plot or plots can have the same on the payment to the Trustees of the sum of 15s. sterling for the first plot—10ft. by 5ft.—and 10s. each for every additional plot purchased at the same time.

3. Grants of exclusive right of burial in perpetuity shall be made out in the form marked A annexed to these regulations, and shall only be made out in the name of one particular person, to be named therein.

4. Any purchaser of exclusive right of burial in perpetuity

4. Any purchaser of exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in any plot or plots of ground in the cemetery in which no interment shall have taken place may, by permission of the Trustees, transfer his or her interest in the said plot or plots

interment shall have taken place may, by permission of the Trustees, transfer his or her interest in the said plot or plots to any other person upon payment being made to the Trustees of a transfer-fee of 2s. 6d. for every such transfer, and on production to the Trustees of the original grant.

5. On the death of any person holding a grant of exclusive right of burial in perpetuity, the grant may be transferred to any other person applying to the Trustees for such transfer on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d., on production of the original grant, and on their producing sufficient and satisfactory evidence of their authority to apply for the said transfer.

6. If at any time a grant of exclusive right of burial should be lost or accidentally destroyed, a duplicate grant may be obtained on application, in writing, made to the Trustees, and on payment of a fee of 5s. Persons applying for a duplicate grant must give satisfactory written evidence of the loss or destruction of the original grant, and of their authority to apply for a duplicate grant. Should the original grant be at any time found after the issue of a duplicate, the duplicate must be at once returned to the Trustees.

7. Parties applying for grants of exclusive right of burial, or for transfers or duplicates of the same, must, at their own cost, provide all necessary duty stamps.

8. A sexton will from time to time be appointed by the Trustees, whose duty it will be to dig all graves required in the cemetery; and no other person will be allowed to dig any grave therein without express permission in writing from the Trustees.

9. All graves must be dug at least 6ft. deep on the shoal side, for which a charge of 12s. 6d. per adult and

All graves must be dug at least 6ft. deep on the shoal side, for which a charge of 12s. 6d. per adult and 7s. 6d. for children under twelve years will be made; but in the event of any person requiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. will be made for every additional foot: no part of a coffin to be within 4ft. 6in. of the surface.

10. The Trustees shall keep or cause to be kept a book in which shall be entered from time to time the number of every plot disposed of for the exclusive right of burial, the name of the purchaser, and date of disposal. They shall also keep a record of every plot of ground used for the purpose of interment, the name of the person interred, and the date of burial.

11. The record-book and plan of cemetery, when prepared,

11. The record-book and plan of cemetery, when prepared, shall be open for inspection to the public any day, Sundays and holidays excepted, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., on payment of a fee of 1s. The fee for inspection will be remitted in the case of persons applying for and taking out a burial warrant.

12. In all cases of intended interment, the persons having management or control of the same shall apply for a burial warrant to the Trustons on other person appointed to issue

warrant to the Trustees or other person appointed to issue the same. The warrant shall be in the form marked B annexed to these regulations, and shall be given to the party applying for the same upon payment of fees before-

13. The burial warrant, when signed, shall be given by the party having the management of the funeral to the sexton, and shall be sufficient authority for the interment. Burial warrants must be given to the sexton at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge of 5s. must be paid. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice of eight hours.

hours.

14. The following particulars must be given at the time of application for a burial warrant: viz., Name of deceased, denomination, required size and depth of grave, age of deceased, officiating minister, number of plot on the plan.

15. The costs and charges of burial of any person in the cemetery may be remitted, except the charges for digging the grave, on proof being given to the satisfaction of the Trustees that there are no funds available for payment of such fees, and that no person is to be found who is liable for the payment of the same.

such fees, and that no person is to be found who is liable for the payment of the same.

16. Persons purchasing the exclusive right of burial may, by permission of the Trustees, fence in the plots of ground allotted to them, and may erect tombstones, headstones, or other monuments thereon: Provided always that before any such fence, tombstone, or other monument be erected a plan thereof, and a copy of every epitaph or other in-scription, be first submitted to the Trustees and be duly approved by them.

17. No person shall be allowed to plant in any portion of

approved by them.

17. No person shall be allowed to plant in any portion of the cemetery, or on any ground on which the exclusive right of burial has been acquired, except by express permission in writing from the Trustees, any tall-growing shrub or tree; and any shrub or tree planted in any portion of the cemetery, or on any ground acquired for the exclusive right of burial as aforesaid, may at any time be trimmed, removed, or cut down by order of the Trustees.

18. All fences, enclosures, tombstones, headstones, and other monuments must be kept in proper order and repair by the surviving holders of the grant or relatives of the deceased. All wooden or other fences left in a state of decay or broken down may at any time be removed from the cemetery by order of the Trustees.

19. All charges made for any matter or thing connected or relating to the cemetery shall be paid in advance.

20. Persons may, by permission of the Trustees, fence in the plot or plots of ground allotted to them, and may erect tombstones, headstones, or other monuments thereon: Provided always that, before any such fence, tombstone, headstones, and may prested a relative or other monuments.

tombstones, headstones, or other monuments thereon: Provided always that, before any such fence, tombstone, headstone, or other monument be erected, a plan thereof, and a copy of every proposed epitaph or other inscription, be submitted to the Trustees and duly approved by them.

21. In the case of all persons interred in the Birmingham Cemetery previous to the 1st day of October, 1898, and whose surviving relations and friends have, previous to the above date, fenced in portions of land around the graves of persons so interred, it is hereby provided that, in all cases where the exclusive right of burial in perpetuity is not acquired, it shall be lawful for the Trustees at any time to remove or alter the position of any of the said fences whenever it may be found necessary to do so, of which necessity the Trustees shall be the sole judges. the sole judges.
