Native Lands acquired by Her Majesty declared to be Crown Lands.

GLASGOW, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS by section two hundred and fifty of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"); it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any Native lands acquired by Her Majesty in any way, or purchased out of any sums authorised or to be authorised to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith he shall. by Proand all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall, by Proclamation, declare such lands to be Crown lands, subject to be sold and dealt with as in the said Act is more particularly mentioned: And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned

have been purchased out of sums so authorised to be issued and expended as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto are free from Native enumerated in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and declare the lands so enumerated as aforesaid to be Crown lands, subject to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of Crown lands in force in the land districts in which they are respectively situated.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

GLASGOW, Governor (L.s.)A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Christchurch, Lyttelton, Akaroa, and Ellesmere Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into five marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

LITTLE RIVER DISTRICT.
All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-east by a right line drawn from the summit of the Port Hills through Trig. Station L1 to Mount Herbert; thence towards the north by a right line to Mount Herbert Peak, and by that line continued to the Mount

Herbert Peak Road; thence again towards the north-east and north by the south sides of the said Mount Herbert Peak Road and the Purau and Akaroa Road to the junction of the latter road with the Port Levy and Little River Road; thence again towards the north-east and towards the east and south-east by the west side of the said Port Levy and Little River Road to its junction with the Terawera Valley Road; thence by the south side of the said Terawera Valley Road to the Little River Railway Reserve; thence to and by the south side of the Barry Pass Road to Barry Pass; thence by a line along the summit of the main range over the said Barry Pass, Wooded Peak, French Hill, Wainui Peak, Kitson's Pole, Saddle Hill, and Carew's Peak to Mount Peak, Kitson's Pole, Saddle Hill, and Carew's Peak to Mount Bossu; thence by a line along the summit of the spur running down to the eastern head of Island Bay; thence towards the south-west and south by the ocean to Taumutu at the mouth of Lake Ellesmere; thence towards the north and west generally by a right line to the mouth of the River Halswell, by a line along the middle of that river, by Section No. 1069, by the northern side of the Ahuriri Bush Road South, by Sections Nos. 1901 and 1863 to the south-east corner of Section No. 1093, and thence by a line along the summit of the Port Hills. the Port Hills.

#### CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north by the Waimakariri River; towards the east by the sea to Whitewash Head; towards the south-east generally by a leading spur, thence to the Borough of Lyttelton, thence by that borough to its north-western boundary and by a due north line to and by the summit of the Port Hills to the south-east corner of Section No. 1093, by Sections No. 3595 and 39551, the Abrahiri Rush Boad South tions Nos. 3585 and 32581, the Ahuriri Bush Road South, and Section No. 1879, to the River Halswell, and by a line along the middle of that river to Lake Ellesmere; thence towards the south-west generally by Lake Ellesmere and the right bank of the Selwyn River to the Great South Road, and towards the north-west generally by that road, the Greendale and Station Road, and the Selwyn and Waimakariri Road produced to the Waimakariri River.

#### LYTTELTON DISTRICT.

Regulations for cutting and removing Flax from Certain Reserves within Mining Districts.

#### GLASGOW, Governor.

Schedule I. hereto, or to the like effect, accompanied by a sketch-plan of the area applied for, with approximate measurements of the boundary-lines.

2. A copy of every application shall be posted at each corner of the area applied for, and maintained for at least fourteen days before the day of hearing. All objections (if any) to the granting of any such application must be lodged at the Warden's Office within fourteen days after receipt of the application at such office. A copy of every application shall be posted outside the Warden's Office at least ten days prior to the day of hearing.

3. If no valid objection be made, and the Warden is not aware of any reason why a license should not be issued, he may, with the consent of the Minister of Mines, grant a license to the applicant on the following terms and conditions, viz.:—

Term, not exceeding seven years.

Area, not to exceed 80 acres.

Rent, 6d. per acre per annum, payable in advance.

Royalty, 4s. per ton of fibre manufactured from green flax cut or taken from the area described in the license, payable Half-yearly returns shall be sent to the Warden by the

licensee of the number of tons of green flax cut or taken from the said land.

The licensee shall have no right whatever to the ground, but only the right to cut and remove the flax growing thereon, and the license may be cancelled by the Warden if at any time the area granted is used for any purpose or purposes other than those connected with the flax-dressing

purposes other than those connected with the max-dressing industry, without the written consent of the Warden.

If the rent or royalty, or any portion, or either, shall be in arrear for thirty days, or if true and correct half-yearly returns be not sent to the Warden within thirty days after the close of each and every half-year of the term of license, the Warden may cancel the license forthwith without prejudice to the recovery of any arrears of rent or royalty due dice to the recovery of any arrears of rent or royalty due, and the licensee shall immediately cease to cut or remove

flax from the land described in the license.

The licensee may surrender his license at the expiration of any year on giving notice to the Warden and paying all arrears of rent and royalty due up to the date of such sur-

The licensee may also in like manner surrender a part of the area held under license, but not less than one-fourth; and in such case the rent shall only be charged on the reduced area from the date of surrender.

reduced area from the date of surrender.

If the first year's rent be not paid within fourteen days from the date of notice that the license is granted and ready for issue, the license shall be ipso facto void, and the application shall be cancelled by the Warden accordingly.

Should the land be required at any time during the currency of the license for any public purpose, the licensee shall surrender the license and give up peaceable possession of the land upon demand by the Warden or any other person duly authorised by the Minister of Mines in that behalf, at any time, after notice of not less than thirty days, without any right to refund of rent or compensation to the licensee.

The estimated number of marriages of Europeans solemnised in 1893 is 4,100, against 4,002, the actual number solemnised in 1892.

The rate for 1893 is estimated to be 6.20 per 1,000 of mean population. In 1892 the rate was 6.23 per 1,000.
