A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from

time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not in the aggregate exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing six thousand two hundred and fifty acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bonâ fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

*Prescribing Dues and Rates and making Regulations for the Kaikoura Wharf and Goods-shed.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of February, 1894.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Harbours Act, 1878" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by such Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same under regulations to be made in manner provided in section two hundred and twelve of the said Act: And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in the Harbour of Kaikoura: And whereas it is provided by section four of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1879," that the power granted to the Governor in Council by the seventeenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," in respect of prescribing what dues and rates may be charged on wharves vested in local bodies, may be exercised from time to time as occasion may require, and shall not be limited as in the said section is provided: And whereas dues and rates to be charged for the use of the Kaikoura wharf and goods-shed (the management of which was by Order in Council dated the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, vested in the Kaikoura County Council) were prescribed by Orders in Council dated the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the thirtieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such three last-named Orders in Council, and the dues, rates, and regulations thereby fixed and made, and to prescribe and make other dues, rates, and regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority granted to him by the said Act, "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1879," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council of the fif-

teenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, of the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and of the thirtieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, prescribing dues and rates to be charged for the use of the Kaikoura wharf and goods-shed, and making regulations for the same, and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken, on and after the date of this Order in Council, for the use of the said wharf and goods-shed; and such dues and rates shall be applied to keeping the above-mentioned wharf and goods-shed, and all erections on the wharf, in good order and repair, as provided in the said Order in Council of the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

And His Excellency the Governor of the said colony, with the like advice and consent, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority granted to him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the regulations contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and doth order that the same shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, apply to the Port or Harbour of Kaikoura and to the wharf aforesaid.

SECOND SCHEDULE.  
REGULATIONS.

1. THE owner or master of every vessel lying at wharf, pier, jetty, or landing-place shall, before commencing to discharge or land his cargo on any such wharf or landing-place, obtain the permission of the Wharfinger or his deputy so to do; and any cargo landed without such permission shall not be deemed to be in the custody of the Wharfinger, nor shall he be responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to such cargo by the elements or otherwise.
2. No ballast, timber, coal, produce, or cargo of any description shall be embarked or shipped, disembarked or unshipped, except at such times and places, and in such order and mode, as may be directed and deemed expedient by the Wharfinger or his deputy for the proper working of the wharf.
3. All goods of a dangerous or inflammable character shall be removed by the owner, agent, or consignee immediately on being landed, and such owner, agent, or consignee failing to do so will be held responsible for any damage or loss that may accrue from any accident arising therefrom, in addition to the penalty provided for breach of these regulations; and the Wharfinger shall not be responsible for any damage or loss which may accrue to such goods.
4. No goods or articles of any description which, in the opinion of the Wharfinger or his deputy, are likely to occasion damage to the wharf, landing-place, or shed shall be discharged or landed on any such wharf or landing-place, or placed in any such shed.
5. If at any time owners or consignees of any cargo or produce landed on the wharf or landing-place, or to be shipped therefrom, are notified that no storage room is available in any of the sheds for the proper stowage of such cargo or produce, and if any cargo or produce shall be permitted to remain on the wharf or landing-place for the convenience of the owners, consignees, or shippers thereof, then the Wharfinger shall not be responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to any such cargo or produce, by the elements or otherwise, during the time they may so remain on the wharf: Provided always that the Wharfinger shall not be bound to find storage room either in the sheds or on the wharf or landing-place for any cargo or produce when no sufficient accommodation is available for that purpose.
6. No person taking any vehicle on the wharf shall allow the same to go at greater than a walking pace.
7. Any person taking any vehicle drawn by one horse on the wharf or jetty on which vehicles or horses are permitted to be taken shall walk at the head of and lead his horse, and remain by the same so long as the vehicle is on the said wharf, pier, or jetty; and no person shall ride on horseback on the wharf, pier, or jetty, but shall dismount and lead his horse.
8. Any person taking any vehicle drawn by two or more horses on any such wharf, pier, or jetty, as mentioned in the preceding regulation, shall ride on the said vehicle so as to keep the horses attached thereto as far as possible under his control while the said vehicle is in motion, and shall stand by the said vehicle when and so long as the same shall be at a standstill on any such wharf, pier, or jetty.
9. All persons in charge of vehicles shall be under the control of the Wharfinger or his deputy, and such persons shall, immediately on being so ordered by the said Wharfinger or his deputy, remove such vehicle to any part of the wharf to which he may be directed, or shall, if so required by the said Wharfinger or his deputy, remove such vehicle altogether from the wharf. No person shall be allowed to take any bicycle or tricycle upon the said wharf except for the sake of shipment, or by permission of the Wharfinger or his deputy.
10. No person shall disobey the orders of the Wharfinger or his deputy when acting in the due performance of their duty, nor in any way obstruct the traffic on any wharf, pier, jetty, or landing-place, nor make use of abusive or improper language thereon.
11. All goods landed on any wharf or landing-place, or brought thereon for shipment, are to be placed as the Wharfinger or his deputy may direct, and no goods or other articles shall be placed in any shed, or on any wharf or landing-place so as to be an impediment to the approaches, or an obstacle to the removal of other goods from shed, wharf, or landing-place, or so as to encumber the mooring-posts or rings on any such wharf or landing-place.

s. d. 12. Shippers and consignees of all goods landed on or shipped from the said wharf shall, before landing or shipping such goods, deliver to the Wharfinger or his deputy a full and true account of all such goods, stating the respective weights or measurements of the same according as freight is payable thereon. All charges to be paid previous to delivery of goods.

13. The master of every vessel shall, on demand, give to the Wharfinger or other person deputed by him a copy of the bill of lading, freight-list, or manifest of the cargo, or other proper account of all goods intended to be unshipped from the vessel, and the name or names of the owners to whom all or any goods in such vessel are intended to be delivered.

14. The wharf shall be open daily for business from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Sundays and holidays excepted): Provided that when the steamers arrive before 8 a.m. then the wharf shall be open from the time of the arrival of the steamer; and if after 5 p.m., for one hour after the time of discharging. Goods to be removed during those hours without storage being charged. The charges on goods landed, or landed and stored on Sundays and holidays, shall be paid by the ship, consignees paying single wharfage only.

15. All goods landed on the wharf shall be removed therefrom or stored before 4 o'clock p.m. on the day on which they are landed, except as provided for by Regulation 14.

16. The Wharfinger is empowered to take charge of and store cargo if not removed by the consignee within six hours after being landed, or to cause the same to be delivered to the consignee at his expense and risk: Provided that any consignee may notify to the Wharfinger in writing that he will remove his goods that day and does not require storage. The Wharfinger's liability for loss or damage done to the goods while waiting removal to cease from the time of receipt of notice. Labour for loading, if required, to be supplied by the Wharfinger to 5 p.m. Goods such as bricks, coal, timber, and iron may be left on the wharf for two working-days at the request of the consignee, without liability to extra charge for wharfage and free of storage (provided that the proper working of the wharf is not obstructed); but the Wharfinger shall not be responsible for the safety of such goods.

17. All vessels shall pay not exceeding 1s. per ton extra on all cargo landed before 8 a.m. and after 4 p.m., exclusive of labour. Wool, skins, fungus, and flax shall be charged for at the rate of 3d. per bale. No extra charge shall be made for coal, ballast, or timber discharged or shipped during extra hours.

18. Goods landed for reshipment shall have precedence of all other goods stored in the sheds.

19. In the construction of the above regulations the terms and expressions following shall have the meanings herein-after assigned to them:—

“Wharfinger” shall mean and include the person appointed by the Kaikoura County Council or Wharfinger to collect and receive all dues payable under this Order in Council:

“Deputy” shall mean any officer acting under the instructions or by the authority of the Wharfinger or Kaikoura County Council, as the case may be.

20. If any person fails, refuses, or neglects to do anything required by these regulations, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined or authorised to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these regulations, every such person in any case so offending shall be liable to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

21. No person or persons shall deposit goods of any description upon the public highway or lands vested in the Kaikoura County Council, or on any land vested in the said Council adjacent to the wharf.

22. No steamer shall load or unload cargo at the wharf on Sundays without permission of the Chairman of the Kaikoura County Council or his deputy. Such permission will only be given when steamers have been prevented from working by previous bad weather.

23. The Wharfinger for the time being shall have sole charge of the wharf, sheds, boatways, and all the other appurtenances.

THE HONOURABLE THE COLONIAL SECRETARY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves

Act, 1881," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Land District of Canterbury, and known as the Orari Recreation-ground, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881"; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this second day of March, 1894.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE COLONIAL SECRETARY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth by this present order delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Orari Park Domain Board, namely,—

Charles Boland,  
George O'Neil,  
Samuel Breadley, and  
Alexander Brown

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Wednesday in each month, at eight o'clock p.m., at Orari, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the third Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the mem-

bers may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

THE HONOURABLE THE COLONIAL SECRETARY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Hampden Bush Domain Board, namely,—

(hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at Hampden (Hawke's Bay), or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. *Regulations for Deer-shooting, Otago.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," His Excellency the Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby notify that deer (bucks or stags only) may be shot and killed within the boundaries of the Otago Acclimatisation Society's district, subject to the following regulations and restrictions, namely:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses to shoot and kill deer (bucks or stags only) in the Otago Acclimatisation Society's district, except within the area hereinafter described, will be issued under the hand of the Chief Postmaster at Dunedin, on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society. For every such license to kill red deer a fee of £3 sterling will be charged; and no holder of any such license as aforesaid shall kill more than four stags under or by virtue of such license; and for every such license to kill fallow deer a fee of £2 sterling will be charged; and no holder of any such license as aforesaid shall kill more than three bucks under or by virtue of such license.

The said Chief Postmaster is hereby appointed and authorised to issue and sign the said licenses.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to kill fallow deer (bucks only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 15th March, 1894, to the 30th April, 1894, and red deer (stags only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 1st April to the 31st May, 1894. Ball cart-idge only to be used.

3. No doe, hind, or fawn will be allowed to be killed on any pretext whatever, and no dogs will be allowed to accompany either the licensee or any attendant he may have with him.

4. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. No deer shall be shot within an area containing about 24,800 acres in one block, being parts of the Mid-Hawea, Longlip, Lower Hawea, and Lindis Districts, plans of which area will be issued by the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society to persons to whom licenses to shoot deer are granted.

*Bonuses for Encouragement of New Zealand Hemp (Phormium tenax) Industry.—Notice No. 387.*

*BONUS No. 1.*

A BONUS of £1,750 is offered for a machine or process for dressing New Zealand hemp (*Phormium tenax*) which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes now in use, and which shall, after trial, be found to materially reduce the cost of production, improve the product, or increase the quantity of dressed fibre.

The following are the conditions:—

1. All applications for the bonus must be sent addressed to the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture, Wellington, and must reach him not later than the 30th August, 1894. Each application must be accompanied by a description of the machine or process, particularly stating improvements on present machines or processes, and also the cost at which the machine or process can be supplied.

2. The applicants must be prepared to submit their machines or processes to examination at such time and place as the Government may direct.

3. The Government shall appoint a committee of three or more experts, to whom all applications shall be submitted. Such committee shall, after perusal, state what machines or processes they deem worthy of consideration, and may inspect the same at any place within the colony; and, having so inspected the whole or any of them, may direct that the whole or any of them be brought for further trial to such place as they may think fit.

The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government.

The following shall be the basis of the test:—  
The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test.

The committee shall take into consideration—  
The time occupied by each machine or process in the operation;

The cost of labour and time required after the fibre has left the machine or process before it is ready for baling;

The percentage of dressed fibre and tow produced by each machine or process;

The cost of producing the same;

The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and durability of the working parts.

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,—

- (1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.
- (2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.
- (3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and, if so, how much.

BONUS No. 2.

A bonus of £250 is offered for a process of utilising the waste products of the hemp.

The first three conditions of Bonus No. 1 to apply to this also.

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of the waste products to each process as a test.

On completion of the tests the committee shall report to the Minister, and shall give the following particulars of each process: (a.) The nature of the article made. (b.) The quantity produced, and the cost of production. (c.) The value of the product. (d.) Whether any of the processes are of sufficient importance to warrant the Minister in giving (1) the whole, or (2) any part, of the bonus; (3) if a part only, how much.

THE attention of sportsmen, game-dealers, and others is called to the provisions of "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1889," which is now in force. A digest of the chief of such provisions is subjoined, viz:—

Section 4. No person shall kill, destroy, or shoot at any game or native game with anything but a shoulder-gun, and no such gun must exceed size No. 10 at muzzle, or be fitted with barrels exceeding 36in. in length. No gun shall exceed 10lb. in weight.

Any person offending against this provision is liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Section 5. No person shall sell any native game, or take or kill any native game for the purpose of sale, without previously taking out the required license.

Penalty not exceeding £20.

Section 6. No sale of native game shall take place prior to the 1st May and subsequently to the 1st August in any year.

If any person hold a license to sell game—i.e., imported game—he is not liable to pay a second fee on taking out a license to sell native game. But both licenses must be taken out if it is intended to sell both kinds of game.

Section 7. Every holder of a license to sell game or native game shall keep a book in which he is to enter the name of every person from whom any game or native game is purchased, the number and description of all such game or native game purchased from each person, and the district in which such game was killed or taken. The book is to be open for inspection at all reasonable hours by any police officer or holder of a game license.

Penalty not exceeding £10.

Sections 10 and 11. Every Acclimatisation Society is to forward to the Colonial Treasurer before the 21st April in each year a detailed statement of accounts as up to the 31st March preceding, together with a balance-sheet duly audited; and the statement is also to be published in a newspaper circulating in the district. If default be made by any society for three calendar months, such society is not to receive any fees, fines, or penalties under the Animals Protection Act while such default continues.

Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 389, against 463 in January, a decrease of 74. The deaths in February were 211, an increase of 2 on the number in January. Of the total deaths, males contributed 117; females, 94. Ninety-two of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 43.6 per cent. of the whole number; 78 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 Years of Age and 5 Years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each Cause, in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, that were registered during the Month of February, 1894.

The following remarks apply to the four principal boroughs only: The births in February were 215, against 237 in January—a decrease of 22. The deaths amounted to 126, against 119 in January—an increase of 7. There were fifteen deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Four men of 73, 81, 82, and 83, and two women of 75 and 76, died at Auckland; one man of 75, and one woman of 76, at Wellington; three men of 67 (two), and 71, and one woman of 71, at Christchurch; two men of 65 and 82, and one woman of 79 at Dunedin.

*Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.*—Of every 100 deaths at the four chief cities in February, 24 were from this class of disease. The number of deaths at these towns was 81, against 20 in January last, and 17 in February of 1893. Of 81 deaths last month 13 were at Auckland, 12 at Wellington, 3 at Christchurch, and 3 at Dunedin. Influenza caused 1 death at Wellington and 1 at Christchurch; whooping-cough, 2 deaths at Wellington and 2 at Dunedin. Diphtheria is noticed at Wellington only, having proved fatal to a child under five years of age. Typhoid-fever also caused 1 death at Wellington. From diarrhoeal diseases the deaths numbered 21, against 10 in January. These complaints were most fatal in February at Auckland, where 12 deaths occurred; next at Wellington (6 deaths), while at Christchurch the deaths were 2, and at Dunedin only 1. A death from ague at Wellington, and 1 from syphilitic lepra (in a child) at Auckland, complete the total for the class.

*Parasitic Diseases.*—A death from hydatids in the spleen is found to have taken place at Dunedin.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—Of 19 deaths, 12 were from phthisis and 2 from cancer.

*Local Diseases.*—The total of deaths was 47, the same number as in January. There were 13 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, 10 from diseases of the circulatory system, 6 from diseases of the respiratory system, 13 from diseases of the digestive system, 1 from disease of the lymphatic system, 3 from diseases of the urinary system, and 1 from disease of the reproductive system.

*Violent Deaths.*—Five of these were accidental, and 5 were suicidal. A youth of 17 years died by misadventure from an overdose of chlorodyne, 2 adult males were found drowned in Wellington Harbour, a child of eighteen months was accidentally suffocated in a water-closet, and an infant died from hæmorrhage at birth. A clerk died from a cut inflicted by himself while temporarily insane, a woman killed herself by swallowing phosphor matches, a builder drowned himself, a settler hung himself, and a woman strangled herself.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
