In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district the boundaries whereof are described in the First Schedule

hereto is hereby incorporated into the Borough of Kaiapoi; and I do further proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said borough shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE. LAND TO BE ADDED TO THE BOROUGH OF KATAPOI.

Land to be added to the Borough of Kaiapoi. All that area in the Canterbury Land District, situated in the Rangiora Survey District, bounded towards the north generally by Cam Road from Revell's Road to the bridge over the Cam River; thence by a line along the middle of the roadway across that river; thence by the said Cam River and Native reserve to the old North Road; thence by a line across that road, and again by the said Native reserve and by Rural Section No. 1295, to the North Road: thence towards the east by the North Road: towards the south generally by Beach Road to the north branch of the Waimakariri River; thence by a right line across that river and by its southern bank to the middle of Hilton Street: thence towards the south-west generally by a right line across the north branch of the Waimakariri River, by the northern bank of the said north branch, and by Revell's Road, to Cam Road, the place of commencement. WHEREAS by the two hundred and thirty-fifth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:
