Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is taken for the extension of the said line of railway hereinbefore specified.

WHEREAS by the second section of "The Government Loans to Local Bodies Act Amendment Act, 1891" (herein termed "the said Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that, before certain moneys therein mentioned shall be expended upon any block of land, it shall be necessary that the same be proclaimed as set apart for settlement:

**A P R O C L A M A T I O N.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the one hundred and sixty-second section of "The Land Act, 1892," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, James Prendergast, Knight, Chief Justice, in the name and on behalf of His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and as his duly-appointed Deputy, do hereby proclaim and declare that the blocks of land described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby set apart and declared open for special settlement.

**SCHEDULE.****RUAHINE BLOCK.**

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, situated in the Makaretu Survey District, bounded towards the north-west by Crown lands; towards the north-east by the Waipawa River; towards the south-east and south by Sections Nos. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 21, Block I., Ruataniwha Survey District, and by the Tukituki River; and towards the south-west by Crown lands: and, excepting reserves for education, roads, and other purposes, containing a net area for selection of 2,400 acres.

**NELSON BLOCK.**

All that area in the Taranaki Land District, situated in Blocks VIII. and IX., Mimi Survey District, bounded towards the west by the Parininihi Forest Reserve; towards the north by the confiscation boundary-line; towards the east by the Tongapurutu River; and towards the south by a right line parallel to the confiscation line before mentioned: and, excepting reserves for education, roads, and other purposes, containing a net area for selection of 2,400 acres.

**AUCKLAND No. 1 BLOCK.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District, situated in Blocks XI., XII., XV., and XVI., Waaku Survey District, bounded towards the north generally by the Whakarewa Block, by a forest reserve, and by unadjudicated Native land; towards the east by a right line parallel to and at a distance of 30 chains in a westerly direction from the eastern boundary of Waaku Survey District; towards the south by part of the northern boundary of Blocks Nos. III. and IV., Waipoua Survey District; and towards the west by a right line running due north, at a distance of 60 chains in an easterly direction from Kowekaweka Trig. Station, to the Whakarewa Block aforementioned: and, excepting reserves for education, roads, and other purposes, containing a net area for selection of 9,000 acres.

**AYOCA BLOCK.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District, situated in Blocks I. and V., Maungaru Survey District, bounded towards the north by a right line running parallel to and at a distance of 100 chains in a southerly direction from the northern boundary of Block I., Maungaru Survey District; towards the east generally by the Maungaru Block, the Mangakirikiri Block, the Tangowahine River, and again by the Mangakirikiri Block; towards the south by the Omū Block; and towards the west generally by the Ounūwhao Block and a forest reserve to the line first-mentioned: and, excepting reserves for education, roads, and other purposes, containing a net area for selection of 3,650 acres.

**GLADSTONE BLOCK.**

All that area in the Wellington Land District, situated in Blocks VII., VIII., XI., and XII., Manganui District, bounded on the north-west by the Waimarino Block; on the north-east by the Springfield Farm Homestead Block and the Waimarino Block; on the east by the Waimarino Block; on the south by the Mangaturuturu Stream; on the west by the North Island Trunk Railway line; on the south-east by Crown lands; and on the south-west by Marton Farm Homestead Block No. 4: and, excepting reserves for education, roads, and other purposes, containing a net area for selection of 8,500 acres.

*Regulations under "The Civil Service Insurance Act, 1893."*

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this eighth day of March, 1894.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE SIR P. A. BUCKLEY, K.C.M.G.,  
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

**W**HEREAS by "The Civil Service Insurance Act, 1893" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time may, *inter alia*, make any regulations required for the due administration of the said Act, and for all matters in relation thereto: And whereas by the fourteenth section of the said Act it is provided that the Acts in force relating to the Government Life Insurance Department shall be deemed to authorise the Government Insurance Commissioner to enter into any contracts under those Acts that may be necessary to give effect to the said Act, with such provisions, variations, and modifications as may be necessary for that purpose; and regulations and tables may from time to time

be made, altered, or varied under those aforesaid Acts for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make and prescribe the rules and regulations set forth hereunder: And in further exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His said Excellency doth order and direct that the several tables set forth in the Schedules hereto shall be the tables to be used for the purposes of these regulations, until other provision shall be lawfully made in that behalf.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1. In these rules, and in all policies or instruments issued or made thereunder, if not inconsistent with the context,—

“Commissioner” means the Government Insurance Commissioner holding office for the time being:

“Officer” means any person (not exempted by the said Act) employed in any permanent capacity, and paid an annual salary out of the public moneys.

2. From the salary of every officer hereafter appointed whose age does not exceed forty years at date of appointment there shall be deducted monthly a sum of money, according to the rate of his salary, as set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and every such officer shall be entitled to the issue by the Commissioner of a policy conferring the combined insurance and annuity benefits prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. Every such officer may, by special application to the Commissioner prior to the issue of his policy, have a provision inserted therein stipulating for the continuance of the insurance (including any additions thereto effected in accordance with No. 7 of these rules and regulations) after age sixty, in consideration of the payment to the Commissioner of the equivalent additional deductions from his salary necessary from time to time according to the rates prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto.

4. From the salary of every officer hereafter appointed whose age exceeds forty years at date of appointment, and who shall within three months of date of appointment elect to take out a policy in accordance with subsection (2) of section 10 of the said Act, there shall be deducted a monthly sum of the amount prescribed in the First Schedule hereto; and every such officer, if not more than fifty years of age, shall be entitled to the issue by the Commissioner of a policy conferring either of the alternative benefits prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto; provided, nevertheless, that Benefit A shall not be selected unless the candidate shall pass the medical examination of the department to the satisfaction of the Commissioner. If more than fifty years of age, he shall be entitled to the issue by the Commissioner of a policy in accordance with any of the gazetted tables of the department; provided that the officer shall pass any medical examination which may be necessary for the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

5. From the salary of every officer appointed before the 1st of January, 1894, under “The Civil Service Reform Act, 1886,” who shall during the year 1894 elect to effect a policy with the Commissioner under section 9 or section 10 of the said Act, there shall be deducted a monthly sum of the amount prescribed in the First Schedule hereto; and every such officer shall be entitled to the issue by the Commissioner of a policy conferring the benefits described in the Second Schedule or the Fourth Schedule hereto, or a policy in accordance with the gazetted tables of the department, as may be chosen by the officer himself; provided that the candidate shall pass any medical examination which may be necessary for the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

6. The annuity of every officer who shall insure with the Commissioner under section 9 of the said Act shall be increased on account of the amount standing to his credit with the Public Trustee, to the extent shown in the Fifth Schedule hereto; and every such officer may at his option, by special application to the Commissioner prior to the issue of his policy, be entitled to the privileges set forth in No. 3 of these rules and regulations, subject to the additional deduction from his salary therein provided for.

7. The monthly deduction from the salary of every officer taking out a policy under the said Act shall be increased in accordance with the First Schedule hereto whenever an increase to the salary of such officer shall bring the salary actually paid to such officer into the next higher rate of salary, as shown in the First Schedule hereto; and the Commissioner shall effect an indorsement upon the policy, stating the increase in the monthly deduction, and the corresponding increase in the benefit or benefits, which shall be calculated for the age of the officer at the date upon which such increased deduction takes effect.

8. Every officer taking out a policy with the department under the said Act shall furnish such information as to date of birth, and fill up such application and other forms, as may be required by the Commissioner.

9. All rules and regulations framed under the Acts in force relating to the Government Life Insurance Department shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to policies issued under these regulations, provided they do not conflict or are not inconsistent therewith.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Education Act, 1877," His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth hereby make the regulation hereto annexed regarding certain payments of capitation allowance to Education Boards; and, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby prescribe that this order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATION.

NOTWITHSTANDING anything to the contrary contained in an Order in Council made on the 5th day of January, 1888, under the provisions of "The Education Act, 1877," relating (*inter alia*) to attendance registers and returns, the payment of capitation allowance to Education Boards for the quarter ending on the 30th day of June, 1894, shall be according to the working average attendance of the quarter ending on the 31st day of March, 1894, as working average is defined by Order in Council dated the 5th day of July, 1887, and made under the provisions of the before-mentioned Act.

*Bonuses for Encouragement of New Zealand Hemp (Phormium tenax) Industry.—Notice No. 387.*

BONUS No. 1.

A BONUS of £1,750 is offered for a machine or process for dressing New Zealand hemp (*Phormium tenax*) which shall be an improvement on the machines or processes now in use, and which shall, after trial, be found to materially reduce the cost of production, improve the product, or increase the quantity of dressed fibre.

The following are the conditions:—

1. All applications for the bonus must be sent addressed to the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture, Wellington, and must reach him not later than the 30th August, 1894. Each application must be accompanied by a description of the machine or process, particularly stating improvements on present machines or processes, and also the cost at which the machine or process can be supplied.

2. The applicants must be prepared to submit their machines or processes to examination at such time and place as the Government may direct.

3. The Government shall appoint a committee of three or more experts, to whom all applications shall be submitted. Such committee shall, after perusal, state what machines or processes they deem worthy of consideration, and may inspect the same at any place within the colony; and, having so inspected the whole or any of them, may direct that the whole or any of them be brought for further trial to such place as they may think fit.

The cost of bringing the machines or appliances on to the ground, from within the colony, supplying the necessary shafting, motive-power, and buildings, to be defrayed by the Government. If any machine sent from beyond the colony is awarded the bonus or part thereof, then the cost of bringing such machine shall be borne by the Government.

The following shall be the basis of the test:—

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of green hemp to each machine or process as a test.

The committee shall take into consideration—

The time occupied by each machine or process in the operation;

The cost of labour and time required after the fibre has left the machine or process before it is ready for baling;

The percentage of dressed fibre and tow produced by each machine or process;

The cost of producing the same;

The cost of the machine, and the simplicity and durability of the working parts.

On completion of the tests the committee shall furnish a report to the Minister on all the machines or processes which they have examined or tested, and shall state,—

(1.) The machine or process which they consider on the whole the most efficient and economic.

(2.) Whether they consider that any machine or process tested so materially reduces the cost of production, or improves the product, as to be worthy of the whole bonus or of a part only.

(3.) Whether, in the event of no one machine or process being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus, and, if so, how much.

BONUS No. 2.

A bonus of £250 is offered for a process of utilising the waste products of the hemp.

The first three conditions of Bonus No. 1 to apply to this also.

The committee shall supply a sufficient and equal quantity of the waste products to each process as a test.

On completion of the tests the committee shall report to the Minister, and shall give the following particulars of each process: (a.) The nature of the article made. (b.) The quantity produced, and the cost of production. (c.) The value of the product. (d.) Whether any of the processes are of sufficient importance to warrant the Minister in giving (1) the whole, or (2) any part, of the bonus; (3) if a part only, how much.
