6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

1. THE lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto are first-class lands, and are divided into village-homestead allotments, open for selection on lease in perpetuity, under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act").

2. The day on which the lands shall be open for selection shall be Wednesday, the 19th day of September, 1894.

3. The rental stated in the First Schedule hereto shall be

the price at which the lands shall be open for selection.

4. Applications for leases shall be made in manner as provided in Part I. of the said Act; and all such applications shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Christchurch; and leases will be issued in accordance with the provisions of Part I. aforesaid.

5. Each applicant shall state his or her residence, occuration, and condition in life (namely whether married or

5. Each applicant shall state his or her residence, occupation, and condition in life (namely, whether married or single), and will be required to make the declaration prescribed in Schedule C to the said Act.

6. Each applicant shall also pay the first half-year's rent, together with the lease and registration fee, immediately the application has been approved or declared successful at the ballot.

7. All rents must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st days of January and July in each year, as provided in section 157 of the said Act; and the first half-year's rent is

payable as before provided.

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in each lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the said Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said

Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations.

9. No lessee shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than one allotment, and

10. No lessee shall hold more than one allotment, and such allotment shall be held for his sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case. provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

HEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Otamatea County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark adjacent the rate of the Palei Birary in Maintain of the loreshore and of the land below low-water mark aujacent thereto on the east side of the Pahi River, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect a wharf thereon, and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1940), the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1940), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the wharf: And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of the purpose for which the said foreshore and land below low-water mark are to be occupied: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the Council under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

4. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council

Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such 7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark occupied by

foreshore and of the land below low-water mark occupied by the wharf and slip, as shown on the plan M.D. 1934a.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen-years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not-assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister-first obtained. lege without first obtained.

4. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on

granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of three pounds, dating from the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

5. Every person shall at all reasonable times have free and full liberty to use the wharf and slip, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom, upon payment of the proper dues, and the company shall allow the slip to be used by Government vessels without charge other than the actual expenses incurred in taking the vessels up and letting them down, and the cost of labour supplied while on the slip.

The Governor, his staff and servants, and all officers in the Government service or employ, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, or their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf and slip with-

out payment.
7. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf and slip in good order and repair; and shall at all whan and she in good order and repair, and shall at an times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

8. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and slip and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the com-pany in New Zealand notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or slip, requiring the company, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause

the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law or regulation relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above highwater mark.

water mark.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand. 12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf or slip may cause through any default or neglect

on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf or slip for a period of thirty days;

(3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or

(4.) Fill to reach the surpressed field in clause four of these

(4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause four of these conditions;

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company and to all persons concerned or interested that company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges hereby granted to the company, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the wharf and slip, or either of them, by the company under the conditions hereinbefore set forth shall be deemed to be an acceptance by such company of all such conditions, and to be an agreement on the part of the company to observe the same.

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations here-inafter set forth with respect to indigenous fish inhabiting the waters of the colony herein mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations, and, with the like advice and consent, doth order that these regulations shall have force and effect in all waters in the colony.

REGULATIONS.

When a person is lawfully engaged in setting or placing is the person is lawfully engaged in setting or placing his nets for the purpose of taking indigenous fish, no person shall impede him by the process known as "blocking," whereby another person sets or places his nets outside, or round, or partly round the nets of the person first setting or placing his nets, so as to prevent fish getting through to such last mentioned nets.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, to be recovered as by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," is provided.

being entitled to the whole bonus, they deem any machine or process worthy of a part of the bonus,
