Terms and Conditions of Lease of Village-homestead Allotments in Taranaki.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of August, 1894.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the thirtieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto have been set apart under the said Act, and declared open for lease as village settlements, and it is expedient to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said lands shall be disposed of:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby fix the terms and conditions on which the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be disposed of by way of lease in perpetuity, and which said terms and conditions are set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and also doth direct that the lands in the said village settlements shall be divided into village-homestead allotments only.

This village is situate on the Waitotara River, about twenty-eight miles and a half from the township of that name. A formed bridle-road runs through most of the sections. The smaller ones consist of flat country and hill-slopes partly covered with scrub and light bush, some of them being partly clear and in grass; the soil is good. The larger sections are hill-slopes covered with ordinary forest, the soil averaging from fair to good.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

1. The lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto are first-class lands, and are divided into village-homestead allotments, open for selection on lease in perpetuity, under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act").
2. The day on which the lands shall be open for selection shall be Wednesday, the 31st day of October, 1894.
3. The rental stated in the First Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the lands shall be open for selection.
4. Applications for leases shall be made in manner as provided in Part I. of the said Act; and all such applications shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, New Plymouth; and leases will be issued in accordance with the provisions of Part I. aforesaid.
5. Each applicant shall state his or her residence, occupation, and condition in life (namely, whether married or single), and will be required to make the declaration prescribed in Schedule C to the said Act.

6. Each applicant shall pay the first half-year's rent, together with the lease and registration fee, immediately the application has been approved or declared successful at the ballot.

7. All rents must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st days of January and July in each year, as provided in section 157 of the said Act; and the first half-year's rent is payable as before provided.

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in each lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the said Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations.

9. No lessee shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than one allotment, and such allotment shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS application has been made to the Governor in Council by Maiharanui Maopo and Rewi Koruarua, the Native owners of the land described in the second column of the Schedule hereto, praying that the restrictions on the alienation of such land contained in the Land Transfer certificate bearing date the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, described in the first column of the said Schedule, may be removed: And whereas inquiry has been duly made by the Native Land Court, and the said Court has reported that the provisions of the law in that behalf have been complied with: And whereas it appears expedient to grant such application:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by "The Native Land Act, 1888," and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that all restrictions imposed by the said Land Transfer certificate on the alienation of the said land are hereby removed.

Licensing J. E. Taylor to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of the Ararata Creek, Manukau Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of September, 1894.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, John Edward Taylor, of Mangere, farmer (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore of the Ararata Creek, in Manukau Harbour, in order to build an embankment or dam across the said creek, for the purpose of utilising the action of the tide for motive-power to pump fresh water up to the Domain, and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1949), showing the place where it is intended to erect such embankment or dam, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the embankment or dam: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore in the position shown on the plan marked M.D. 1949, which is necessary for the erection of the embankment or dam in accordance with the plan marked M.D. 1949, and which said license shall be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such embankment or dam in accordance with the plan marked M.D. 1949, on the site shown on the said plan, which is deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter on demand an annual sum of one shilling, dating from the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
4. Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said embankment or dam without payment.
5. The licensee shall complete the erection of the said embankment or dam, in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 1949, within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.
6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned embankment or dam in good order and repair.
7. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said embankment or dam and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such embankment or dam, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee.

11. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said embankment or dam may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

12. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said embankment or dam; or
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. The erection of the embankment or dam shall be sufficient proof of the acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council, dated the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, of the same month, His Excellency the Governor in Council did, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," license Rutland Turner, of Wairoa South, to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark, in the Wairoa River, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf in the position shown on and in accordance with plans marked M.D. 1191 and 1192, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department:

And whereas the said Rutland Turner has sold the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by the said Order in Council to Robert Willis, of Papakura, and the said Robert Willis has applied for the revocation of the said Order in Council:

Further Portions of Westport Colliery Reserve set apart for Railway Purposes.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of September, 1894.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section three of "The Westland and Nelson Coalfields Administration Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1893," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, shall define such portions of the Westport Colliery Reserve, in addition to the portions thereof already set apart for railway purposes by an Order in Council of the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six (*Gazette*, 1876, page 200), as are likely to be required for railway purposes or other public purposes, and shall set apart such further portions for the aforesaid purposes accordingly:

And whereas it is desirable that the portions of the said reserve described in the Schedule hereto should be set apart as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby define the portions of the Westport Colliery Reserve mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto as likely to be required for railway purposes, and doth hereby set apart the same for railway purposes accordingly.

1274.—CECIL FRANCIS ADAMS, of Wellington, New Zealand, aged twenty years, for rescuing Percy Mater, aged thirty years, from drowning in the Wainuiomata River, on the 23rd September, 1893. Certificate of merit.

1276.—JAMES ALEXANDER BOOTH, of Whangaroa North, New Zealand, aged ten years, who rescued Edmund James Stewart, of the same place, aged six years, from drowning in the harbour at Whangaroa, on the 27th December, 1892. Bronze medal.

1308.—ERNEST WILLIAM MONTGOMERY, of Auckland, New Zealand, mariner, aged twenty-two years, for rescuing Maggie Bell, aged fifteen years, from drowning at Waitemata Harbour, on the night of the 2nd January, 1894. Montgomery, hearing the girl in the water, immediately plunged in with all his clothes on, and succeeded with some difficulty in rescuing her. Certificate of merit.

1309.—JOHN WILLIAMS, of Westport, New Zealand, labourer, aged thirty years, for rescuing George Abbott Wheatley, of the same place, aged five years, from drowning in the Buller River, on the 24th November, 1893. Williams, fully clothed, plunged into a strong current and rescued the child, who was floating down the stream. Williams had just recovered from a dislocated shoulder, and was obliged to call for assistance when returning with the child. Mr. P. Labbatt swam out and assisted him with his burden. Bronze medal.

1319.—CHARLES FULLEN, of Westport, New Zealand, schoolboy, aged thirteen years, who rescued William Coleman, of the same place, aged nine years, from drowning in Lake Fynn, on the 4th January, 1894. Certificate of merit.

1320/1.—HARAWIRA RENATA, aged thirty-nine years, and TE AWHATA WHANAKA, aged seventeen years, of Hawke's Bay, New Zealand, Maoris, who rescued Henry Lever, aged twenty-four years, and William Meade, aged twenty-three years, both of Hawke's Bay, from drowning in the Waraekakaha Creek, in the highest flood ever known, on the 4th December, 1893.

The bridge over the creek collapsed with the strain of the flood, precipitating three men who were on it into the raging torrent. One, Macfarlane, was swept away instantly and drowned. Meade gained precarious footing in the middle, about 200 yards down, and was rescued by Awhata, who swam out on horseback. The third man, Lever, was carried further down, though a strong swimmer, and after a severe struggle gained an island in the middle, where he was for an hour, when Renata, after several vain attempts, swam out and reached him in a very exhausted condition. Bronze medal each.

1325/6.—GEORGE POWELL BLANCHETT, aged thirty years, and JOHN HAY, aged twenty-three years, gunners of the Permanent Artillery, Lyttelton, New Zealand, who rescued Fitzroy George Hamilton, aged twenty-seven years, and attempted to rescue John Mackenzie (drowned), who were knocked overboard from the steam-launch in Lyttelton Harbour on the 28th November, 1893.
