WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section VV of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of by lease in perpetuity:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the

power and authority conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands known as the Waiwera Special Settlement Association Block, described in the Schedule to the said regulations, shall be disposed of, that is to say: is to say :-

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these regulations, unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"Association" means the Waiwera Special Settlement Association, being a body of persons, not less than nineteen in number, voluntarily associated together at Pahiatua, in the Provincial District of Wellington, for the purpose of taking up the land as a special settlement of farm homesteads:

"Land" means the land described in the Schedule, set apart for a special settlement, to be dealt with under these regulations:

"Settler" means any member of the association or other person, not being a married woman, leasing land under these regulations:

"Minister" means the Minister of Lands for the time being, or any member of the Executive acting for him:

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Wellington:

"Secretary" means the secretary of the association for the time being, and shall include any person acting in that capacity, and, if there shall be no secretary, then the chairman of the association:

"Substantial improvements of a permanent character"

ibstantial improvements of a permanent character" mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of bush, gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivation, planting with trees or live hedges, the laying-out and cultivation of gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or watertanks, constructing water-races, in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of any building: the erection of any building:
"Cultivation" means—

(1.) Fencing the land with timber or other durable materials, not being a brush fence; or
(2.) Breaking up and laying down the same in English or other cultivated grass; or
(3.) Breaking up and planting or sowing root or other crops therein:

other crops therein:

"Lease" means a lease in perpetuity in terms of
Part III. of "The Land Act, 1892."

2. The block of land to be dealt with under these regulations has been surveyed into sections of not more than 320 acres each, and the number of persons to be located thereon shall not be less than nineteen.

3. The allotments of sections to members of the association shall be made at such time and in such manner as the association may, with the consent of the Commissioner,

determine.

determine.

4. The land shall be disposed of by lease at an annual rental of 4 per cent. on the capital value fixed by the Minister.

5. One-third of the rents paid from time to time shall, for the first fifteen years, be paid to the local body of the district charged with the construction and maintenance of roads in the district, for the expenditure on roads in or leading to the block. Such expenditure to be first sanctioned by the Land Board for the Land District of Wellington.

6. All rents and moneys required to be paid for the land under these terms and conditions shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue, and receipts given by him shall be sufficient discharge for the payment of the moneys therein respectively acknowledged to have been received.

7. The settlers shall be members of the association, and no settler shall be under seventeen years of age.

7. The settlers shall be members of the association, and no settler shall be under seventeen years of age.

8. The secretary shall inform the Commissioner of the names of the settlers; pay a deposit of 10s. per member, and also furnish the Commissioner from time to time with minutes of proceedings of the association if so required.

9. The original or amended list of members, signed by the secretary of the association, and sent to the Commissioner, shall be primâ facie evidence that the persons claiming to select land are members of the association.

10. Each settler shall put on the land comprised in his

10. Each settler shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements as follows:—

(a.) Within one year from the date of his lease, to a

value equal to ten per centum of the price of the land;
(b.) Within two years from the date of his lease, to a

value equal to another ten per centum of the price of the land;

(c.) And thereafter, but within six years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another ten per centum of the price of the land;
And in addition thereto shall, within six years from the date of his lease, put substantial improvements of a permanent character to the value of £1 per acre.

11. Residence and occupation of the land shall be in accordance with Part III. of "The Land Act, 1892."

12. No person who is the owner in fee or leasehold of any land in New Zealand which, together with the land included in his application or transfer under these regulations, would exceed 320 acres, and no person who has made an arrangement or agreement to permit any one, save his son or daughter, to acquire by purchase or otherwise the allotment in respect of which his application is made, shall be entitled to become a settler under these regulations.

13. Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations.

13. Any settler under these regulations.

13. Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Land Board of the district, forfeit his interest in the land selected, and the land shall thereafter be dealt with as ordinary Crown land; and these conditions shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture.

14. The association may make such rules and regulations from time to time as it would be recovered.

from time to time as it may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commissioner.

15. In case any doubt shall arise as to the sufficiency of the compliance with these regulations, with reference to the selection, occupation, or improvement of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder respectively, the same shall be settled by the Land Board.

16. Excepting as expressly modified by these regulations, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and its amendments shall be deemed to have full force and effect over and upon the land herein referred to, and shall, mutatis mutandis, be read as if these regulations formed part of the Act.

"Importer" includes any owner or other person for the time being possessed of or beneficially interested in any goods imported into the colony, and also any person acting or purporting to act as agent for or otherwise on behalf of any such owner or other per-

"Income-tax" means income-tax for the time being

prescribed by law:
"Person" includes firm and company:
"Principal" means a principal within the meaning of

said section nineteen:
"Ship" means every description of vessel used in navigation not propelled by oars.

Foreign Traders.

2. Every agent shall make returns in such forms, at such times, and for such periods as the Commissioner may require; and, as respects goods the orders for which are procured by the agent on behalf of the principal, every such return shall show,—

(1.) The total invoice price of the goods comprised in every order procured and of every order executed as aforesaid, with the name and address of the person giving the order;
(2.) The name and address of the principal on whose

behalf each such order is procured; and
(3.) Such further particulars as the Commissioner may from time to time require.

3. As respects goods received on consignment from abroad for sale or disposal within the colony, the return to be made

for sale or disposal within the colony, the return to be made by the agent shall show the total sums received or receivable for the goods so sold or disposed of, with the name and address of the principal or principals respectively.

4. (1.) Where any agent or principal fails to pay any income-tax assessed to the agent pursuant to said section nineteen or these regulations, the amount due in respect of tax shall, to the extent of the defaulting principal's interest in any goods at any time arriving in the colony consequent on any sale or disposal made or any order procured by any agent on account of the defaulting principal, be a charge on such goods, and the Collector shall have power to detain such goods until the amount has been paid.

(2.) For the purposes of this clause the Collector shall have power to require the importer of any goods to produce to him all books, papers, or correspondence, and to answer any questions, and on oath if the Collector thinks fit, relating to any such goods.

to any such goods.

5. (1.) Where any agent fails to make returns, or where the principal sells or disposes of in the colony any goods and the whereabouts of the agent is not known, any Collector shall estimate the value of such goods, and shall assess the profit thereon to the principal at such sums, being not more than twenty five pounds in cover one hypothesis. than twenty-five pounds in every one hundred pounds of such value, as the Collector may think just.

(2.) Income-tax shall thereupon be payable on the amount of such assessed profit, and the Collector may require payment thereof, and shall have power to detain such goods until payment is made.

(3.) It shall be lawful for such Collector, on entry being passed for such goods to require the importer or consigned.

(3.) It shall be lawful for such Collector, on entry being passed for such goods, to require the importer or consignee to produce a copy of the order for such goods, and to make a statutory declaration as to whether or not any such goods were ordered through an agent in the colony, and as to such other particulars as may be required.

6. (1.) It shall be lawful for any importer or consignee to pay to the Collector the amount owing by any principal in respect of income-tax; and every such importer or consignee shall be entitled to a certificate from the Collector as to the amount so paid.

the amount so paid.

(2.) Every such certificate shall be in satisfaction, pro tanto, of any claim on the part of the principal against the importer or consignee.

Shipping.

7. (1.) When any person outside the colony, or whose chief office is outside the colony (hereinafter called "the principal"), carries on business in the colony as owner or charterer of any ship, such principal's agent in the colony shall be assessed and be liable to income-tax on five pounds in every one hundred pounds of the total amount payable to such principal or to his agent (whether such amount be payable in the colony or beyond the colony) in respect of passengers, live-stock, and goods shipped in the colony and carried by any such ship.

carried by any such ship.

(2.) Every agent shall furnish returns in such form, at such times, and for such periods as the Commissioner may require

in order to enable such assessment to be made.

8. (1.) In all cases where the principal has no recognised agent in the colony other than the master of the ship, or when the agent fails to make returns, the Commissioner or Collector may make such assessment from such information Collector may make such assessment from such information as may be available to him, and the income-tax thereon shall be payable to the Collector prior to the clearance of such ship; and the Collector shall have power to detain the clearance until such payment is made.

(2.) The master or agent upon paying the same shall be entitled to a certificate from the Collector that the amount so paid has been paid under the provisions of these regulations, and such certificate shall be a sufficient warrant to the master or agent for the amount so paid.

General.

9. Every assessment made by any Collector shall be subject

to the approval of the Commissioner.

10. All income tax payable under clauses five and eight of these regulations shall be due and payable immediately upon the assessment being made.

11. All amounts received by any Collector in respect of income-tax shall be paid into the Consolidated Fund, and he

shall account to the Commissioner therefor.

12. If any agent, importer, consignee, or other person shall refuse to make any return, or to produce any book, paper, or correspondence, or to answer any questions on oath, or to make any statutory declaration, pursuant to these regulations, he shall in each instance be liable to a penalty of not less than £20 and not more than £50.

Regulations as to Survey of Steamers.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section one hundred and eighty-five of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," I, Joseph George Ward, the Minister having charge of the Marine Department and of the administration of the said Act, do hereby make the following regulations:-

REGULATIONS.

1. It shall be the duty of the master and also of the chief engineer of every steamship to at all times hold available for inspection by the Engineer-Surveyor, and for that purpose to produce to him whenever requested so to do, the engineer's log-book, and all papers or returns which show the revolutions of the vessel's engines, the steam-pressure, and the vacuum carried under ordinary full-speed conditions of the vessel.

2. In all sea-going steamships the propelling engines of over fifty indicated horse-power which are not fitted with indicator gear shall be fitted with all the necessary pipes,

cocks, and connecting gear on each engine to enable indicator diagrams to be taken.

3. In all sea-going steamships diagrams shall be taken under ordinary full-speed conditions from each engine of every steamship by the chief engineer or other the engineer in charge, at least once every three months during which the vessel is at sea, or at such other intervals as the Engineer-Surveyor may from time to time prescribe. Such diagrams shall be in duplicate, and shall show the date when taken, the scale, state of the weather, immersion of the vessel, diameter of the cylinder, length of stroke, boiler-pressure or receiver-pressure or vacuum, and the number of pressure or receiver-pressure or vacuum, and the number of revolutions made per minute. All such diagrams shall be accessible to the Engineer-Surveyor, and one duplicate of each set shall be supplied to him for his use.

"I hereby undertake, in consideration of sheep consigned by me by rail in double-floored trucks being charged at the single-floor truck rates, to forward by rail all sheep despatched by me to places served by the railway."

For distances of 100 miles and over, cattle and sheep, certified by the consignor to be bond fide store stock, not consigned for slaughter, will be charged for the first 100 miles 50s. per truck for the first thirteen trucks, and for each additional truck 30s. For each additional mile, 3d. per truck per mile will be charged. For distances under 100 miles, the charge as for 100 miles will be made if lower than at classified rates.

the lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to a lessee under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said

provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to a lessee under these regulations.

9. No lessee shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than one allotment, and such allotment shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.
