A PROCLAMATION.

Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees, or either of them.

11. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said warehouse may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

WHEREAS, by "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time which shall have general force and effect throughout the colony, or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas certain regulations were made by the Governor in Council on the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, under "The Fisheries Conserva-

tion Act, 1884," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act 1884 Amendment Act, 1887": And whereas it is expedient to revoke certain of the said

and whereas it is expedient to revoke certain of the said regulations which were made by the Governor in Council on the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and to make the regulations hereinafter set forth prescribing a close season for the fish of the species of Mugil known as mullet or kanae, inhabiting the waters of

Mugil known as mullet or kanae, inhabiting the waters of the colony hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke that part of the first regulation made by the said Order in Council of the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, commencing with the word "Maori" and ending with the word "community," and also the regulation numbered three made by the said Order in Council; and in pursuance and exercise of the said powers, and with the like advice and consent, His Excellency the Governor of the colony doth hereby make the following regulations, to have force and effect within the waters hereafter specified in the said regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. The period from the twentieth day of December in one year to the twentieth day of March in the next succeeding year, both days inclusive, is hereby prescribed a close season in respect of the fish of the species of Mugil known as mullet or kanae, during which close season it shall be unlawful for any person to take any such fish contrary to the provisions of the said Act.

2. These regulations shall have force and effect in all waters, as defined by the said Act, in the North Island of New Zealand bounded by a line commencing at Cape Wiwiki, and proceeding seawards on a bearing of N. 45° E. for a distance of three miles; thence running generally parallel to and three miles distant from the coast-line to a line bearing N. 45° E. from the North Cape; thence along the said line in the direction of the North Cape to the high-water mark of the sea; and thence along a line following the high-water mark of the sea along the coast to Cape Wiwiki, and following the said high-water mark up the tidal rivers, and crossing such rivers at the points where the tidal effect terminates. 2. These regulations shall have force and effect in all crossing sucterminates.

3. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds nor less than twenty shillings, to be recovered as is by the said Act provided.

And whereas the Borough Council of Pahiatua has made application to the Governor to authorise the construction of the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said bridge"), and to apportion the cost of constructing the said bridge between the said Council and the Pahiatua County Council:

And whereas the said Borough and County Councils have agreed that the erection of a bridge over the Mangatainoka River at the Mangahao Road is necessary to both districts, and the plans and estimated cost of the said bridge and protective works have likewise been agreed upon, and the relative proportions of cost determined, and no objection made thereto by the Pahiatua County Council:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that the work should be done:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby authorise the Borough Council of Pahiatua to construct the said bridge; and I do hereby declare that a proportion of the cost of constructing the said bridge—namely, seven

hundred pounds—shall be borne by the County Council of Pahiatua, and that a proportion of the cost of constructing the said bridge—namely, sixteen hundred pounds—shall be borne by the Pahiatua Borough Council, and such proportions shall be paid by the said local authorities accordingly.

Regulations for Licensing Colonial Pilots.

GLASGOW, Governor. By his Deputy, JAMES PRENDERGAST.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section thirty-one of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act Amendment Act, 1894," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby prescribe the following regulations for the licensing of colonial pilots:—

REGULATIONS.

Licenses without Examination.

Licenses without Examination.

1. Any person who, within three years prior to the 1st January, 1895, has, for a continuous period of not less than twelve months, either commanded a vessel of not less than 300 tons register trading on the coasts of New Zealand, or been engaged in piloting similar vessels on the coasts of New Zealand, may, subject to the approval of the Marine Department, receive a license as colonial pilot without undergoing examination, provided that he has held during the said period of twelve months a certificate of competency or service of a grade not lower than that of master home trade, and satisfies the Marine Department as to his sobriety and general trustworthiness.

Licenses by Examination.

2. An applicant for a colonial pilot's license shall be not more than fifty years of age, and must hold a certificate of competency of a grade not lower than that of master ordi-

nary (foreign going).

3. He must have served continuously for either one year as master, or three years as first mate, or five years as second

mate, of a steamship or sailing-vessel of not less than 300 tons register, trading on the coast of New Zealand.

4. He must pass an examination before an Examiner of Masters and Mates in the following subjects:—

(a.) In the colour test as prescribed in the regulations for the examination of masters and mates.

(b) Knowledge of the number, description, and charac-

(b.) Knowledge of the number, description, and characteristics of the New Zealand lights, and as to which of them are connected with the telegraph

which of them are connected with the telegraph system of the colony.

(c.) Knowledge of magnetic and true courses between all prominent headlands.

(d.) Knowledge of dangers lying off the coasts, &c., and the anchorages, harbours of refuge, and road-

steads on the coasts.

(e.) Knowledge of times of high water on the New Zealand coasts, the direction and set of the tides, ebb and flood, and of the currents.

5. The Minister shall appoint the Examiner, and fix the

time and place for the examination.

General.

6. Every application for a colonial pilot's license shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Marine Department.

7. Every applicant must submit, with his application, his master's certificate, a satisfactory certificate as to his coastal service, and a satisfactory certificate of good conduct and sobriety during the twelve months immediately preceding the date of his application.

8. Every applicant must have served in vessels trading on the New Zealand coasts within the five years immediately

preceding the date of his application.

9. An applicant whose service has been in Her Majesty's navy, who does not hold a certificate as master ordinary, must have obtained the rank of navigating sub-lieutenant. If he cannot show the service required under Regulation No. 3, he must have served two years within the last five years next prior to his application in one of Her Majesty's vessels stationed in New Zealand in a capacity not lower than that of navigating sub-lieutenant.

10. A fee of £1 will be charged for each examination, half

of which will be returned in case of failure to pass.

11. An annual fee of £3 will be charged for every license

issued under these regulations.

12. The licenses shall be issued by the Secretary of the Marine Department at Wellington, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto.

13. Every license shall continue in force for twelve months only, but on the expiration of that period the holder will be entitled to a fresh license on payment of the aforesaid

be entitled to a fresh license on payment of the aforesaid annual fee of £3.

14. All the provisions of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," relating to investigations instituted under section 119 into alleged incompetency or misconduct, and to preliminary inquiries and formal investigations made under sections 237 and 240 into shipping casualties, shall apply to colonial pilots as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as to masters and mates.
