Regulations for the Marton No. 4 Special Settlement Association.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this fourth day of March, 1895.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of by lease in perpetuity:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands known as the Marton No. 4 Special Settlement Association Block, described in the Schedule to the said regulations, shall be disposed of, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these regulations, unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"Association" means the Marton No. 4 Special Settlement Association, being a body of persons, not less than thirty in number, voluntarily associated together at Marton, in the Provincial District of Wellington, for the purpose of taking up the land as a special settlement of farm homesteads:

"Land" means the land described in the Schedule, set apart for a special settlement, to be dealt with under these regulations:

"Settler" means any member of the association or other person, not being a married woman, leasing land under these regulations:

"Receiver of Land Revenue" means Receiver of Land Revenue at Auckland, or other officer for the time being acting as such:

"Minister" means the Minister of Lands for the time being, or any member of the Executive acting for him:

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Wellington:

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the association for the time being, and shall include any person acting

in that capacity, and, if there shall be no secretary, then the chairman of the association:

"Substantial improvements of a permanent character" mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of bush, gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivation, planting with trees or live hedges, the laying-out and cultivation of gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of any building:

"Cultivation" means—

(1.) Fencing the land with timber or other durable materials, not being a brush fence; or

(2.) Breaking up and laying down the same in English or other cultivated grass; or

(3.) Breaking up and planting or sowing root or other crops therein:

"Lease" means a lease in perpetuity in terms of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1892."

2. The block of land to be dealt with under these regulations has been surveyed into sections of not more than 320 acres each, and the number of persons to be located thereon shall not be less than thirty.

3. The allotments of sections to members of the association shall be made at such time and in such manner as the association may, with the consent of the Commissioner, determine.

4. The land shall be disposed of by lease at an annual rental of 4 per cent. on the capital value fixed by the Minister.

5. One-third of the rents paid from time to time shall, for the first fifteen years, be paid to the local body of the district charged with the construction and maintenance of roads in the district, for the expenditure on roads in or leading to the block. Such expenditure to be first sanctioned by the Land Board for the Land District of Wellington.

6. All rents and moneys required to be paid for the land under these terms and conditions shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue, and receipts given by him shall be sufficient discharge for the payment of the moneys therein respectively acknowledged to have been received.

7. The settlers shall be members of the association, and no settler shall be under seventeen years of age.

8. The secretary shall inform the Commissioner of the names of the settlers; pay a deposit of 10s. per member, and also furnish the Commissioner from time to time with minutes of proceedings of the association if so required.

9. The original or amended list of members, signed by the secretary of the association, and sent to the Commissioner, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the persons claiming to select land are members of the association.

10. Each settler shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements, as follows:—

- (a.) Within one year from the date of his lease, to a value equal to ten per centum of the price of the land;
- (b.) Within two years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another ten per centum of the price of the land;
- (c.) And thereafter, but within six years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another ten per centum of the price of the land;

And in addition thereto shall, within six years from the date of his lease, put substantial improvements of a permanent character to the value of £1 per acre.

11. Residence and occupation of the land shall be in accordance with Part III. of "The Land Act, 1892."

12. No person who is the owner in fee or leasehold of any land in New Zealand which, together with the land included in his application or transfer under these regulations, would exceed 320 acres, and no person who has made an arrangement or agreement to permit any one, save his son or daughter, to acquire by purchase or otherwise the allotment in respect of which his application is made, shall be entitled to become a settler under these regulations.

13. Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Land Board of the district, forfeit his interest in the land selected, and the land shall thereafter be dealt with as ordinary Crown lands; and these conditions shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture.

14. The association may make such rules and regulations from time to time as it may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commissioner.

15. In case any doubt shall arise as to the sufficiency of the compliance with these regulations, with reference to the selection, occupation, or improvement of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder respectively, the same shall be settled by the Land Board.

16. Excepting as expressly modified by these regulations, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and its amendments shall be deemed to have full force and effect over and upon the land herein referred to, and shall, *mutatis mutandis*, be read as if these regulations formed part of the Act.

All that area, situated in Blocks VII., X., XI., XII., and XV., Manganui Survey District, containing 10,000 acres, exclusive of roads and reserves, bounded on the north-east by the Gladstone S.F.H. Block; on the south-west by land recently thrown open for selection in Blocks XI., XII., XV., and XVI., Manganui Survey District; on the south-west by the Marton No. 3 F.H.A. Block; and on the north-west by the Marton No. 5 F.H.A. Block.

"Land" means the land described in the Schedule, set apart for a special settlement, to be dealt with under these regulations:

"Settler" means any member of the association or other person, not being a married woman, leasing land under these regulations:

"Receiver of Land Revenue" means Receiver of Land Revenue at Wellington, or other officer for the time being acting as such:

"Minister" means the Minister of Lands for the time being, or any member of the Executive acting for him:

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Wellington:

"Secretary" means the secretary of the association for the time being, and includes any person acting in that capacity, and, if there be no secretary, means the chairman of the association:

3. The allotments of sections to members of the association shall be made at such time and in such manner as the association may, with the consent of the Commissioner, determine.

4. The land shall be disposed of by lease at an annual rental of 4 per cent, on the capital value fixed by the Minister.

5. One-third of the rents paid from time to time shall for the first fifteen years be paid to the local body of the district charged with the construction and maintenance of roads in the district, for the expenditure on roads in or leading to the block. Such expenditure to be first sanctioned by the Land Board for the Land District of Wellington.

Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Land Board of the district, forfeit his interest in the land selected, and the Commissioner shall cause such interest to be again open for selection by a *bona fide* settler; and these conditions shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture and reallocation. Any settler so selecting shall be deemed to stand in the position of the original settler.

14. The association may make such rules and regulations from time to time as it may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commissioner.

15. In case any doubt shall arise as to the sufficiency of the compliance with these regulations, with reference to the selection, occupation, or improvement of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder respectively, the same shall be settled by the Land Board.

16. Excepting as expressly modified by these regulations, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and its amendments shall be deemed to have full force and effect in respect of the land herein referred to.

Alterations and Additions to the Scale of Fares and Charges in Force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

PART I.—PASSENGERS: GENERAL FARES AND REGULATIONS.

School Excursions.

31. First-class ordinary return tickets, available for any ordinary trains, will be issued at the option of the department to the managers of school parties numbering not less than twenty scholars at the rate of one ticket for every four scholars not exceeding fifteen years of age, and of one ticket for every two scholars over fifteen years of age, or every two

bonâ fide teachers accompanying the party. No fractional part of a ticket will be issued.

Although first-class tickets will be issued, first-class carriages will not be guaranteed.

Excursion tickets at the following fares will be issued at the option of the department to school parties numbering not less than twenty scholars:—

With every nine scholars for whom fares are paid under this regulation one child (who would not otherwise be able to join the excursion, and who by exemplary conduct, application, and regular attendance merits the concession) may be carried free on the certificate of the teacher.

Tickets for school excursions will be available for return on the day of issue only.

In the case of small school parties, three days' notice should be given to the District Manager, and ten days' notice in the case of large excursions.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 400, against 422 in January, a decrease of 22. The deaths in February were 146, a decrease of 47 on the number in January. Of the total deaths, males contributed 69; females, 77. Sixty-nine of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 47.26 per cent. of the whole number; 57 of these were under 1 year of age. There were 17 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Two men of 84 and 85, and two women of 66 and 85, died at Auckland; three men of 67, 70, and 84 at Wellington; three men of 72, 79, and 90, and two women of 69 and 74, at Christchurch; three men of 66, 67, and 79, and two women of 66 and 77, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

It will be seen that by including the suburban boroughs the death-rate for last month is lowered at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raised at Christchurch. The rates for February are,—

Including suburbs, the rate at Christchurch is the highest and that of Dunedin the lowest. In three out of the four centres (Christchurch being the exception) the rates are lower than in January.

Specific Febrile and Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths during February at the four centres from this class of diseases numbered 36, against 35 for January and 18 in December of 1894. Of 36 deaths last month, 24 were from diarrhoeal diseases: 11 at Auckland, 3 at Wellington, 8 at Christchurch, and 2 at Dunedin. Whooping-cough caused two deaths: 1 at Auckland and 1 at Christchurch. Diphtheria is observed as fatal in one case at Wellington, and typhoid-fever accounts for five deaths, 3 of which were at Auckland. The remaining deaths were 3 from syphilis and 1 from septic poisoning.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality from these complaints was much lighter in February than in the two previous months. The deaths were 25, against 36 in January and 32 in December. Deaths by cancer fell from 14 in January to 6 in February, and those by phthisis from 12 to 10. There was 1 death from diabetes in February.

Local Diseases.—The total of deaths is 61, against 87 in January, a decrease of 26. Deaths by diseases of the nervous system (including apoplexy, paralysis, &c.) fell from 24 to 15; by diseases of the circulatory system (heart-disease, &c.) from 14 to 12; by diseases of the respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.) from 13 to 3; and by diseases of the digestive system from 27 to 19. The remaining deaths in this class in February were 2 from diseases of the lymphatic system, 6 from diseases of the urinary system (Bright's, 3 deaths), 3 from diseases of the reproductive system, and 1 from disease of integuments.

Violent Deaths.—These numbered 5 altogether, 4 by accident or negligence and 1 by suicide. A child of 5 years was burnt to death; a woman found in a sewer, believed to have been drowned; an infant was choked by obstruction of air-passages; and a female of 21 years killed by shock consequent on an operation. The suicide was committed by a clerk aged 59 years, who hanged himself while temporarily insane.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
