WHEREAS it has been made to appear that certain things required to be done by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," in connection with the making and revision of the burgess lists or rolls of the Borough of Karori cannot be done by or within the time required by the said Act:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken for a public work, to wit,

the construction of drainage-works in Aorangi Drainage District:

And whereas the said lands are held or occupied by Native owners under a title which is not derived from the Crown: And whereas a map in duplicate has been prepared of the said lands by the Aorangi Drainage Board, as required by the eighty-eighth section of "The Public Works Act, 1894":

Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of a Portion of a Reserve in Wellington Land District.

WHEREAS by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to make, change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in Her Majesty or the Governor for any of the pur-

poses named in Class II. of the Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and in the case of any reserve made under the authority of section one hundred and forty-four of "The Land Act, 1877," if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserve or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one or more purposes named in the said Class II., the Governor may, by notice gazetted, declare his intention to make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the portion of the reserves described in the second column of the Schedule hereto from that named in the first column of the said Schedule to that named in the third column of the said Schedule respectively.

COOK STRAIT ENTRANCE TO QUEEN CHARLOTTE SOUND.

Marine Department,
Wellington, N.Z., 19th April, 1895.

THE following are the particulars of the recent survey made by Mr. Perham of the passage between Jackson's Head and the Beacon:—

The small rock (Muir Rock), which shows 3ft. above high-water mark, lies north of Jackson's Head, distant 40ft. From Muir Rock draw a straight line to the Beacon, which bears N. 29° E., distant 1,650ft.

The Hawea Rock is 330ft. distant from Muir Rock, and is nearly on the above-mentioned straight line.

A rock (Perham Rock) has been discovered in the fairway. From Muir Rock to Perham Rock the distance is 730ft., and from the Beacon to Perham Rock the distance is 920ft. Perham Rock is 80ft. E.S.E. of the above-mentioned straight line.

The Hinemoa Rock is 460ft. from the Beacon, and is 90ft. E.S.E. of the above-mentioned straight line.

At a distance of 260ft. from the Beacon, and nearly on the above-mentioned straight line, another rock (Conway Rock) has been discovered.

The depth of water on the rocks herein mentioned at low-water spring-tides is as follows: Hawea Rock, 2½ fathoms; Perham Rock, 3½ fathoms; Hinemoa Rock, 2½ fathoms; and Conway Rock, 1½ fathoms. Vessels should not pass between Hinemoa Rock and the Beacon, or between Hawea Rock and the mainland, as there are innumerable rocks in the vicinity with very little water on them.

There is a good passage 800ft. wide between Hinemoa Rock and Hawea Rock in mid-channel suitable for vessels of light draught, but it is recommended that this passage should not be used by vessels drawing over 12ft. of water owing to the strong tidal currents that prevail, and the uncertainty of their direction at the different stages of the tide, which are likely to take a vessel out of her proper course.

The bearings are all correct magnetic.

A chart is now being prepared, which, when completed, can be obtained at the principal Customhouses in the colony.

BONUS ON STARCH MANUFACTURED IN NEW ZEALAND.—AMENDED NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a bonus of two pounds (£2) a ton will be paid on 100 tons of starch manufactured in the Colony of New Zealand in each of the years 1893 and 1894.

CONDITIONS.

1. Notice of intention to claim the bonus for 100 tons in 1893 must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1893. Notice of intention to claim the bonus for 100 tons in 1894 must be given in the same manner not later than the 31st December, 1894.
2. The claims must be made respectively before the 31st December, 1893 and 1894.
3. The first claimant who proves to the satisfaction of the Government that he has fulfilled all the conditions is to be the recipient of the bonus.
4. Evidence to be produced of such a nature as will enable an officer appointed by the Government to certify that the above-stated quantity in each year has been actually made, sold, and delivered.
5. The bonus to be paid only on the certificate of such officer.

Bonus for the Manufacture of Potassium Cyanide.

Department of Industries and Commerce,

Wellington, 17th January, 1895.

NOTICE is hereby given that a bonus of £1,000 will be paid for the erection of a plant and the manufacture in New Zealand of the first 200 tons of crude cyanide of potassium from colonial produce.

1. The plant must be capable of producing at least 70 tons of crude cyanide of potassium annually.
2. The crude cyanide of potassium so manufactured shall contain at least 70 per cent. of *potassium cyanide*.

3. The bonus will be paid in two equal instalments, the first instalment being payable on the production of the first 100 tons, and the second instalment on the production of the second 100 tons, of crude cyanide of potassium containing the required percentage of *potassium cyanide*.

4. On the completion of the plant, notice in writing must be sent to the Minister of Industries and Commerce, Wellington, who will appoint an officer to inspect the same, together with the raw material then available from which the cyanide of potassium is proposed to be manufactured.

5. The officer so appointed shall from time to time inspect the process of manufacture, in order that he may satisfy himself that the whole of the cyanide of potassium is being manufactured from material of New Zealand production; and before any bonus is paid such officer will be required to certify that he is satisfied the crude cyanide of potassium is the product of New Zealand material only, and that it contains the required percentage of *potassium cyanide*.

6. The bonus must be claimed for the first 100 tons on or before the 31st March, 1897, and for the second 100 tons on or before the 30th September, 1898.
