COOK STRAIT ENTRANCE TO QUEEN CHARLOTTE SOUND.

Marine Department,
Wellington, N.Z., 19th April, 1895.

The following are the particulars of the recent survey made by Mr. Perham of the passage between Jackson's Head and the Beacon:
The small rock (Marine)

The small rock (Muir Rock), which shows 3ft. above highwater mark, lies north of Jackson's Head, distant 40ft. From Muir Rock draw a straight line to the Beacon, which bears N. 29° E., distant 1,650ft.

The Hawea Rock is 330ft. distant from Muir Rock, and is

nearly on the above-mentioned straight line.

A rock (Perham Rock) has been discovered in the fairway. From Muir Rock to Perham Rock the distance is 730ft., and from the Beacon to Perham Rock the distance is 920ft. Perham Rock is 80ft. E.S.E. of the above-mentioned straight

The Hinemoa Rock is 460ft. from the Beacon, and is 90ft. E.S.E. of the above-mentioned straight line.
At a distance of 260ft. from the Beacon, and nearly on the

above-mentioned straight line, another rock (Conway Rock) has been discovered.

The depth of water on the rocks herein mentioned at lowwater spring-tides is as follows: Hawea Rock, 2½ fathoms; Perham Rock, 3½ fathoms; Hinemoa Rock, 2½ fathoms; and Conway Rock, 1½ fathoms. Vessels should not pass between Hinemoa Rock and the Beacon, or between Hawea Rock and the mainland, as there are innumerable rocks in the vicinity

the mainland, as there are innumerable rocks in the vicinity with very little water on them.

There is a good passage 800ft. wide between Hinemoa Rock and Hawea Rock in mid-channel suitable for vessels of light draught, but it is recommended that this passage should not be used by vessels drawing over 12ft. of water owing to the strong tidal currents that prevail, and the uncertainty of their direction at the different stages of the tide, which are likely to take a vessel out of her proper course.

The bearings are all correct magnetic.

A chart is now being prepared, which, when completed, can be obtained at the principal Customhouses in the colony.

Bonus for the Manufacture of Potassium Cyanide.

Notice is hereby given that a bonus of £1,000 will be
paid for the erection of a plant and the manufacture
in New Zealand of the first 200 tons of crude cyanide of
potassium from colonial produce.

1. The plant must be capable of producing at least 70
tons of crude cyanide of potassium annually.

2. The crude cyanide of potassium so manufactured shall
contain at least 70 per cent. of potassium cyanide.

3. The bonus will be paid in two equal instalments, the first instalment being payable on the production of the first 100 tons, and the second instalment on the production of

100 tons, and the second instalment on the production of the second 100 tons, of crude cyanide of potassium containing the required percentage of potassium cyanide.

4. On the completion of the plant, notice in writing must be sent to the Minister of Industries and Commerce, Wellington, who will appoint an officer to inspect the same, together with the raw material then available from which the cyanide of potassium is proposed to be manufactured.

5. The officer so appointed shall from time to time inspect the process of manufacture, in order that he may satisfy himself that the whole of the cyanide of potassium is being manufactured from material of New Zealand production; and before any bonus is paid such officer will be required to certify that he is satisfied the crude cyanide of potassium is the product of New Zealand material only, and that it contains the required percentage of potassium cyanide.

6. The bonus must be claimed for the first 100 tons on or before the 31st March, 1897, and for the second 100 tons on or before the 30th September, 1898.
