*Vesting Control of Bridge at Cromwell in the Vincent County Council, and apportioning the Cost of Reconstruction and Maintenance.*

(L.S.) GLASGOW, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed over or across any river or arm of the sea shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what part, of the cost, whether theretofore

incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge, is to be provided and paid by any local authority, and, if so, by what local authority; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid direct how and when and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may from time to time, with the view of determining whether it is expedient to vest the exclusive care, control, management, and maintenance of any such bridge in any local authority, direct any person to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as "the said bridge," and what proportion of the cost of reconstructing the said bridge theretofore incurred should be paid by any, and, if so, which, local authority or authorities: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor after due inquiry his opinion as to the matters respecting which he was appointed to report:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct that the said bridge as described in the Schedule hereto, and known as the "Cromwell Bridge," shall, from and after the date of the public notification of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care and control and management of the Vincent County Council; and in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of reconstructing the said bridge already incurred by the Vincent County Council—namely, five thousand three hundred and sixty-five pounds eleven shillings and sevenpence, less a sum of two thousand six hundred and eighty-two pounds fifteen shillings and ninepence contributed by the Government towards the cost of reconstructing the said bridge, and less a sum of one hundred and eighteen pounds nineteen shillings and tenpence, being proceeds of sale of old bridge-material—shall be borne by the Vincent County Council in the proportion of forty-three forty-sevenths, and by the Cromwell Borough Council in the proportion of four forty-sevenths of the cost aforesaid:

And I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge hereafter shall be borne by the said local bodies in the said proportions respectively:

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Borough Council of Cromwell shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the borough funds of the Borough Council within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the said Vincent County Council, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said County Council for and on account of such county:

And I do hereby declare that nothing in this Proclamation contained shall be deemed or taken to alter or prejudicially affect the ownership or interest of the said Borough Council in the water mains or pipes at present fixed to the outside of the said bridge and used in connection with the waterworks scheme of that borough, but that such water-mains or pipes, and the ownership thereof, and all rights, licenses, or privileges in connection therewith respectively, shall be and remain as if this Proclamation had not been issued.

*Regulations under "The Government Railways Act, 1894."*

GLASGOW, Governor.  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of May, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by "The Government Railways Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of prescribing the time and method of the election of elective members of the Boards of Appeal for the North Island and Middle Island respectively constituted under the said Act, and also for matters connected with the business of the Boards. And it is hereby declared that such regulations shall come into force on the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

SCHEDULE.  
REGULATIONS.

In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context, "the Board" means a Board of Appeal constituted under "The Government Railways Act, 1894"; "Minister" means the Minister for Railways holding office for the time being, and includes any Responsible Minister of the Crown, being a member of the Executive Council, acting for the Minister.

*Voting.*

1. Separate alphabetical lists of the officers and employés resident in each Island entitled to vote in the election of the Board shall be prepared by the Under-Secretary for Railways, and retained at the Head Office of the Railway Department, Wellington. Such lists shall be revised and corrected from time to time, and may be inspected prior to the date of election by officers and employés entitled to vote. If any officer or employé wishes to take any exception to the respective lists, such exception must be taken through his immediate superior officer, who will notify the Under-Secretary for Railways, Wellington, and give particulars of the exception taken. If no exception is taken to the lists within the time allowed, which will be specified on each list, the lists shall forthwith be closed, and shall be the lists on which the election will be conducted. A ballot-paper will be sent to each officer and employé whose name appears on the lists, and each officer and employé shall immediately on receiving the ballot-paper sign the receipt-form which will accompany it, and forward the form to the address marked upon it.

2. All officers and employés resident in the North Island shall respectively be entitled to vote for an officer or employé to act as a member of the Board to be elected for the North Island. All officers and employés resident in the Middle Island shall in like manner respectively be entitled to vote for an officer or employé to act as a member of the Board to be elected for the Middle Island.

3. No officer or employé shall in any case be compelled to record his vote, and no officer or employé shall canvass for votes, or attempt in any way to influence voters.

4. The Returning Officer for the election shall be the Under-Secretary for Railways, Wellington, or other person for the time being performing the duties of such Under-Secretary. There shall be two Scrutineers—namely, the Chief Clerk of the Railway Accountant's Office, and the Chief Clerk of the Stores Manager's Office, Wellington; but if either of these officers shall be a candidate for election to the Board the Under-Secretary shall appoint some other officer (not a candidate) to act in his stead.

5. Nominations, made in writing by not less than three officers or employés respectively entitled to vote, must reach the Returning Officer at Wellington on or before Monday, the 15th day of July, 1895.

6. Should there be only one nomination for a member to represent the officers or employés on either Board, the officer or employé nominated, as the case may be, shall be declared to be duly elected.

7. Should there be more than one nomination from officers or employés respectively for either Board a poll shall be taken on a day appointed by the Returning Officer, which shall not be less than four weeks from the date of receipt of nominations in Wellington.

8. As soon as possible after the date for receiving nominations is past the Returning Officer shall cause ballot-papers in the form or to the effect following to be printed and supplied to every officer and employé entitled to vote:—

ELECTION OF AN OFFICER [OR EMPLOYÉ] FOR MEMBER OF APPEAL BOARD (NORTH OR MIDDLE ISLAND) UNDER "THE GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS ACT, 1894."

*Candidates for Election.*

DIRECTIONS.—The voter can only vote for one candidate. The voter is to strike out with pen-and-ink or pencil the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote.

The voter must take care not to leave uncanceled the names of more than one candidate, or this paper will be invalid. The ballot-paper is to be folded up so that the contents cannot be seen, and then forthwith transmitted to the Returning Officer.

*The voter's name must not be written on the voting-paper.*

9. The ballot-paper shall contain a list of all the persons nominated in the class to which the voter to whom it is sent belongs (and of no other persons), arranged alphabetically in the order of their surnames. Each paper shall have a number corresponding with that on the list. The number shall be written in the left-hand bottom corner of the paper by the Returning Officer, and the corner folded and gummed down before being sent out.

10. All ballot-papers shall be transmitted by post or otherwise to the Returning Officer at Wellington, in envelopes which will be provided for the purpose, and must reach him not later than the ordinary course of post computed from the day after the polling-day.

11. Immediately after the last day fixed for the receipt at Wellington of ballot-papers, the Returning Officer shall forthwith, in the presence of the Scrutineers, proceed to ascertain the total number of votes recorded for each candidate, and the Returning Officer shall cause the result to be published in an Official Circular, and shall declare the candidates obtaining the majority of votes in the respective classes in the respective Islands duly elected. The voting-papers shall, after being counted, be enclosed in a sealed packet, and be retained by the Returning Officer. They shall not be opened unless a scrutiny be demanded, when such scrutiny shall be conducted by the Returning Officer and the two Scrutineers. The papers will remain in the Returning Officer's custody for two months, and will then be destroyed. If a scrutiny be demanded, application therefor must be made in writing to the Returning Officer by not less than seven voters within fourteen days after the publication of the result aforesaid.

12. Whenever there is an equality of votes at the election, and the addition of one vote will entitle any of the candidates to be elected, the Returning Officer shall himself record such additional vote.

13. The term "officer" comprises all members of the management, clerical, engineering, and drafting staffs, and inspectors and foremen.

14. The term "employé" comprises all other servants of every grade permanently employed on the railways.

15. In the event of any dispute or question arising as to the meaning of these regulations or any portion thereof, the same shall be referred to the Minister for Railways for determination, and his decision shall be final and conclusive.

16. Members elected to the Board shall, except as specified below, hold office for two years from date of election, provided that,—

- (1.) Any member elected to the Board may, if he desire to do so, retire from office at any time on giving one month's notice to the Minister of his intention so to do;
- (2.) If any member of the Board retires or is dismissed from the Railway service he shall cease to be a member of the Board.

17. In the event of the death, retirement, or dismissal of any of the elected members of the Board, his office shall be declared vacant and another member shall be elected in his place with all reasonable speed. Such election shall be conducted as nearly as may be in accordance with these regulations. Any member elected to take the place of a member whose death, retirement, or dismissal has caused his seat on the Board to become vacant shall hold office only for the balance of the term for which the member whose place he has taken was elected.

#### Appeals.

18. Appeals shall be heard at such convenient times and places as the Board may determine.

19. Members of the Board shall be paid such reasonable travelling expenses and be accorded such facilities for attending the sittings of the Board as the Minister may determine.

*Powers delegated to the Ohinewai Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of May, 1895.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present Order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Ohinewai Domain Board, namely,—

GEORGE WAUGH,  
JOHN NICCOLLS, and  
WILLIAM HOOTON

(hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the Ohinewai Schoolhouse, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons, for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such Order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth by this present Order delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Limehills Domain Board, namely,—

(hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Thursday in each month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., at the Templars' Hall, Limehills, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Thursday, the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the third Thursday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

WHEREAS it is provided by section four of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1879," that the power granted to the Governor in Council by the seventeenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," in respect of prescribing what dues and rates may be charged on wharves vested in local bodies may be exercised from time to time as occasion may require, and shall not be limited as in the said section is provided: And whereas plans of a wharf to be erected by the Otamatea County Council on the east side of the Pahi River, in Kaipara Harbour, were approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and the said County Council was on the same date licensed to use the foreshore required for the said wharf: And whereas such wharf has been erected: And whereas it is desirable that dues and rates should be prescribed for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by "The Harbours Act, 1878," and the amendments thereof, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken, on and after the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, for the use of the said county wharf on the east side of the Pahi River, in Kaipara Harbour aforesaid.

*Vesting Management of Wharves at Akaroa in Akaroa Borough Council.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of May, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of Her Majesty in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest in the Akaroa Borough Council the management of the Akaroa Wharf, and the wharf locally known as Daly's Wharf, both within the Borough of Akaroa, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said fourteenth section of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the Akaroa Wharf and the wharf locally known as Daly's Wharf aforesaid in the Akaroa Borough Council, subject to the following conditions:—

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.
2. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the wharf without payment.
3. That the Akaroa Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharves, and all erections on or in connection therewith, in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister for the time being having charge of the Marine Department (hereinafter referred to as "the said Minister").
4. That all dues and rates received on account of the said wharves by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharves and all erections on or in connection therewith in good order and repair and in improving the wharf and harbour accommodation for vessels at Akaroa.
5. That any person authorised by the said Minister, or any officer acting with his approval, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharves, and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and that, upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves or buildings or either of them, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the said Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
6. That the Council shall not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharves any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the said Minister.
7. That the Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharves and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the said Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the said Minister, or any person acting with his approval.
8. That the Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.
9. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.
10. That the rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of the foregoing Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked.
11. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of the foregoing Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the said Minister,

or by any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council, its successors or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

12. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharves or either of them to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

13. In case the Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days,—

then and in either of the said cases every right, power, or privilege hereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, of the facts stated in such Order in Council.

*Regulations for the Ross Special Settlement Association.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of May, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of by lease in perpetuity:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands known as the Ross Special Settlement Association Block, described in the Schedule to the said regulations, shall be disposed of, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these regulations, unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

- "Association" means the Ross Special Settlement Association, being a body of persons, not less than nine in number, voluntarily associated together at Ross, in the Provincial District of Westland, for the purpose of taking up the land as a special settlement of farm homesteads:
- "Land" means the land described in the Schedule, set apart for a special settlement, to be dealt with under these regulations:
- "Settler" means any member of the association or other person, not being a married woman, leasing land under these regulations:
- "Receiver of Land Revenue" means Receiver of Land Revenue at New Plymouth, or other officer for the time being acting as such:
- "Minister" means the Minister of Lands for the time being, or any member of the Executive acting for him:
- "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Taranaki:
- "Secretary" means the secretary of the association for the time being, and shall include any person acting in that capacity, and, if there shall be no secretary, then the chairman of the association:
- "Substantial improvements of a permanent character" mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of bush, gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivation, planting with trees or live hedges, the laying-out and cultivation of gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of any building:
- "Cultivation" means—
- (1.) Fencing the land with timber or other durable materials, not being a brush fence; or
  - (2.) Breaking up and laying down the same in English or other cultivated grass; or
  - (3.) Breaking up and planting or sowing root or other crops therein:
- "Lease" means a lease in perpetuity in terms of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1892."

2. The block of land to be dealt with under these regulations has been surveyed into sections of not more than 320

acres each, and the number of persons to be located thereon shall not be less than nine.

3. The allotments of sections to members of the association shall be made at such time and in such manner as the association may, with the consent of the Commissioner, determine.

4. The land shall be disposed of by lease at an annual rental of 4 per cent. on the capital value fixed by the Minister.

5. One-third of the rents paid from time to time shall, for the first fifteen years, be paid to the local body of the district charged with the construction and maintenance of roads in the district, for the expenditure on roads in or leading to the block. Such expenditure to be first sanctioned by the Land Board for the Land District of Taranaki.

6. All rents and moneys required to be paid for the land under these terms and conditions shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue, and receipts given by him shall be sufficient discharge for the payment of the moneys therein respectively acknowledged to have been received.

7. The settlers shall be members of the association, and no settler shall be under seventeen years of age.

8. The secretary shall inform the Commissioner of the names of the settlers; pay a deposit of 1s. 3d. per acre, being half survey fee, the balance to be paid within six months before ballot takes place; and also furnish the Commissioner from time to time with minutes of proceedings of the association if so required.

9. The original or amended list of members, signed by the secretary of the association, and sent to the Commissioner, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the persons claiming to select land are members of the association.

10. Each settler shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements as follows:—

- (a.) Within one year from the date of his lease, to a value equal to ten per centum of the price of the land;
- (b.) Within two years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another ten per centum of the price of the land;
- (c.) And thereafter, but within six years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another ten per centum of the price of the land;

And in addition thereto shall, within six years from the date of his lease, put substantial improvements of a permanent character to an amount equal to the net price of every acre of such land.

11. Residence and occupation of the land shall be in accordance with Part III. of "The Land Act, 1892."

12. No person who is the owner in fee or leasehold of any land in New Zealand which, together with the land included in his application or transfer under these regulations, would exceed 520 acres, and no person who has made an arrangement or agreement to permit any one, save his son or daughter, to acquire by purchase or otherwise the allotment in respect of which his application is made, shall be entitled to become a settler under these regulations.

13. Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Land Board of the district, forfeit his interest in the land selected, and the land shall thereafter be dealt with as ordinary Crown land; and these conditions shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture.

14. The association may make such rules and regulations from time to time as it may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commissioner.

15. In case any doubt shall arise as to the sufficiency of the compliance with these regulations, with reference to the selection, occupation, or improvement of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder respectively, the same shall be settled by the Land Board.

16. Excepting as expressly modified by these regulations, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and its amendments shall be deemed to have full force and effect over and upon the land herein referred to, and shall, *mutatis mutandis*, be read as if these regulations formed part of the Act.

which the lands in any village settlement shall be disposed of, subject as in the said section is provided: And whereas by a Proclamation made under the said Act on the second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto have been set apart under the said Act and declared open for lease as village settlements, and it is expedient to fix the terms and conditions upon which the said lands shall be disposed of:

8. Improvements and residence on the land comprised in each lease shall be as provided in Part III. of the said Act. The provisions of section 144, and all other provisions of the said Act with respect to substantial improvements, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations. The provisions of section 141, and all other provisions of the said Act in respect of compulsory residence, shall apply accordingly to lessees under these regulations.

9. No lessee shall subdivide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I. of the said Act.

10. No lessee shall hold more than the limit stated in the First Schedule, including that already held, and all allotments shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector; but this provision shall not apply to any married woman who may become a transferee under a will or by virtue of an intestacy.

11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

Bonus for the Manufacture of Potassium Cyanide.
