2. To insert in the claim, between the words "with" and "cyanogen," page 3, line 10, the words "a dilute solution containing."

The reasons given for such amendments are,—
"That it is desirable to prevent the claim from being held to include strengths of solution different from those which are practically useful."

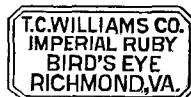

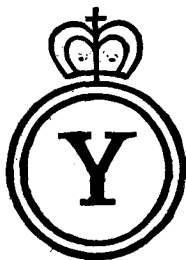
