A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS there are now existing two places in the Colony of New Zealand bearing the same name, that is to say, the Township of Oxford in the County of Ashley, and the Township of Oxford in the Piako County, the last-named being the more recent in date of existence: And whereas, under the fourth section of "The Designation of Districts Act, 1894," I lately required the County Council of the Piako County, being the local authority having jurisdiction in that behalf, to submit a new name for such township for my approval, as mentioned in the said section: And whereas the said Council hath accordingly submitted to me the name of "Tirau" in lieu of the existing name of "Oxford":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections two and four of "The Designation of Districts Act, 1894," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the Township of Oxford in the Piako County shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Tirau," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such township accordingly, and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable David, Earl of Glasgow; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NEW ZEALAND.

In the matter of a Bill intituded "An Act to authorise the Bank of New Zealand Estates Company (Limited) to dis-pose of its Property in the Special Manner provided by this Act."

OTICE is hereby given that the Bank of New Zealand
Estates Company (Limited) intends to present a petition to the General Assembly of New Zealand at its next session, praying for leave to introduce a Bill to be intituled "An Act to authorise the Bank of New Zealand Estates Company (Limited) to dispose of its Property in the Special Manner thereby provided."

The objects of the said Bill are as follows: To authorise the directors, local directors, and general attorneys in New

The objects of the said Bill are as follows: To authorise the directors, local directors, and general attorneys in New Zealand of the Bank of New Zealand Estates Company (Limited), notwithstanding any Act or law, or its memorandum or articles of association, from time to time, with the consent in writing of the president and two directors of the Bank of New Zealand, to divide the whole or any the Bank of New Zealand, to divide the whole or any part of its real and personal property into lots or shares of such values and proportions as they think fit, for the purpose of realising the same, and to adopt such mode or device, by chance or otherwise, as they think fit, and to issue and sell tickets entitling the holder to a chance of acquiring any of such lots or shares, and to distribute, convey, transfer, and assign such property in pursuance of such mode or device; and also to authorise the directors of the said company to do, execute, and perform all such acts, deeds, matters, and things as they think necessary or conducive for the purposes of giving effect to the powers and authorities proposed to be conferred by the said Bill; and to provide that the consent in writing of the president and two directors of the Bank of New Zealand shall be conclusive evidence and authority that the directors of the said company are empowered to exercise the powers and authorities conferred by this Act, and have complied with the expressed and implied conditions thereof. conditions thereof.

And notice is hereby given that copies of the said Bill will be deposited at the office of the Examiner of Standing Orders at Wellington at or within fourteen days after the commencement of the session.
