Allocating Land reserved and taken for a Railway to the Purposes of a Road in Waitemata County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Kaipara Branch Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a road:

And whereas it has been certified by the Minister for Railways that such land is not required for railway purposes: And whereas such land is situated in Waitemata County, the local authority of which has consented to the issue of this Proclamation:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor is of opinion that the said local authority can conveniently construct and maintain the said road:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section one hundred and seventy-seven of "The Public Works Act, 1894," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a road, and that the said road shall be under the control of the Waitemata County Council, and shall be maintained by the said Council in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Council.

*Regulations under "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894."*

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of July, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which shall have general force and effect throughout the colony, or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth with respect to the indigenous fish known as whitebait inhabiting the waters of the colony herein mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations; and with the like advice and consent doth order that these regulations shall have force and effect in the brackish waters of the Waimakariri River, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and shall supersede all regulations respecting the nets to be used for taking whitebait heretofore in force so far as that river is concerned.

REGULATIONS.

1. No scrim or whitebait-net shall be used as a set-net or be set or placed in openings made in the banks of the Waimakariri River or its tributaries, or in dams constructed therein, and no scrim hand-net having an opening of more than 9 square feet shall be used for the purpose of catching whitebait.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

3. Nothing in these regulations contained shall be deemed or be construed to affect or interfere with the operation of any regulations for the time being in force under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," in relation to the taking or fishing for salmon or trout in the said river.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Public Bodies' Powers Act, 1887" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time declare that any leasing authority shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act, but that no such order shall have any effect unless it be issued at the request or upon the recommendation of the leasing authority on whose behalf such order is issued:

And whereas it has been made to appear that the Board of Governors of the Akaroa High School are a leasing authority within the meaning of the said Act, and have requested that they may be brought under the provisions thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare that from and after the date hereof the Board of Governors of the Akaroa High School shall be subject to the provisions of "The Public Bodies' Powers Act, 1887."

Rural Lands in the Wellington Land District open for Sale or Selection.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the one hundred and thirty-sixth section of "The Land Act, 1892," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, having received the report of the Surveyor-General in this behalf, as in the said section is provided, do hereby declare that the rural lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale or selection on and after the eighteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five; and also that the lands mentioned in the said Schedule may, at the option of the applicant, be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase or on lease in perpetuity, or, in respect of any lands containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, be selected on lease in perpetuity only; and I do hereby also fix the prices at which the said lands shall be sold, occupied, or leased, as mentioned in the said Schedule hereto, and do declare that the said lands shall be sold, occupied, or leased under and subject to the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892."

This land is a portion of the Awarua Block, situated on the main inland road and railway-line, the latter being in course of construction. This will eventually be the main access to sections now being offered. It is opened as far as Mangaonoho, distant about eleven miles from Mangaweka by the main coach-road. The main road passes through the south-eastern portion of the block. The principal road for opening up the land generally, however, is the Te Kapua Road, leaving the main road at Mangaweka, and going in a north-westerly direction through the land being offered, connecting with Murray's Track (from Hunterville to Karioi). This road is now being constructed for horse-traffic, and a contract is let as far as the saddle from Mangaweka end. Another means of access for the north-west portion will be from Hunterville via Murray's Track, open for dray-traffic for the first fourteen miles, and as a horse-road for the next three miles and a half, as far as Wairapu Road; then by that road, which is surveyed only, to connect with the north-west end of the Te Kapua Road, a distance of two miles; making the through distance from Hunterville about twenty miles.

The general character of the country is of a rolling nature, its altitude varying from about 1,100ft. at Mangaweka to about 2,900ft. in the centre of the block, falling again somewhat towards Murray's Track, the larger sections being well situated for pastoral purposes, and the smaller ones for mixed holdings. These sections are situated in the upper portion of the Pohangina and Coal Creek country, and the access will be from Apiti; and those north of the Utuwai Ravine—viz., 23, 24, and 25, Block XII., Apiti, and 2, 3, 7, 11, 13, and 18, Block VII.—

will be approached for the first mile and a half by a dray-road; thence by horse-road to Coal Creek, and *via* the Apiti-Norsewood Road for a further distance of eight miles and a half, after which surveyed roads for three miles will have to be used, the maximum distance of these being three miles. The general access to the whole of these sections will be to Hunterville; but, possibly, as the country eventually gets settled and roads are constructed, the outlet will be divided into two roads-systems—the easterly route being by Murray's Track to Hunterville, and the westerly by the Turakina Valley Road to the same place. BY THE QUEEN.—A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-third year of our reign, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint," it is amongst other things enacted:

That We, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, shall from time to time by Proclamation determine the design of any coin:

We have therefore thought fit to order that the coins of bronze or mixed metal made at our Mint which are mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight specified in that Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

That every penny should have for the obverse impression our effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei. Gra. Britt. Regina Fid. Def., Ind. And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at our Mint, and will be coined there, in pursuance of orders which we have given for that purpose, We have therefore, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, and we do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined and to be coined as aforesaid shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Given at our Court at Windsor, this eleventh day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in the fifty-eighth year of our reign.

*Bonus for the Manufacture of Potassium Cyanide.*
