Regulations under "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894."

GLASGOW, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of July, 1895.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time things, enacted that the Governor in Council may non-time to time make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which shall have general force and effect throughout the colony, or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations herein-

after set forth with respect to the indigenous fish known as whitebait inhabiting the waters of the colony herein men-

tioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations; and with the like advice and consent doth order that these regulations shall have force and effect in the brackish waters of the Waimakariri River, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and shall supersede all regulations respecting the nets. bury, and shall supersede all regulations respecting the nets to be used for taking whitebait heretofore in force so far as that river is concerned.

REGULATIONS.

1. No scrim or whitebait-net shall be used as a set-net or be set or placed in openings made in the banks of the Wai-makariri River or its tributaries, or in dams constructed therein, and no scrim hand-net having an opening of more than 9 square feet shall be used for the purpose of catch-

than 9 square feet shall be used for the purpose of catching whitebait.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

3. Nothing in these regulations contained shall be deemed or be construed to affect or interfere with the operation of any regulations for the time being in force under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," in relation to the taking or fishing for salmon or trout in the said river.

Rural Lands in the Wellington Land District open for Sale or Selection.

GLASGOW, Governor.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the one hundred and thirty-sixth section of "The Land Act, 1892," I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, having received the report of the Surveyor-General in this behalf, as in the said section is provided, do hereby declare that the rural lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale or selection on and after the eighteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five; and also that the lands mentioned in the said Schedule may, at the option of the applicant, be purchased for eash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase or on lease in perpetuity, or, in respect of any lands containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, be selected on lease in perpetuity only; and I do hereby also fix the prices at which the said lands shall be sold, occupied, or leased, as mentioned in the said Schedule hereto, and do declare that the said lands shall be sold, occupied, or leased under and subject to the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892."

SCHEDULE. WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICT.

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This land is a portion of the Awarua Block, situated on the main inland road and railway-line, the latter being in course of construction. This will eventually be the main access to sections now being offered. It is opened as far as Mangaonoho, distant about eleven miles from Mangaweka by the main coach-road. The main road passes through the south-eastern portion of the block. The principal road for opening up the land generally, however, is the Te Kapua Road, leaving the main road at Mangaweka, and going in a north-westerly direction through the land being offered, connecting with Murray's Track (from Hunterville to Karioi). This road is now being constructed for horse-traffic, and a contract is let as far as the saddle from Mangaweka end. Another means of access for the north-west portion will be from Hunterville viâ Murray's Track, open for dray-traffic for the first fourteen miles, and as a horse-road for the next three miles and a half, as far as Wairapu Road; then by that road, which is surveyed only, to connect with the north-west end of the Te Kapua Road, a distance of two miles; making the through distance from Hunterville about twenty miles.

The general character of the country is of a rolling nature, its altitude varying from about 1,100ft, at Mangaweka to about 2,900ft, in the centre of the block, falling again somewhat towards Murray's Track, the larger sections being well situated for pastoral purposes, and the smaller ones for mixed holdings. The soil throughout is good, on a papa formation, and most of the sections, generally speaking, are fairly well watered, and covered with moderately heavy mixed bush.

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These sections are situated in the upper portion of the Pohangina and Coal Creek country, and the access will be from Apiti; and those north of the Utuwai Ravine—viz., 23, 24, and 25, Block XII., Apiti, and 2, 3, 7, 11, 13, and 18, Block VII.—

will be approached for the first mile and a half by a dray-road; thence by horse-road to Coal Creek, and $vi\hat{a}$ the Apiti-Norsewood Road for a further distance of eight miles and a half, after which surveyed roads for three miles will have to be used, the maximum distance of these being three miles. A temporary and nearer approach for the Tunipo Road sections will be by the Coal Creek and Hopopete Ravines for stock-driving, packing, &c. For the other sections the route from Apiti will be $vi\hat{a}$ the Main Cross Road E, dray-road made for three miles, and the remainder of the way by horse-road, for about seven miles further. The total distance from Apiti to the different sections will range from about six to thirteen and a half miles. Another access available would be down the Pohangina Valley to Ashurst. Taking the sections as a whole, they are hilly, with small portions of level land on each; the soil being fair to good, on a papa and sandstone formation; well watered and heavily timbered.

Section No. 25, south of the Pohangina, will be approached from Ashurst, from which it is distant about twenty-two miles, nearly the whole distance being available for rough dray traffic by the Pohangina River and formed roads lower down. The land is hilly, with a small proportion of level; has a fair soil on a papa formation; all under heavy forest.

The general access to the whole of these sections will be to Hunterville; but, possibly, as the country eventually gets settled and roads are constructed, the outlet will be divided into two roads-systems—the easterly route being by Murray's Track to Hunterville, and the westerly by the Turakina Valley Road to the same place.
