WHEREAS the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), for the Thames Water-race, a public work already constructed, the said lands not having been taken in the manner required by law:

And whereas the said water-race, together with all land, streams, buildings, and works belonging thereto or connected therewith, and all rights and privileges appurtenant or belonging thereto, was, with certain exceptions, vested in the Thames County Council by "The Thames Water-supply Transfer Act, 1880":

And whereas the Thames County Council has laid before the Governor the memorial, accompanied by a map, and also the statutory declaration, required by the said Act: And whereas it appears expedient to issue the Proclamation herein set forth:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections 18 and 28 of the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette* the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is taken for the Thames Water-race as aforesaid; and it is hereby declared that this Proclamation is issued at the request of and on behalf of the Thames County Council aforesaid.

ACTS OF GALLANTRY FOR WHICH MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES OF MERIT HAVE BEEN AWARDED SINCE THE PUBLICATION OF THE LAST REPORT, NEW ZEALAND, 1894-95.

1362.—WELBY EARL FISHER, of St. Clair, Dunedin, New Zealand, a clerk, aged nineteen years, who rescued James Peter Simon, of Dunedin, a boot merchant, aged forty-four years, from drowning at the Cliffs, on the 25th January, 1894. Mr. Simon, whilst fishing, was washed off the rocks by a large wave. Fisher, seeing that he was unable to swim against the strong backwater current, jumped in to his rescue. A rope was accidentally found by some boys at the foot of the cliff, and thrown to them, and thus both were rescued. They were both much injured by the rocks. Silver medal.

1363.—EDWARD COLUMB, of Kurow, North Otago, New Zealand, a labourer, aged nineteen years, who rescued Edith B. Powell, a housemaid, aged thirty-three years, from drowning in the Waitaki River, on the 8th April, 1894. Miss Powell fell through a hole in the bridge into a raging torrent, and Columb, seeing her disappear, ran down the bank until she reappeared; he then plunged in, swam a distance of 70 yards, and reached Miss Powell, who was unconscious, just as she was sinking for the third time. He, with great difficulty, swam with her to shallow water, and, with the aid of a Mr. H. Rout, succeeded in getting her ashore. Bronze medal.

1373.—EUGENE EGAN, of Temuka, New Zealand, aged forty years, a constable, who rescued Michael Mulhern, of Temuka, a hotelkeeper, aged forty-five years, from his burning hotel, on the 6th August, 1894. Mr. Mulhern was heard groaning in one of the rooms of the hotel. Constable Egan broke the window, entered, and, groping about the floor, found Mr. Mulhern unconscious, and dragged him to the window. Constable Egan was assisted out in a dazed condition. Bronze medal.

1382.—MAURICE FESTU, of the steamship "Rotorua," Union Steamship Company, Wellington, New Zealand, who risked his life in rescuing Constable C. R. Broberg, Police-station, Wellington, New Zealand, from drowning at the Queen's Wharf, on the 3rd November, 1894. Certificate of merit.

1383.—CHARLES ROBERT BROBERG, Police-station, Wellington, who risked his life in rescuing John Smith, who fell off the Queen's Wharf on a dark night on the 3rd November, 1894. Certificate of merit.

1391.—WILLIAM SINCLAIR, of Lyttelton, New Zealand, a seaman, who rescued two boys, Cyril R. and Alexander James Walker, who fell over a cliff at the lighthouse on the 9th November, 1894. Two boys fell off the lighthouse cliff to the rocks, 90ft. below. It seemed impossible that they could be rescued from the shore. A tug was sent for, and, having arrived at the scene, lowered a boat. But no one could land on these rocks. They then rowed round the head of the cliff, and a landing was effected on the other side. William Sinclair, at great risk to his life, ascended the cliff, taking a rope with him. The rope was held by those below and passed down on the other side to where the boys were. Mr. Sinclair went down by this rope, and found that one of the boys had broken his leg; the other severely shaken. Mr. Sinclair bound the broken leg to the sound one, put him on his back, and went up the rope hand over hand, and lowered the boy down to the crew on the other side. The other boy was able to climb up the rope himself. Bronze medal.

1395-96.—JAMES WHITE DUNLOP, of the steamship "Takapuna," Union Steamship Company, Dunedin, New Zealand, engineer, and BENJAMIN ARTHUR KENDALL, of the Union Steamship Company, North Williamstown, a steward, aged twenty-four years, for their heroic conduct at the wreck of the steamer "Wairarapa" on the Great Barrier Island, New Zealand, on the 29th October, 1894. The "Wairarapa" went ashore on the Great Barrier Island at daybreak. Dunlop attempted to swim ashore with a line through a heavy sea, but only managed to reach the rocks, having lost the line. He afterwards, at great risk, assisted in the rescue of a number of persons on the rocks. Another attempt was made (see case No. 1427). Benjamin Arthur Kendall swam ashore with a line from the rigging to the rocks in a heavy sea, and on a very rough coast-line—so bad that there was only footing for two or three people on the rocks at a time. Silver medal each.

1419.—FRANK HILL GLOVER, of Napier, New Zealand, a schoolboy, aged sixteen years, who attempted to rescue Miss M. M. That shoal water was found south-west of Woody Wallis Island, Endeavour Strait, in the unsurveyed area, several sandy shoals, with not more than 9ft. over them, being discovered. The approximate position of two of these patches is as follows, viz.: South extreme of Woody Wallis Island bearing N. 61° E., 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles; south extreme of Woody Wallis Island bearing N. 51° E., 1 $\frac{1}{4}$  miles.
