WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made under the hereinbefore in part recited Act for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Council of the Levels County shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the county funds of the said county within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the said Geraldine County Council, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said County Council for and on account of such county. on account of such county.

HEREAS by section one hundred and thirteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that, in any case where the local authority of any district desires to construct a bridge in any position that will, in its opinion, be of advantage and benefit to the whole or any considerable portion of the inhabitants of an adjacent district or districts, as well as to the inhabitants of its own district, and where it is, in the opinion of such local authority, reasonable that the local authority or local authorities of such district or districts whose inhabitants are to be so benefited should contribute to the cost of constructing or establishing the said work, the to the cost of constructing or establishing the said work, the

to the cost of constructing or establishing the said work, the provisions in the said section mentioned shall have effect:

And whereas the Manawatu Road Board, being desirous of constructing the work mentioned in the Schedule hereto under the provisions of the said Act, prepared plans, specifications, and estimates of the cost of the said work, and sent a copy of the same to the office of the Manchester Road Board and to the Minister for Public Works, together with a notice to the said Manchester Road Board, as required by the provisions of the hereinbefore in part recited Act, stating, inter also that the cost of the work inter alia, that it was proposed that the cost of the work should be borne in the proportion of one-half by the Manawatu Road Board and one-half by the Manchester Road Board:
