Vesting Control of Opihi Bridge in Geraldine County Council.

(L.S.) GLASGOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made under the hereinbefore in part recited Act for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge known as the Opihi Bridge, together with such approaches and protection works as are mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Geraldine County Council; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of constructing certain protection works now or in progress on the 31st July, 1895, and also the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge, with the approaches and protection works as aforesaid, in the future, is to be provided and paid by the Geraldine County Council and the Levels County Council in equal proportions.

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Council of the Levels County shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the county funds of the said county within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the said Geraldine County Council, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said County Council for and on account of such county.

SCHEDULE.
OPIHI BRIDGE.

THE bridge known as the Opihi Bridge, on the Main North Road between Timaru and Temuka, extending from the right bank of the said river at the northern boundary of Section No. 4226, Block VI., Arowhenua Survey District, to the left bank of the said river at the southern boundary of Native Reserve No. 881, a distance of 2,250ft., more or less; the approaches at the ends, being each 100ft. long, together with the fences appertaining thereto; the old protective works, extending along the left bank of the said river in a westerly direction from the northern end of the said Opihi Bridge for a distance of 17 chains; the new protective works, extending from a point on the western side of the said bridge 780ft., more or less, from its northern end, to a point on the left bank of the said river for a distance of 30½ chains; and the protective works extending along the right bank of the Opihi River at the southern end of the said bridge for a distance of 9 chains: be all the aforesaid distances more or less; as the said bridge, approaches, fences, and protective works are delineated on the plan marked S.G. 27065, deposited in the Head Office of the Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon marked in red.

Vesting Control of Upper Opihi Bridge in Geraldine County Council.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any

bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, fix and determine whether all or any, and, if so, what, part of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may, by any such Proclamation as aforesaid, direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made under the hereinbefore in part recited Act for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, David, Earl of Glasgow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge known as the Upper Opihi Bridge, together with such approaches and protection works as are mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Geraldine County Council; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge, with the approaches and protection works as aforesaid, is to be provided and paid by the Geraldine County Council and the Levels County Council in equal proportions.

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Levels County Council shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the county funds of the said county within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the said Geraldine County Council, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said County Council for and on account of such county.

UPPER OPIHI BRIDGE.

The bridge known as the Upper Opihi Bridge, on the road from Pleasant Point to Raincliff, extending from the right bank of the Opihi River, at a point near the northern corner of Section No. 20108, Block XIII., Opihi Survey District, to the left bank of the said river at the southern boundary of Section No. 22226, a length of 540ft., more or less, together with approaches at the northern end of the said bridge, 33ft. long; the fences appertaining to the said approaches; the protective fence, 3¼ chains long, on the upper side of the said bridge, and at its northern end; and also such fences as appertain to the southern approach of the said Upper Opihi Bridge: be all the aforesaid distances more or less; as the said bridge, approaches, and fences are delineated on the plan marked S.G. 27065, deposited in the Head Office of the Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon marked in red.

Warrant authorising the Manawatu Road Board to construct a Bridge over the Stony Creek on Henderson's Line, in the Manawatu Road District, and apportioning the Cost of the Bridge between the said Road Board and the Manchester Road Board.

GLASGOW, Governor.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and thirteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that, in any case where the local authority of any district desires to construct a bridge in any position that will, in its opinion, be of advantage and benefit to the whole or any considerable portion of the inhabitants of an adjacent district or districts, as well as to the inhabitants of its own district, and where it is, in the opinion of such local authority, reasonable that the local authority or local authorities of such district or districts whose inhabitants are to be so benefited should contribute to the cost of constructing or establishing the said work, the provisions in the said section mentioned shall have effect:

And whereas the Manawatu Road Board, being desirous of constructing the work mentioned in the Schedule hereto under the provisions of the said Act, prepared plans, specifications, and estimates of the cost of the said work, and sent a copy of the same to the office of the Manchester Road Board and to the Minister for Public Works, together with a notice to the said Manchester Road Board, as required by the provisions of the hereinbefore in part recited Act, stating, *inter alia*, that it was proposed that the cost of the work should be borne in the proportion of one-half by the Manawatu Road Board and one-half by the Manchester Road Board:

And whereas no objection to the proposal so made has been lodged, as provided by the said Act; and the Manawatu Road Board, on the expiration of the period of two months provided by the said Act, has made application to the Governor for power to construct the work on the terms mentioned in the notice aforesaid:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that the work should be done:

Now, therefore I, David, Earl of Glasgow, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby authorise the Manawatu Road Board to construct the said work; and I do hereby declare that one-half of the cost of constructing the said work shall be borne by the Manawatu Road Board, and that one-half of such cost shall be borne by the Manchester Road Board.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS there are now existing two places in the Colony of New Zealand bearing the same name, that is to say, the Township of Oxford in the County of Ashley, and the Township of Oxford in the Piako County, the last-named being the more recent in date of existence: And whereas, under the fourth section of "The Designation of Districts Act, 1894," I lately required the County Council of the Piako County, being the local authority having jurisdiction in that behalf, to submit a new name for such township for my approval, as mentioned in the said section: And whereas the said Council hath accordingly submitted to me the name of "Tirau" in lieu of the existing name of "Oxford":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections two and four of "The Designation of Districts Act, 1894," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, David,

By-laws for the Control of Traffic over the Teremakau Railway-bridge, on the Greymouth-Hokitika Railway (in Substitution of Regulations previously issued).

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1894," and "The Government Railways Act, 1894," I, Alfred Jerome Cadman, the Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following by-laws for regulating the traffic on and over the Teremakau Railway-bridge, which said bridge forms part of the railway between Greymouth and Hokitika, and is used both for ordinary and railway traffic; and, in further exercise and pursuance of the said powers, do revoke all by-laws and regulations in force at the date hereof authorising or regulating traffic on and over the said bridge.

SCHEDULE.

1. HORSES not driven in harness or led by bridle or halter, and cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, mules, and donkeys, passing over the Teremakau Railway-bridge must have a man behind them; and cattle, sheep, and horses in mobs must in addition have a man before them.
2. Horsemen or vehicles shall not travel over the said bridge faster than six miles an hour.
3. No load shall be taken over the said bridge greater than $1\frac{1}{2}$ tons gross per wheel.
4. Any person or persons offending against any of these regulations shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
5. So far as applicable, the general by-laws and regulations for the time being respectively in force and affecting the traffic on the New Zealand Railways shall extend and apply to the said Teremakau Bridge and to traffic on and over the same.
